Rules & Regulations



REFUNDS & RESCHEDULING

Reservations are refundable if reserving group gives written notice at least 30 days prior to rental date. Reservations will not be canceled until written notice is received. Guests cancelling less than 30 days in advance of reserved date will still be responsible for full reservation fee and group will not receive a refund. All refunds are subject to a \$25 processing fee. Guests may reschedule their reservation at no charge with 30 days prior notice, upon availability.

MOTOR VEHICLE PERMITS

All vehicles entering Great Parks of Hamilton County must have a valid Motor Vehicle Permit (\$3 daily; \$10 annual) displayed. A group Motor Vehicle Permit is included with an Adventure Outpost cabin reservation.

OCCUPANCY LIMIT

Adventure Outpost may not be occupied by more than 32 people unless approved in advance. At least one camper at each cabin must be a responsible adult (18 years or older) who assumes responsibility for all actions at their cabin and should remain with campers at all times.

STAY LIMIT

Occupancy at Adventure Outpost Campground is limited to Fridays and Saturdays, May–October.

PARKING

Guests may park in the gravel parking lot near the cabins. Additional vehicles may park in the overflow parking lot, provided space is available, up McKelvey Road across from the disc golf course. Note: large groups may need to shuttle from the overflow parking lot to the cabins.

PARK DISTRICT BY-LAWS

All Great Parks of Hamilton County by-laws and regulations apply to the area. Park Rangers may terminate, upon just cause, any occupancy at any time without a refund.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Beer, liquor and wine are permitted by reserving groups within reserved area only. If alcohol is being served, the guest must comply with applicable liquor laws.

DELIVERIES & DECORATIONS

Any delivery must be approved by Adventure Outpost manager. All equipment, containers, etc. must be removed from the premises before final departure. Only tape may be used to affix decorations to shelters or tables; however, all tape must be removed at the end of the event.

SIGNS

All signs are prohibited in the Great Parks of Hamilton County including the entrances.

PETS

Pets are not permitted at Adventure Outpost.

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ELECTRIC & ATTRACTIONS

Electricity is available at both the picnic shelter and the cabins. Outside attractions are not permitted at Adventure Outpost.

LAKE

Swimming is not permitted in any Great Parks of Hamilton County lakes.

PROGRAM SUPPLIES

Adventure Outpost program supplies and program areas (climbing wall, archery, low ropes course, canoes, kayaks, etc.) are strictly off limits. They are only to be used under the supervision of Adventure Outpost staff and volunteers.

FISHING AND BOATING

The Adventure Outpost boat ramp is for programming and park use only. Launching of private watercraft is not allowed. Additionally, fishing is not allowed at the boat ramp or along any banks at Adventure Outpost.

MUSIC & SOUND

Amplified sound, music, or additional lighting is not permitted at Adventure Outpost.

PICNIC TABLES

Tables must be returned to shelter before check-out.

CONSERVATION, FIRES & FIREWOOD

Cutting or chopping of trees, limbs and vegetation, collection of natural materials and molesting wildlife is strictly prohibited. Fires are permitted in grills or fire ring only. Please do not burn garbage or any other materials that will emit excess sparks. Do not leave fire unattended and make sure fire is completely out before leaving the area.

CHECK-IN

Check-in is after 4 p.m. A key lock box is located at the shelter kitchen door. An access code is provided on the reservation confirmation. Press each number button in sequence, press down on the upper slide button; remove the face of the lock box. Repeat sequence to place the face back into position inserting the lower edge first and upper edge second. If necessary, contact Guest Relations at 513-521-7275, Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-04:30 p.m., or Ranger Headquarters at 513-521-3980, after 4:30 p.m. and weekends for assistance.

CHECKOUT & CLEAN-UP

Adventure Outpost must be vacated by 12 p.m. The reserving group will be held responsible for clean-up and any damage to the area. All garbage must be placed in the provided receptacles and any decorations taken down. Person/Group reserving area will be invoiced for any damages or excessive litter.

EMERGENCY

To contact a Ranger for emergency assistance, dial 911. For non-emergency assistance dial 513-825-2280. There is an emergency telephone located at the bathrooms. Park Rangers patrol the area 24 hours a day.
