Soon the elaborate decorations grew and locals began referring to it as "Christmas House." As the decorating expanded to include the lake, walkways, buildings and surroundings the property became known as "Christmas Village." Over the years this holiday tradition has received many rewards including Best Outdoor Christmas Display in the World by Display World magazine; and Award of Excellence from the PA Travel Council as one of the Top Ten Travel Attractions in PA.

5.) American Music Theatre Presents: The First Noel (Nov. 5 – Dec. 30)

8.) Hershey's Holiday Chocolate House at Hershey's® Chocolate World® (Nov. 15 - Dec. 31)

This year marks the fifth annual Hershey Holiday Chocolate House at Hershey's® Chocolate World® Attraction. Each year the house is constructed by Hershey Company volunteers and a donation is made to Children's Miracle Network for their hours worked. This year 537.5 volunteer-hours were spent on construction and The Hershey Company will donate approximately \$4,300 to Children's Miracle Network. Thirty-two different candies were used to completely adorn the house and this is the first year the house is decorated inside as well as outside. Visitors can enjoy the chocolate house during regular Chocolate World hours.

9.) Hersheypark® Christmas Candylane® (Nov. 15 - Dec. 31)

The magic of the holidays comes to life at Hersheypark Christmas Candylane. With two million twinkling lights, rides for all ages, festive decorations, and Hershey's Product Characters decked out in their holiday best, there is something for all to enjoy. Sing-along at our heart-warming Christmas show, A Rockin' Music Box Christmas, visit Santa's reindeer (sponsored by U-GRO Learning Centres), and browse our quaint village shops. Christmas Candylane features many attractions for guests of all ages including over 30 rides.

10.) Hershey Sweet Lights® (Nov. 15 - Jan. 1)

16.) Mount Hope Theater: A Dickens of a Christmas (Dec. 4-23)
