Projects that had been postponed like the arts and recreation center in Madden Park are back online. At the city level I was honored to fight for a \$13 per hour city minimum wage that will lift 410,000 Chicagoans out of poverty. I helped to re-write the Chicago Ethics Ordinance and added more money from the TIF program to build affordable housing in the Five Year Housing Plan.
