GRAND RAPIDS HOLIDAY CELEBRATION

Celebration will include Christmas tree lighting, Rosa Parks Circle Ice Rink opening

Grand Rapids, Mich. – Thursday, December 3 at 5:30 P.M., Experience Grand Rapids will host the Grand Rapids Holiday Celebration at Rosa Parks Circle. The event will feature performances by a skater from the Greater Grand Rapids Figure Skating Club and Opera Grand Rapids Chorus. Three year-old Carlee, with the Make-A-Wish Foundation, will light the 47-foot-tall Christmas tree from Dutchman Tree Farms in Manton, Mich. Carlee is undergoing treatment for Leukemia at Helen DeVos Children's Hospital and will realize her dream of traveling to Disney World this March.

The return of the Grand Rapids Holiday Celebration and tree lighting is due in large part to the generosity of downtown businesses and the collaborative efforts of Experience Grand Rapids, The City of Grand Rapids and Downtown Grand Rapids, Inc. The grassroots fundraising effort was organized by Charlie Secchia and John Inhulsen. Rockford Construction safely installed the Christmas tree and Shine hung the tree lights.
