2,000 H.O.G. Riders to Ride the Rumble to Rockford

Economic Impact Estimated at \$600,000

ROCKFORD, IL — From road trips to road tricks, Harley-Davidson riders will find fun in the Rockford and Woodstock Region. Nearly 2,000 Harley-Davidson owners and fans will attend the 2011 Illinois Harley Owners Group (H.O.G.) Rally this weekend, June 9 – 12, 2011.

Attendees from as far away as Florida will "Ride The Rumble To Rockford", filling an estimated 3,300 hotel room nights and generating approximately \$600,000 for area hotels, restaurants and retail outlets. This is the first time the event will take place in Rockford or northern Illinois.

Riders can polish their bikes 'til they shine at a H.O.G. wash, hit the road on one of the several toured and selfguided rides and wrap up with an evening full of entertainment. Scheduled events include the world's largest H.O.G. Friday Fish Fry, live music with the Dirty Fish Net Stockings, field games, tattoo contests and waterpark fun. Riders will also be encouraged to visit Rockford's Kegel Harley-Davidson, the oldest family-owned Harley dealership, and Woodstock Harley Davidson.

"This rally provides our community with incredible exposure," said RACVB President/CEO John Groh. "We not only gain visitors for the weekend, this event further establishes the Rockford Region as a destination for motorcycle riders. H.O.G. members and fans will get the chance to explore the scenic rides around Rockford and Woodstock and see what makes this community great. We hope they'll be back with friends and family, or possibly even a future rally."

The Rockford Region beat out Danville to serve as home for this year's rally. The RACVB worked with the Clock Tower Resort, Rock River of Northern Illinois and McHenry County H.O.G. Chapters, and dealers to put together a comprehensive bid for the rally that showcased the best of the region. Organizers selected Rockford because of the variety of guided and self-guided rides available throughout northern Illinois and southern Wisconsin, the diverse entertainment and recreation options available, and the quality of the hotel facilities.

The Best Western Clock Tower Resort and Conference Center serves as the host hotel for this event.

"This rally is an unbelievable opportunity for our region. Not only will the Clock Tower benefit, but an event this size will have an influence all on all our hotels." said Clock Tower General Manager and H.O.G Rally Coordinator Dwight Hopfauf.

Steel Beams from Twin Towers on Display

Ride the Rock Guided Bike Tour

Friday and Saturday, 9 a.m. Depart Clock Tower Resort & Conference Center

Follow local H.O.G. road captains on a 70-mile scenic ride with spectacular views of Northern Illinois. Rides depart Friday and Saturday at half-hour intervals, starting at 9 a.m. Last ride out at 12:30 p.m. each day.
