EDITORIAL

Nearly 30 years ago, I was part of a large group of giggly teenagers that crossed the Channel on a school trip to visit First World War memorial sites in Belgium.

The visits had the potential to be a little excitable and not as profound as perhaps they should have been. It was, however, a most solemn and mind-expanding experience that coupled with an English project reviewing war poetry, changed the way I perceived the world and greatly influenced my learning far beyond school years. Examining in a great level of detail, the words of the war poets came alive. Memories of positioning a poppy on a wooden cross at the grave of an unknown soldier and listening to the bugle sound resonating around the Menin Gate at 8pm with crowds of people, was so heartfelt.

Recently, my husband and I stumbled across a film called *The Wipers Times* which brought a new angle to the conflict. The Wipers Times was a trench magazine that was published by British soldiers fighting in the Ypres Salient during the First World War. In early 1916, the 12th Battalion Sherwood Foresters came across an abandoned printing press. A sergeant who had been a printer salvaged it and printed a sample page. The paper consisted of poems, reflections and in-jokes relating to the military situation maintaining a humorously ironic style. Such an uplifting film and, for me, another reminder of the school trip to the trenches.

My daughter and I recently visited a local secondary school and the student showing us around talked about a similar trip that he had made to the battlefields earlier in the year. Without any prompting, he relayed what an amazing opportunity it had been – I was touched that the job of learning from the past continued. It would be presumptuous to reference the current state of world affairs and offer opinion, but I think there would be wholehearted agreement that the act of remembrance can provide a halt, a brief moment in time to reflect and to find perspective where it is needed.

There will also be a Remembrance church service at Christ Church, Smannell on Sunday 13th November at 10.45am. You will be most welcome to join us at either of these services.

The Christmas services are advertised elsewhere in this issue, but please don't forget the Crib service on Christmas Eve at Christ Church, Smannell at 5pm until 5.45pm. This is a service especially for families and children and indeed anyone of any age is most welcome to come. The New Year will see the commencement of a regular monthly family service at Smannell church. This will be held on every second Sunday of the month at 10.30am, and it will last for 45 minutes, with refreshments afterwards for those who wish to stay. The first one will be on Sunday 8th January and then the next one will be on Sunday 12th February, and so on. It is a more relaxed and informal service and again it is open to everyone, young and old, and everything in between, as well as for people who often go to a church service and those who have never been to one! It perhaps should really be called an All-Age service, but come along and see, and then you can decide for yourselves what we should call it!

REPORT ON PCC MEETING HELD ON 20th SEPTEMBER 2016 AT CAMBER HOUSE AT 6 P.M.

All members were present, with the exception of Margaret Smith who had sent her apologies. The Minutes of the meeting held on 21st June were confirmed and signed as correct by the Chairman. Treasurer Noel reported that 3 bills had been received from Enham who had now agreed to submit a monthly invoice. The annual cost was £1473.60. It was agreed to ask Enham to cut the hedges at the side of the churchyard every 2 years, for an extra fee. The successful social afternoon at the Rectory had raised £77 for the Toilet Fund. The Benefice Administrator was now in post 12 hours per week. A 'Bishop's Walk' practice had taken place - volunteers would be needed for man road crossings. A wrought iron hand rail had been ordered for the aravevard and any donations would be very welcome. Christine agreed to make some walkway signs for Christ Church churchyard. A Pastrow Services rota was now available and Rev. Alex agreed to send a copy of Benefice services from November onwards to the Editor of the Parish Oak. The Christ Church organ had been serviced. The organ at St. George's would be inspected - if required there was a spare organ available at Weyhill. A Parochial Visitation by Brenda Pomeroy would take place on 10th October; Rev. Alex and the Church Wardens would attend. There was a wide discussion on the choirs at the two churches.

Rev. Val, Irene and Emma agreed to form a working party to look at the costings and feasibility of toilets at both churches. Funds were being raised and Noel would hold any money collected. Noel reported that all was well with the finances and contributions to the Parish Share were up to date. Margaret Smith would be the other cheque signatory. It was agreed that the bench in Christ Church churchyard would be removed. The Family Services had been well supported it was agreed that these would take place every second Sunday at Christ Church at 10.15, with Matins taking place at 9.15 on the same day, subject to Bob Wheadon's approval. 'Messy Church' had been well attended with 39 people from 13 families. The occasion would be repeated on 4th October at Hatherden. Environmental health problems would need to be resolved if meals were to be served at these events. A Wedding & Baptismal Policy draft was discussed.

The next Craft Group would meet at the Vicarage on Wednesday, 12^{th} October at 2 p.m. The next PCC Meeting would be held at 6 p.m. at The Vicarage.

One autumn tradition that I'm sure many of you remember from your school days is Harvest Festival. This year we continued that tradition at Christ Church but in a very different fashion. We focused on the importance of water; because of course without any water there wouldn't be food to harvest. We also learnt that one of the most important aspects of water is sanitation and there are many people who don't have what we regard as essential, which is, access to a toilet. Exploring the idea a bit further enabled us to find out about the Toilet Twinning programme which provides toilets around the world. As one of our school Christian values is Love, we decided to pursue this. So you may well have seen a toilet being carried from church to school but wouldn't have known that in it was over £100 in donations to help us start our Toilet Twinning project for friends in other countries.

As well as these exciting events we've also held a successful Macmillan Coffee Morning, worked with the NSPCC to learn how to keep children safe, as well as hosting two 'Messy Church' sessions.

SCAM ALERT - WARNING FROM HAMPSHIRE TRADING STANDARDS

SPRAY FOAM INSULATION

Be alert to cold callers at the door or on the telephone, offering to spray your loft. Claims of effectiveness and cost savings may be exaggerated. The caller may make false claims, such as that they are working on behalf of local authorities, or that they work with Trading Standards.

Not all homes are suitable for this treatment. Ventilation and condensation problems can arise if it is not properly applied.

Carry out research before considering spray foam insulation. The work may be costly and unnecessary.
