In-person performances and programs take place on Lincoln Center's campus and are subject to up-to-date COVID-19 protocols. Families will receive pre-visit materials, including social narratives, photos and links before each program.

All virtual programs take place on Zoom and are inclusively designed. Most are open exclusively to families with children, teens or adults with disabilities.
