Hershey Harrisburg Region at a Glance

The Hershey Harrisburg region is filled with family friendly museums and iconic attractions to world-class dining and outdoor activities. Celebrating its 200th year as Pennsylvania's State Capital in 2012, Harrisburg features a renowned block of restaurants, pubs and night clubs just a short walk from the sprawling and spectacular State Capitol complex and State Museum. Just a few miles away, Hershey provides family fun, rich history and of course, enough chocolate to last a lifetime as "The Sweetest Place on Earth®."

History and Culture

Rich with art venues, cultural experiences and live entertainment, the Hershey Harrisburg region offers a unique blend of historic charm and modern destinations.

Pennsylvania State Capitol – A National Historic Landmark

<u>www.pacapitol.com</u> - Upon its completion in 1906, President Theodore Roosevelt dedicated the Pennsylvania State Capitol building and declared it one of the most beautiful buildings of its kind. Architecturally inspired by St. Peters Basilica in Rome, the building hand-crafted Moravian mosaic tile work designed by Henry Chapman Mercer, Renaissance-inspired bronze doors that provide the grand entrance to the Capitol, and the Senate and House of Representative Chambers adorned with marble, murals, gold leaf and stained glass. Free tours of the Capitol building begin every half hour.

The National Civil War Museum

<u>www.nationalcivilwarmuseum.org</u> - The National Civil War Museum is the only museum in the U.S. that provides equal, bias-free attention to both Union and Confederate history of the Civil War. Opened in 2001 on President Lincoln's birthday, Feb 12, this beautiful \$16 million brick structure sits atop one of the highest vantage points in the city of Harrisburg, the museum showcases 24,000 artifacts, exhibits, documents and photographs valued at over \$17 million.

The State Museum of Pennsylvania

<u>www.statemuseumpa.org</u> - The State Museum of Pennsylvania, adjacent to the State Capitol Complex, offers over 4 million unique exhibits of artifacts, paintings and animal dioramas with a multi-media planetarium, an interactive Dino Lab, and a hands-on play environment for children. Explore the state's heritage from the dawn of geologic time, to the Native American experience, colonial and revolutionary beginnings, and a pivotal Civil War battleground through the Commonwealth's vast industrial age, **The State Museum demonstrates that Pennsylvania's story** *is* **America's story**.

Hershey Gardens 75th Anniversary

<u>www.HersheyGardens.org</u> - Since its opening in 1937, Hershey Gardens has grown to more than 23-acres of themed gardens poised on the hillside overlooking the entire town of Hershey, complete with a new seasonal butterfly house, an educational Children's Garden and the M.S. Hershey Tribute Garden, showcasing the newly revitalized M.S. Hershey Rose.

The Hershey Story – The Museum on Chocolate Avenue

www.hersheystory.org - For more than 100 years, the word "Hershey" has been synonymous with the Great American Chocolate Bar. Now, The Hershey Story takes visitors on an inspirational journey from the failures to the fortunes of Milton S. Hershey; and explains the entrepreneurial spirit that created an iconic American chocolate company built a hometown for his employees, and left a legacy of The Milton Hershey School, the nation's biggest and wealthiest boarding school for needy children. There are additional fees for a 45-minute Chocolate Lab class for a hands-on chocolatier experience and the Countries of Origin Chocolate Tasting with samples of warm drinking chocolates from around the world.

Whether your thrill of choice is speeding rollercoasters, a grand slam home run or a hat trick, a 3-D chocolate experience or a quick trip through the galaxy, the Hershey Harrisburg region will satisfy your appetite for family fun and adventure.
