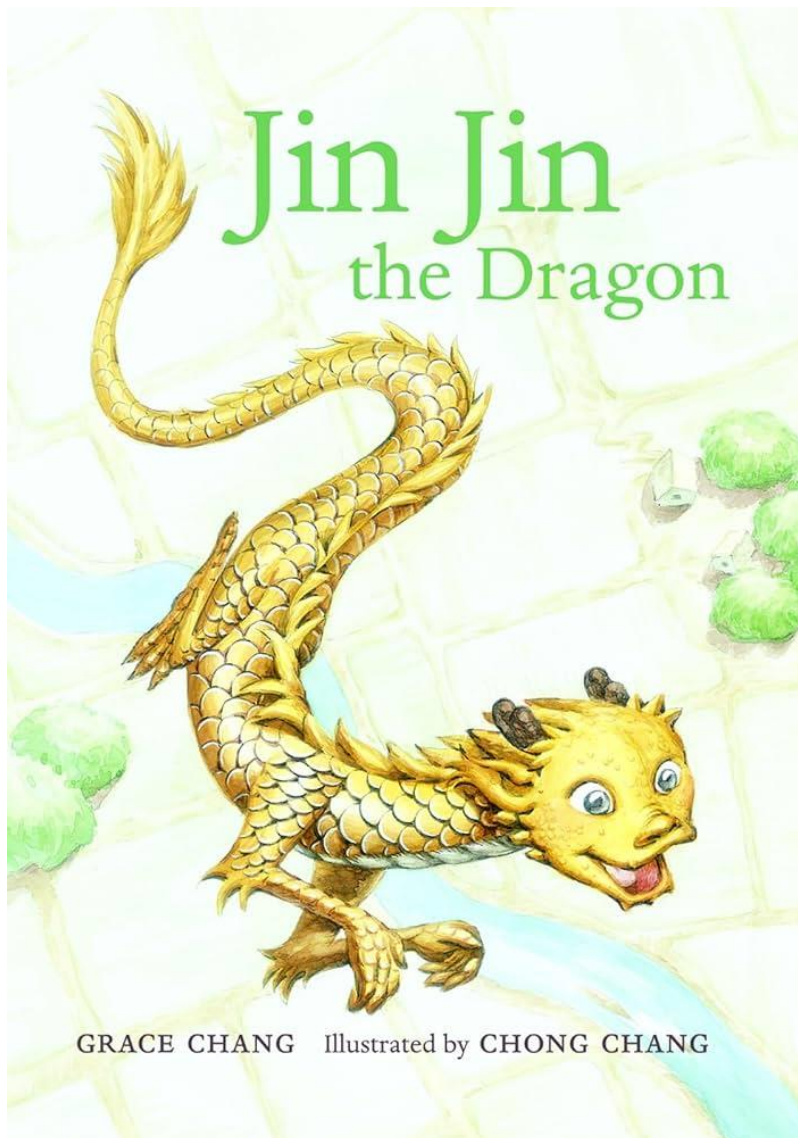

What is this event?

- Storytime with Grace Chang is a theater performance.
- We will read *Jin Jin the Dragon* by Grace Chang.
- This story follows Jin Jin, a young dragon who goes on a quest to discover who he is.
- As we read, you will see puppets and magic on stage.
- The performers may invite you to answer questions, join in call-and-response, or clap along.
- You can choose to watch, participate, or take breaks!



Who will you see?

- You will see Grace Chang, the narrator and author of *Jin Jin the Dragon*.



- You will see Jin Jin, a playful dragon puppet.



- You will see young Baoting, Grace's father as a little boy puppet.
- You will see young Grace Chang as our story travels back in time.

Basic Sensory Information

Here are some sensory moments you can plan for:



Sound

- The overall sound is medium loud. There will be drums and music. There are no sudden or surprising loud sounds.



Light & Visuals

- The room is well lit with a bright video wall behind the stage and bright spotlights on the performers.



Movement

- Performers will stay onstage. You may stay seated, but are welcome to move around, as needed.



Audience Participation

- Participation is optional. You may be invited to answer questions or clap along. It is your choice to participate or watch.



Emotional or Content Notes

- This program may explore family, relationships, identity, or belonging. There is no sensitive content.

Crowd, Space, and Waiting

- The space may feel busy or crowded. There may be a line or waiting period possible. If the space is full, staff may ask you to wait or come back later.
- When you enter, you will be greeted by library staff handing you a book. You are welcome to take the book, or not.
- There are big tables at the side of the lobby. One is for Access, one is for the library, and one is for membership.
- There are chairs to sit in, or you are welcome to sit on the carpet in front of the stage.

Breaks, Sensory Tools, and Access Services

- You can ask staff where to take a break.
- Sensory tools such as noise-reducing headphones, earplugs, and fidgets may be available.
- A Chill Out Space or break area is available next to coat check. You can follow signs or ask a Guest Experience Representative for directions.
- This performance will be a relaxed environment.
- Instant ASL interpretation through Convo Access may be available on Guest Experience Representative lanyards.
