Long-time visitors to the old Eastern Sports and Outdoor Show – the predecessor of the Great American Outdoor Show – may see hints of the popular lumberjack water show in some of the new entertainment coming to the show this year.

The Dock Dogs Jumping Contest, a canine water sports demonstration, will do two water shows per day Saturday, Feb. 6, through Wednesday, Feb. 10, in the Large Arena of the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex and Convention Center.

The Large Arena will then be closed for the next two days as crews prepare for the Phil Robertson UnMuzzled program, with warm-up by Montdale country singer Nate Hosie, Friday, Feb. 12, and the NRA Country Concert featuring country star Justin Moore and special guest Ben Gallagher, an up-and-coming country artist from Camp Hill, Saturday, Feb. 13. <u>Here's more about Phil Robertson appearance at the Great American Outdoor Show.</u>

Another program change, moving the Birds of Prey: The Ultimate Hunter into the Small Arena, should make more visitors aware of the program and give them better vantage points for watching it. The program, which features live raptors and covers everything from the birds' biology to their relationships with humans to falconry, will be held each day of the show, Saturday, Feb. 6, through Sunday, Feb. 14.

"We're trying to always add a bunch of different events for the family," said Jeremy Greene, director of marketing and media relations for NRA General Operations.

He also anticipates that Pyramyd Air will expand the air gun range again this year. The range, part of the of the show's family-oriented offerings, provides visitors with the chance the use a variety of air guns at targets ranging from animal silhouettes to spinning metal plates.

The Fishing Hall also will be expanded with more exhibitors, retailers, captains and guides this year.

"We really focused on fishing this year," said Greene. "We got a lot of feedback last year for more fishing."

Visitors should expect the Shooting Sports Hall to continue its upgrading also, as more of the national manufacturers bring their top-level, national, industry-show exhibits to Harrisburg.

Greene said their initial hesitance over a long, nine-day show has transformed into a recognition that the Great American Outdoor Show allows for considerable consumer research into future product alterations and additions.

While visitors from 43 states attended last year's show, the growing prominence of the event in Central Pennsylvania affords residents here an enhanced position in influencing product changes and new directions.

Although it's not really a part of the show that most visitors will even know is happening, another programming change will bring Bass University to a meeting room in the complex on Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 6 and 7. Bass University brings together a half-dozen bass fishing pros to offer one- or two-day programs in various venues. <u>Here's more about Bass University</u>.

Many repeat visitors will notice the change from the unwieldly, tabloid newspaper-sized program guide for the show to a slick, 70- to 76-page magazine this year. The pocket guide and map to the show, which was a bit hit with visitors last year, will be back again this year.

Fishing enthusiasts interested in learning to catch more big bass will have the chance to learn from pro anglers at The Bass University with Mike "Ike" Iaconelli, Ott DeFoe, Ish Monroe, Jacob Prowroznik, Pete Gluszek, and John Crews.

Bass University coming to Great American Outdoor Show

Bass University will join the Great American Outdoor Show this year at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex and Expo Center in Harrisburg.

The Bass University of one- and two-day slate of classes taught by professional bass anglers is coming to the Great American Outdoor Show, or at least the first weekend of the show, Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 6-7, at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex and Expo Center, Harrisburg.

Although some of the pros leading the classes also will be presenting seminars and demonstrations during the show, which runs Saturday, Feb. 6, through Sunday, Feb. 14, Bass University is not included with show admission and not even noticeable to most show visitors. It will be held in the same complex of halls, but in a separate meeting room off the main floor.

Admission to Bass University is \$109 for one day or \$199 for both days, \$97 or \$175 for students ages 17 and under.

The pros scheduled for Saturday are Mike Iaconelli, Ott DeFoe and Ish Monroe, and for Sunday are Jacob Powroznik, Pete Gluszek and John Crews. That lineup could change because of emergencies or weather conditions.

They will give students an in-depth look at their individual mind-sets and unique fishing styles. Each one will present two 45 minute programs on cutting-edge bass fishing tactics and techniques, and then take questions from students.

Each day also includes a breakout session designed for an up-close learning experience and a question and answer roundtable discussion among all three pros for that day.

Cedar Cliff grad Gallaher to open country concert for Justin Moore at Great American Outdoor Show

A Cedar Cliff High School graduate who is now a Nashvillebased country singer will help open the 2016 <u>Great American</u> <u>Outdoor Show.</u>

<u>Ben Gallaher</u> graduated in 2010 and <u>signed a record deal</u> with Sony Music Nashville in 2014. In 2015, he signed a publishing deal with Universal Music Publishing. He lives in Nashville when he's not touring. He will open for Justin Moore on Feb. 13.

"I have attended the outdoor show for years with my family and have grown up hunting, fishing, and camping in central Pennsylvania. It's an honor to return to my hometown and open this show," he said in a news release. "I remember seeing Justin Moore perform at the PA Farm Show Complex years ago, and I am beyond excited to open for him in the same arena."

Now 23, he spent one year at Penn State University and transferred to Nashville's Belmont University where he graduated in May 2014 with a degree in Entertainment Industry Studies. Ben Gallaher and his band performed to approximately 500 fans at a free concert at the Pennsylvania Farm Show's Large Arena on the evening of Jan. 3.

"I write about the common man, because those are the people I grew up with. In every song there's a story about life, and what we hope to become and the highs and lows on our journey," he said of his songwriting, according to his website.
