

Tell us a little bit about you, and what fills your day?

I am resident artist at the Hawk Conservancy Trust at Andover where I manage the artwork on display and also sit on the management team for Art for Nature, Nepal.



Based in Kathmandu we strive through art to raise awareness of conservation issues and also give the Nepalese artists opportunity to work in the wildlife parks and to sell their work abroad.

I also sit on the local Enham Parish Council.

What keeps you motivated?

My day is never the same. whether it be running a drawing workshop, organising our efforts in Nepal, teaching the importance of a creative mind in schools or climbing a mountain. One thing I do make sure of though is that I go for a walk every morning, having grown up in the Dorset countryside I am at home here, and the wildlife, both flora and fauna, provides constant inspiration and motivation.

What are you most proud of?

Being compassionate and able to help others, whether human or not. Also seeing my artwork and greetings cards displayed and for sale at the Hawk Conservancy Trust and the Tea Cosy at Hurstbourne Tarrant.

What would be the single thing you would like to do differently or see change?

That the UK realises that creativity is imperative to the progression of not only technology, but the human race. Creativity is not just "painting" but the conceptualisation of everything that we take for granted. Creativity, supported by the likes of maths and science has lead to the world in which we live today.
