Ramblings from the Rectory ...

Well we did enjoy celebrating the Queen's birthday together last month and thank you to all those who helped in any way. The team service for the Queen at Hatherden was superb and we had a lovely lunch together in the school afterwards. The Songs of Praise at Charlton was also delightful and gave us another opportunity to worship as a team of churches and to celebrate the Queen's birthday together.

On the Saturday in Enham we had a wonderful street party with many folks coming and going throughout the afternoon. Again thank you to all those who helped in any way.

And now we are well and truly into the wedding season, having finished with birthday celebrations for a little while, but we also seem to be just as busy with baptisms which is lovely.

It was delightful to welcome some of our baptism families to our first family service at Smannell at the end of May. We are now making plans for our second family service which is going to be at the end of this month on the $31^{\rm st}$ July at 10am. This will take the form of a pet service, but you can come with or without a pet. It is open to all ages from babies in arms to Grans and Grandads - in fact you could, if you wish, call it an 'All-Age' service.

So you are all welcome, whatever age you are, but there will be a particular emphasis on younger folks, and hopefully it will be a more child-friendly type of service that is accessible to all.

We are also hoping to start a Messy Church in the school in September. Again this is aimed at families but anyone can come along, so it is also open to Grans and Grandads and Aunts and Uncles to come, with or without children. It will be run once a month on the 2nd Tuesday from about 3.30 to 6pm, so

we are planning to start on Tuesday 13th September at 3.30pm in the school hall. There will be a welcome at 3.30pm, followed by crafts from 4pm, and then a celebration at 5pm, with a meal together at 5.15pm, ending by 6pm. So it provides an opportunity for people of all ages to worship together, and it helps them to feel that they belong in a church and to each other. It gives us a chance as a church to have fun and to be creative together, and it is a way of introducing Jesus through hospitality, friendship, stories and worship. Do ask if you want to know more and we will also be looking for people to help. So if you like crafts and children, this could be for you? Or if you like cooking, or you are a treasurer, or a good tea-maker, and would like to be involved, do let me know. We will need at least 5 people to make this work. When we ran Messy Church in our previous parishes, I ran the crafts with a 2nd person and I also led the celebration, we had another person organising the food, and a treasurer to organise the finance, and Philip made the tea! But it would be good to have more than 5 people and indeed others joined us as we grew and developed.

So don't forget the Pet Service at the end of the month and do keep in your prayers our plans for Messy Church. May you have an enjoyable month, whether it is a month of weddings, baptisms and garden parties or just relaxing in your gardens and putting your feet up!

The Smannell and Enham Church of England (Aided) Primary School is currently in need of new Foundation Governors.

Governors are one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards. The role of the governing body is absolutely key to the effectiveness of a school. Ofsted (the national inspection body for schools) has noted that the most effective schools demonstrate effective leadership and management, and that includes the leadership brought by the governing body.



Our school Governing Body is made up of people who come to us through a variety of routes and with a range of different backgrounds, skill and experiences, but they are all volunteers who work together for the benefit of the School and are the link between the School and the community it serves.

The role of the Governing Body is a strategic one and its key functions are to set the aims and objectives for the school; set the policies and targets for achievement; monitor and evaluate the progress the school is making, all this while being a source of challenge and support to the headteacher (a critical friend).

This isn't an application to be taken lightly, as it involves time, energy and a willingness to become involved in the life of the school on a regular basis over at least four years. However, it is very rewarding, as together we can strategically input into the school and see another generation of children growing in knowledge and development within our community. A Foundation Governor represents the Church of England and should be a regular communicant within the Church.

We would be delighted to hear from anyone who has an interest in the performance of the school, but also a willingness to listen and help us make informed decisions to develop the school forward.

REPORT ON ANNUAL MEETING OF PARISHIONERS AND ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING 23rd April 2016 at 6.30pm at The Oak, Smannell

24 Parishioners attended the meetings which were chaired by Rev. Alex Randle-Bissell, who opened the meeting with a reading from an Epistle to the Corinthians and stressed his long-term commitment to the Pastrow Benefice. A challenging time lay ahead for everyone involved.

A Benefice Administrator would be appointed at the 'living wage' on a 6-week trial period. The position would be reviewed annually.

Irene Wilson and Emma Kinchenton were appointed Churchwardens at Christ Church and St. George's respectively.

The Minutes of the APCM held on 22nd April 2015 were confirmed and signed as correct by the Chairman and reports of the year's business from the Secretary, Church Electoral Roll Officer, Deanery Synod Representative, Gift Aid Secretary, Treasurer, Churchwarden and Team Vicar were presented to the meeting and unanimously adopted. (Minutes of the meetings, accounts and all reports are on display at both churches or are available from the Secretary. Tel: 357487)

The Accounts, which had been prepared by Treasurer Noel and independently examined, outlined the financial position and were unanimously approved. Colin Woods was elected as Independent Examiner of the Accounts; officers and members of the PCC and Sidespersons were elected or re-elected for the following year.

St. Mary's Church had severed all ties with Uganda and it was anticipated that all other links would also come to an end.

Rev. Alex thanked all members of the PCC and officers and members of both churches for their continued hard work, support and efficiency during the year. The Chairman made special mention of the Parish Oak magazine and the support and work performed by so many in the community. 'Enham' continued to look after the churchyard.

Noel Pope then made a presentation to Pete Bowker, thanking her and Rod for all their hard work on behalf of the PCC and the whole community.

The meeting closed with prayer at 7.35pm and Parishioners sat down to enjoy a delicious supper.


