



At nearly 5,000 acres, Miami Whitewater Forest is the largest park in Hamilton County. It serves as an enormous backyard for those living nearby and a destination for visitors across the county. Now a new parking lot and connector trail have made it even easier for local hikers, bikers, students and scientists to enjoy one of its most unique features.

Wetlands along the northwestern edge of the park have long been a popular spot for school, scout and civic groups. Fourth and fifth graders from all over the region come to explore an endangered habitat and see ecosystems and food chains in action. But a safer place for visitor and bus parking was needed in order to more easily access the area.

An opportunity for improved access arose in 2018 as a new subdivision was being built nearby. The developer understood the value of connecting people to parks – living near a green space has been shown to improve both

mental well-being and is attractive to many homeowners. So as part of the construction, the developer and Great Parks planned a trail that would lead from the neighborhood into the park, past the wetlands and linking up to the park's existing 8.1-mile Shaker Trace Trail. The parking area was also expanded and improved.

Completed in spring 2018, the project consisted of the trail and parking lot installation, as well as embankment and wetland levee reconstruction and storm drainage improvements. A number of native plants were also restored including red maple, sweetgum and eastern red cedar trees, hummingbird summersweet shrubs and black-eved Susan flowers. Park visitors are invited to head over to Baughman Road to see this new area for themselves and enjoy a walk along the wetlands.



Started spring cleaning? When most people contemplate this annual task, we think about knocking down cobwebs, washing windows and cleaning the garage. But spring is also a great time to clean up - and green up the great outdoors!

Spring is the ideal time to take care of our roadways and waterways. According to a 2014 interview, the Ohio Department of Transportation picks up more than 400,000 bags of litter along Ohio's roadways each year. Melting snow, spring rainfall and floods carry trash and debris down creeks, streams and rivers, depositing litter. It's important to remove as much waste as we can, and as quickly as we can, to keep the debris from polluting our waterways and underground sources of drinking water. Litter can also be very harmful to animals, so it's important to remove trash from our communities.

In addition to removing trash, spring is the season to plant trees and clean up invasive plant species. Invasive

Greening species are one of the leading threats to native plants and wildlife, changing food webs and decreasing biodiversity. Invasive plants like garlic mustard can outcompete native plants and wildflowers by monopolizing light, moisture and nutrients. The animals that depend on the many species of displaced native plants are also eliminated where invasive plants prevail.

> Take a step outside and ask yourself what you can do to clean up and improve the environment. If you don't know where to begin. Great Parks has countless volunteer opportunities to get you started. Join the Winton Lake Cleanup on April 13, when hundreds of volunteers will work to remove litter around Winton Lake, or help protect native species on Earth Day, April 20, by planting trees and removing invasive plant species.
