Ramblings from the Rectory...

Well, didn't we have some wonderful Harvest celebrations with beautifully decorated churches in all the team churches. They were full of flowers, vegetables and fruit in a rich array.

The apples have been superb this year...and they were everywhere in abundance...we've even had a few pears in the Rectory garden too.

Some of our churches and schools donated their Harvest produce to the Andover food bank. I wanted to include here, for you all, the list of produce that the Food bank put together for the children from Smannell School to bring to their Harvest service in the church.

There was an amazing selection of produce....and it included packets of biscuits and treats, cereal [multipacks], fruit juice or milk [long life], pasta or rice, tinned spaghetti, sugar, soup, tinned meat or fish, tinned tomatoes or vegetables, tinned fruit or rice pudding, instant mashed or tinned potatoes.

Many of these items were brought in by the children, and I was astounded to discover that last year, the food bank collected and distributed 50 tonnes of food to over 5738 local people in need. It is designed to help people in crisis with emergency supplies. So all that you give, makes a big difference in the community.

I read something the other day which seems especially apt: The test of our progress is not whether we add more to the abundance of those who have much, it is whether we provide enough for those who have too little.

And as we move into November, the month of Remembering we might say, we have All Souls and Remembrance Sunday, soon upon us.

Our thoughts are with those who have been bereaved as we remember their loved ones before God at our Team All Souls service in Charlton.

There will be Remembrance services in all of our churches to commemorate

those who have died for their country in wars and conflict.

So amongst all the remembering, let us all try to do something positive to help someone.

You can help not only with gifts of food, but also with any spare dinner plates or soup bowls you might have, as well as deodorant, shaving gel/foam or shower gel. The Smannell and Enham Church of England (Aided) Primary School is currently in need of new Foundation Governors.

Governors are one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of the governing body is absolutely key to the effectiveness of a school. Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management, and that include the leadership brought by the governing body.



Our school Governing Body is made up of people who come to us through a variety of routes and with a range of different backgrounds, skill and experiences, but they are all volunteers who work together for the benefit of the School and are the link between the School and the community it serves.

The role of the governing body is a strategic one and its key functions are to set the aims and objectives for the school; set the policies and targets for achievement; monitor and evaluate the progress the school is making. All this while being a source of challenge and support to the headteacher (a critical friend).

This isn't an application to be taken lightly, as it involves time, energy and a willingness to become involved in the life of the school on a regular basis over at least four years. However, it is very rewarding, as together we can strategically input into the school and see another generation of children growing in knowledge and development within our community. A Foundation Governor represents the Church of England and should be a regular communicant within the Church.

We would be delighted to hear from anyone who has an interest in the performance of the school, but also a willingness to listen and help us make informed decisions to develop the school forward.

REPORT ON PCC MEETING HELD ON 6th OCTOBER 2015 AT JUBILEE HOUSE

9 PCC members were present; the meeting was chaired by the Church Warden, who opened with prayer. The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed as correct by the Chairman.

The drain at St. George's had been repaired, work on the Christ Church roof was almost complete and the Parish website was now working well.

Attempts were being made to appoint another Foundation Governor (who should be a practicing Christian, but not necessarily Church of England) at the School.

Various events such as concerts and the Ride & Stride had been most enjoyable and successful.

Particular mention was made of Margaret Hughes raising sponsorship of £250. The Harvest Supper had been a very good evening and raised £203.92; Barbara-Jane Pope's delicious soup had gone down very well!!

The PCC was informed that the post of Safeguarding Officer might become a Benefice appointment.

A Grave Space reservation was agreed for a Little London family and the Churchwarden agreed to look into ways of ensuring visitor safety to the churchyard by improving the uphill path surface.

Efforts to replace Margaret Hughes, who had cleaned the churches for many years, were continuing.

Readings for St. George's had been listed by the Churchwarden and Mary Wrangle would be organizing the hymns.

Pete would be writing an Parish Oak article to ask for people to stand in for or assist her when necessary.

Rev. Alex Randle-Bissell and his wife and family had arrived and the licensing had taken place, although Rev. Alex did not expect to be fully operational until the New Year.

The final cheque for the 2015 Parish Share would be paid in October, meeting in full our 2015 requirement. The international, national and local charitable donations would be paid in November. Disapproval of the proposed increase

for 2016 had been registered with the Deanery Finance Committee, but no response received. Welcome funds had been promised or already received.

All bills had been paid and receipts banked and the finances remained on a steady footing.

Pastrow was working well. The 'Diocese Guide to making a Living Will' would be displayed. The Craft Group continued to meet. 2 pictures made from stained glass from the old church windows had been given to the Parish by the Kinchenton family and one would be hung in each church. A new Burial Book would be initiated by Rev. Val.

The Alamein Service would take place at St. George's on October 25th at 10 a.m. An Army chaplain would officiate. Elizabeth Hall would liaise with other parishioners over organizing an event to celebrate the building of the Hatherden and Smannell Churches.

There would be a Christmas Eve service at Christ Church at 11.30 p.m. and a Christmas Day Service at St. George's at 10 a.m.

The meeting closed with the Grace at 7.30 p.m.
