



H FJ The 48 Chair is part of the 48 Series, which was presented at the Cabinet Makers' Guild Exhibition in 1948. Even to the modern eye, it is clear that Finn Juhl's ideas reached far into the future, when they were presented in 1948.

The 48 Chair is easily recognizable because of Finn Juhl's characteristic and sculptural shapes and delicate details. The chair embraces the seated person while the rounded surfaces are shaped to fit the gravity of the resting body and its proportions. The organically shaped seat and backrest are raised from the carrying frame in an almost demonstrative manner. Visually this lifts the seated person, making it appear as if the law of gravity has been defeated.

Additionally, the 48 Series is characterized by the use of multiple materials. Today, it is rare to see furniture that employs two different types of wood. This type of contrast has been left almost entirely to Finn Juhl despite the many years that have passed. The 48 Chair is available in oak with armrests and toes in teak and a version entirely in walnut. The chair is upholstered with fabric or leather.
