



# 50 Local Wrestlers Advance to Illinois Kids Wrestling Federation State Tournament

3,000 Expected to Attend; Over \$160,000 Economic Impact for Local Community

**ROCKFORD, IL** — The Illinois Kids Wrestling Federation state tournament returns to the Rockford MetroCentre, 300 Elm St., for the eighth consecutive year March 12-13. Approximately 900 young wrestlers ages 10-14 will compete in front of more than 3,000 spectators from throughout the state. The estimated economic impact of the state tournament is more than \$160,000 for area hotels, restaurants and businesses. The event is open to the public. All-session passes are \$15/adult and \$10/child; single session passes are \$5/adult or child; children under five are free.

<u>HONONEGAH WRESTLER COLLAPSES AT PRACTICE, DIAGNOSED WITH LEUKEMIA:</u> Earlier this season, Tom Rader pulled his son Matthew, a varsity wrestler for Hononegah, out of practice because his son appeared close to collapsing. Matthew was a star athlete who started wrestling at age 6, placed seventh in state at the MetroCentre in 2006 and was also a sectional and regional champion through IKWF. Matthew's wrestling career suddenly ended this season when he was diagnosed with leukemia.

Despite the challenge of undergoing treatment for the cancer, Matthew still finds the time and energy to guide his younger brother, Alex, through his own wrestling career. Alex, who started wrestling at age 5 and is now 13 years old, placed first at regionals and sectionals, heading into state with a 42 in 5 record. Alex idolizes his older brother Matthew and has learned much about wrestling from him. It's Hononegah's tradition for the athletes to dye their hair blonde for the state tournament, but Alex plans to take this a step further by cutting MTR, which stands for Matthew Thomas Rader, into his hair.

<u>SON FOLLOWS IN HIS FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS:</u> Tony and Joshua Albers are a father/son team for Dakota Wrestling Club. Tony, who is currently the assistant head wrestling coach for Dakota, won the state championship in 1980 in the 105-pound weight class, and Joshua is following in his father's footsteps. Joshua, age 14, placed second when he was 10 years old, fifth when he was 11 years old and third when he was 12 years old. He hopes to win the state title this year as his dad did in 1980.
