Our school Governing Body is made up of people who come to us through a variety of routes and with a range of different backgrounds, skill and experiences, but they are all volunteers who work together for the benefit of the School and are the link between the School and the community it serves.

The role of the Governing Body is a strategic one and its key functions are to set the aims and objectives for the school; set the policies and targets for achievement; monitor and evaluate the progress the school is making, all this while being a source of challenge and support to the headteacher (a critical friend).

This isn't an application to be taken lightly, as it involves time, energy and a willingness to become involved in the life of the school on a regular basis over at least four years. However, it is very rewarding, as together we can strategically input into the school and see another generation of children growing in knowledge and development within our community. A Foundation Governor represents the Church of England and should be a regular communicant within the Church.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

PHISHING EMAILS

Fraudsters are turning to kindness with new phishing emails which encourage the recipient to open an attachment on the false premise that they could have already fallen a victim to scammers.

In the past few days Action Fraud has received hundreds of reports from email users who have received this email. The phishing email is sent from fraudsters who describe themselves as a "law abiding citizen" that have accidentally received the email recipient's personal details. They suggest that the recipient's emails details may have been made available to scammers and they are contacting them to try and rectify the problem. To do so the recipient must open the attached document.

In reality, the attached document opens the door to malware being downloaded onto the victim's computer. The malware attempts to obtain sensitive data from victims, such as banking credentials and passwords, this is subsequently used to take money from the victim.

In order to protect yourself from malware, having up- to-date virus protection is essential; however it will not always prevent you from becoming infected.

PROTECT YOURSELF

Do not click on links or open attachments you receive in unsolicited emails or SMS messages. Remember fraudsters can 'spoof' an email address to make it look like one used by someone you trust. If you are unsure, check the email header to identify the true source of communication.

Do not enable macros in downloads, enabling the macro will allow the malware to be installed onto your device.

Always install software updates as soon as they become available. Whether you are updating the operating system or an application. the update will often include fixes for critical security vulnerabilities.

Create regular backups of your important files to an external hard drive, memory stick or online storage provider. It is important that the device to

which you back up is not left connected to your computer as any malware infection could spread to that too.

If you think your bank details have been compromised, you should contact your bank immediately.

TELEPHONE SCAMS

The police have reported an increase in telephone scams where the fraudster purports to be from an official body such as DVLA, HM CUSTOMS, LOCAL COUNCILS ETC, saying that you have overpaid and will be refunded. To obtain the refund you will be required to give your bank details. A number of people have lost money this way, DO NOT become one of them. Such organizations will never ask for your bank details over the telephone.

A TRUE STORY

I recently received a telephone call from someone stating that they were my Internet provider. The caller sounded just as authentic as my internet provider he had an Asian voice and the background noises of a busy internet office. He stated that attempts had been made to break into my computer and for this reason I would be off line for up to fourteen days. When I said that this was not acceptable he said that if I switched on my computer he would try to overcome the problem on line.

I realized that this was a scam and told the caller so in "no uncertain terms".

I contacted my Internet provider who confirmed it was a scam. Internet providers only react to calls from customers who report faults.

If I had followed the callers instructions he would have tried to obtain remote control of my computer to obtain bank details, passwords etc or to place a virus on it.

If you receive such a call ignore it and report the incident, like I did, to Action Fraud on line at www.actionfraud.police.uk.

BISHOP'S WALK 1857 and 2017

On Wednesday 25th November 1857 our churches in Smannell and Hatherden were consecrated by the Bishop of Winchester.

He and the congregations walked from the village of Smannell to Hatherden with great celebrations in both churches.

The following evening the inhabitants of Smannell, Woodhouse and Little London celebrated this milestone in the development of their community by partaking of a most substantial supper of good old English fayre. A collection was held at both churches which amounted to \pounds 49 7s.#

The Fosters Education Act of 1870 meant that a new school was built in Smannell in 1973. Emily Kyte was the first headmistress and she had the sole responsibility for 84 children. The cost of building the school was £324 15s 6p.

100 years later in 1973, the Bishop at the time, visited the school celebrations, and parents and children were invited to a themed evening comparing the life in Victorian and modern times.

160 years later, the Bishop of Basingstoke will recreate the consecration walk between the Smannell and Hatherden churches, hopefully accompanied by the pupils from the Smannell and Hatherden schools, dressed in Victorian costumes.

This will be a really fun day, with a maypole dance in Smannell before the start of the walk. The Bishop will lead a short service of dedication and then we will be off across the "cinder track", enroute to Hatherden.

In the afternoon there will be lots of Victorian games between the pupils of both schools for a trophy whilst cream teas will be served with a choice of tea, beer or cider, and the Bishop will rededicate the church at Hatherden.

An extraordinary summer event for all ages in June involving a local 3 mile walk and lots of fun! All welcome!


