

# Notes on Differences in Attendance at Area Sites, 2003 Versus 2002

- Anderson Japanese Gardens' numbers were lower partly due to power outage during the July 4<sup>th</sup>
  Holiday.
- Tinker Swiss Cottage attributes lower numbers due to the fact they did not have the Kid's Castle at the Waterfront this year.
- MetroCentre and Davis Park numbers rose in 2003, with the MetroCentre rising by more than 180,000. They attribute a larger number of shows and bigger names like Match Box 20, Cher, Kenny Chesney, and Toby Keith to their large attendance rises.
- Rock Cut State Park had substantially larger number of visitors. Park officials attribute exceptional fall weather and better visibility with the near-by development to the much larger numbers for 2003.
- Erlander Home Museum's attendance numbers are lower for 2003 compared to 2002 due to their celebration of 150 years of Swedish Immigration in 2002. For this there were many more events and displays, thus drawing more people.
- Like 2002, in 2003 Rockford Speedway numbers were lower than expected due to inclement weather along with less people coming out due to economical issues.
- County Golf Courses numbers dropped some, though numbers indicate rounds played, not actual number of people. 2,600 people visited the County Golf Courses during 2003.
- The Guilford Tennis Center credits their large attendance increase to their great relationship with the U.S. Tennis Association, their talented staff and their large turnouts for tournaments. Their attendance number would actually be larger but they cannot account for walk-ups and after hours play.
- 317 Gallery number inaccurate from 2002. Attendance was actually around 10,000 with a decrease to 8,000 for 2003. Lower number attributed to lower amount of walk-in business and a lower interest in local art scene.
- Discovery Center numbers from the past have also included attendance numbers from traveling
  exhibits. Numbers are down this year because A. Not all traveling exhibits had reported their
  numbers when this document went to press and B. Traveling exhibits went to smaller venues this
  year, thus less people. Also noted was the fact that the actual Center was up in attendance by
  1000 people compared to last year.
- The Ski Broncs' attendance number increased by 18,000 compared to 2002. They attribute this to their hosting of the Midwest Regional tournament and the Nationals Tournament for Show Ski.
- 2003 Rockford Dance Company numbers appear exceptionally high due to inaccurate information provided by RDC in 2002. Numbers are not for actual year, rather their fiscal year which is June 1-May 31.
- Blackhawk Farms Raceway numbers rose due to better weather than 2002.
- Forest City Queen numbers rose again after reopening in 2002 because of dry dock in 2001.
- Burpee Museum and National History numbers rose due to an increased interest in "Jane" as well as other exhibits.

# Notes on Differences in Attendance at Area Events, 2003 Versus 2002

- Disney on Ice proved to be a big hit at the MetroCentre after not being shown last year.
- The Rockford Art Museum Festival experienced only a slight drop in attendance with the terrible weather it experienced on both days of the festival.
- Fiesta Italiana saw a significant drop in attendance due to rain and poor weather.
