






Hipster districts

BIG IN 2016

Packed city breaks in San Francisco

Why? Amid soaring skyscrapers and Victorian townhouses, this higgledy-piggledy city has the most exciting food and art scene in the US right now. Taste it at Aatxe (aatxesf.com; small plate about £7), for tapas in the Swedish American Hall concert venue; or snap up the city's hottest art ticket, at the De Young museum, for bold and modern exhibitions, including a retrospective on couturier Oscar de la Renta (deyoung. famsf.org; March-May; £6.60). Best night out Just 12 minutes by train from Downtown San Fran, the port of Oakland is a hotbed of change, as the industrial quarter

sizzles with hot diners and fashion and interiors boutiques. Emblematic of it all is Calavera (calaveraoakland.com; mains about £16), the latest Mexican restaurant. Or hit Temescal Alleys district (east of Telegraph Avenue), where former stables have been transformed into hip boutiques.

New this year After a spaceage-style expansion, the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (sfmoma.org) re-opens on May 14, revealing an installation of 260 works by post-war and contemporary artists such as Anselm Kiefer, Sol LeWitt and Roy Lichtenstein. And no-frills airline WOW air (wowair.co.uk) starts flights to San Fran in June from Gatwick, from just £99.
