


Magical Miniature World Workshop at the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse




Led by Lincoln Center's education team and teaching artists as part of the Big Umbrella Festival, participants of all ages and abilities are invited to use a variety of accessible art-making materials to create their own magical miniature world and bring it to life! We invite children and families to join us in playing together, using movement and sound to explore our creations in this imaginative, hands-on workshop.

This 45-minute workshop takes place at the Stanley H. Kaplan Playhouse on the 10th floor of the Samuel B. and David Rose Building. The address is 165 West 65th Street.

The Rose Building (circled in red) is located at 165 West 65th Street, and the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse is on the 10th Floor.



Getting to the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse

BY SUBWAY: The Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse is a short distance from the **1** train at West 66th Street. It is a slightly longer distance from the **A, B, C, D** or **1** trains at 59th Street—Columbus Circle, accessible via elevator.



BY BUS: The M5, M7, M10, M11, and M104 bus lines all stop within one block of the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse.

Access-A-Ride: The recommended Access-A-Ride address for drop off closest to the main entrance is 165 West 65th Street (between Amsterdam Avenue and Broadway).

Parking:

Main Campus Parking (operated by ICON)

- Designated accessible parking spaces are located in the yellow section of the garage
- Entrance for Reserved Parking Section is on Amsterdam Avenue at 64th Street
- Parking permit and/or sticker must be displayed
- Advance reservations for parking include a \$5 service charge
- Height restrictions for vans apply

Venue Access:

The Samuel B. and David Rose Building is accessible from West 65th Street by elevator, stairs, and escalator.



This is the entrance to the elevator on the street level. It is located near the northeast corner of 65th Street and Amsterdam Avenue.



This is the Rose Building staircase that reads "Rose" on the steps. It is located in the middle of West 65th Street, facing towards Columbus Avenue.



This is the base of the street-level escalators, located next to the elevator.

The entrance to the Samuel B. and David Rose Building has manual, revolving, and automatic door options.



Audience Entrance and Security Gate:

The Box Office for Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse programs is located in the lobby of the Rose Building. Guests will be greeted by Lincoln Center staff and will be directed to enter through a security gate to reach the elevators.



To get to the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse, guests can enter the Samuel B. and David Rose Building go past the security gate and use the elevators to get to the 10th floor.



Once the doors open on the 10th floor, guests will be in the lobby (pictured below). The entrance to the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse is on your right.



Restrooms:

Men's and women's restrooms with one accessible stall each are located down the hall to the right across from the theater on the 10th Floor.

Lincoln Center welcomes guests to use the restroom that most closely aligns with their gender identity or expression, while the law requires gender binary signs.



Food and Drink:

Light snacks are available for purchase on the 10th Floor lobby.

Guests are welcome to bring outside food to eat in lobby.
Guests are also welcome to bring bottled drinks with lids into the workshop space.

There is a water fountain near the men and women's restrooms on the 10th floor. It is a bottle-friendly machine that has cups next to it for guests without a water bottle.





Accommodations:

The venue is on an **accessible route**. Wheelchairs are available to borrow during the workshop and on campus.



Assistive listening devices with headsets and neck loops available to borrow from lobby.



A KultureCity Pop-up is located on the 10th near the workshop. Noise-reducing headphones, earplugs, fidgets, and other sensory items are available to borrow from the box office and the chill out space.



Artmaking materials with varied grips and handles will be available to use at the workshop stations.



Access Concierge Service: Access Reps, trained to support guests with disabilities, are available to provide 1:1 support for individual guests and their party. Access Concierge Services must be scheduled in advance. For further information, guests can email guestexperience@lincolncenter.org or call 212 875 5456.




What to expect at a Relaxed Workshop:

- Guests are able to enter and leave the workshop space throughout the event, as needed
- Guests can vocalize or move throughout workshop space
- Fellow workshop participants are asked to create a no "shushing" zone
- Attention to bright lights, loud noises, and surprise sensory elements, described in advance
- Chill Out Space for guests to take a break and rejoin workshop when ready
- Visual guide, with clear instructions, shared before event
- Noise-reducing headphones and fidgets available to borrow
- Staff members and artists are trained in access and inclusion best practices



Chill Out Space



A **KultureCity Pop-Up**, designed for guests to take a sensory break, is located on the 10th floor, inside the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse.

Guests are welcome to take a break during the workshop and return when ready. **Noise-reducing headphones, earplugs, fidgets, and other sensory items** are available to borrow from the chill out space and the lobby.
