

PART I - Boot Camp: Aimed to create a true theater ensemble, these sessions are devoted to theatrical skill building as well as hands-on lessons about the year's given historical subject.

PART III - Rehearsals and Crew

Calls: Rehearsals are every day after school and occasional Saturdays. NO ACTOR WILL BE CALLED EVERY DAY. After Boot Camp and Table Read, costumes and props should plan on meeting to work 1-2 days a week after school. Lights and sound are not called again until tech. Stage Management is called to every rehearsal and performance.

PART V – Student Matinees: As noted on calendars, students involved in the production miss their morning classes for five days. While students are excused from their classes to participate in morning performances, they are not excused from doing their work for those classes. Students are responsible for school work and class time missed.

PART II – Table Read: Cast and crew gather together to hear the script for the first time and to discuss it with the playwright. Actors then have a week off for memorizing lines.
