Chapter 1 INTRODUCTION, METHODOLOGY, AND SAMPLE CHARACTERISTICS

INTRODUCTION

To gauge public opinion about local tourism efforts, Rockford Area Convention & Visitors Bureau (RACVB) contracted with Health Systems Research to conduct a survey of local residents, repeating an effort that took place three years ago. The survey covered topics about the organization's visibility, role and development, a recommendation score, support of various tourism-related projects, and quality of life measures. Questions about survey respondents' demographics were also included. Health Systems Research (HSR), an applied social service research unit of the University of Illinois at Rockford, specializes in survey research for health, education, and civic organizations.

METHODOLOGY

RACVB and HSR staff worked jointly to develop the survey instrument which included many of the 2012 questions in order to draw comparisons. Once the questionnaire was finalized, the project was submitted to and approved by the University of Illinois College of Medicine's Institutional Review Board. The survey is anonymous with no identifiers to tie responses to an individual. See Appendix A for survey instrument.

The 2015 RACVB survey was administered two ways:

- Surveys were mailed to a random sample of residential addresses of zip codes in Winnebago County, equivalent to one in 18 households. Four Rockford zip codes (61101, 61102, 61103, 61104) were double-sampled because these areas exhibited relatively low response rates in 2012. Postage-paid envelopes were enclosed for respondents to return their completed survey to HSR.
- 2) An electronic survey was set up using Qualtrics software. The online survey link was available to anyone who chose to access the link.

The mailed surveys were delivered to local households on January 23 and 24, 2015, while the survey link was accessible as of January 22, 2015. Returned mail surveys were accepted through the end of February and the survey link was active until February 23, 2015.

RACVB staff promoted the survey using a variety of ways to encourage response including media releases, radio and television interviews, email blasts, and posts on social media sites.

RESPONSE

A total of 948 surveys were returned by mail and electronic submissions numbered 728. More online surveys were started but only those which responded to at least two questions were included in the online count. Combining mail and electronic returns yields a total response of 1,676 surveys. For survey analysis in subsequent chapters, the sample includes all surveys

returned by mail and online surveys in which respondents' zip codes were located in Winnebago County, a total of 1,517 surveys.

Mail Response by Geography (Tables 1.1 and 1.2)

At the end of February, 948 useable surveys were returned (from a total of 977 of which 29 were blank). These 948 surveys equate to a response rate of 15.8% surpassing 2012 at 13.7% by more than two percentage points. This impressive response exceeds rates typically associated with recent local surveys in urban areas which have ranged from 12-14%.

Four zip code areas exhibit response rates surpassing 20%. These exceptionally strong returns occurred for 61107 Rockford Near Northeast, 61108 Rockford Southeast, 61103 Rockford Central, which was double sampled, and 61111 Loves Park. Also high with rates above 18% are 61109 Rockford, 61011 Caledonia, 61115 Machesney Park, and 61024 Durand. Low returns rates falling in the single digits characterized 61080 South Beloit (9.4%) and zip codes which are post office boxes only, including 61125, 61126 Rockford and 61131, 61132 Loves Park.

The mailing list for the survey was generated by zip code and zip codes cross county lines, so a minimal number of addresses fell outside the county. They are still considered part of the mail sample since the zip code is located at least in part within the county's boundaries.

Online Response by Geography (Tables 1.1 and 1.3)

Unlike the mailed survey, online respondents were not limited to Winnebago County, though messages about the survey link were disseminated through the Rockford-based RACVB. The largest single zip code represented is 61107, accounting for 16.3% of total replies (18.1% if no answer omitted), followed by 61108 and 61103. These three areas accounted for more than one in three (36.4%) of online respondents or four in ten (40.6%) online respondents who indicated their zip code.

RESPONDENT CHARACTERISTICS

Because RACVB intended this survey to be a "citizen survey" of local opinion, the survey sample used for analysis includes all surveys returned by mail since they were sent to a random sample of households in Winnebago County zip codes as well as online replies in which respondents designated their home to be in a zip code located in the county. Thus, of the 1,676 total surveys recorded, 1,517 are used for survey analysis. Their description is shown below.

The survey sample (Table 1.4) is almost two-thirds (64.6%) female; 50-64 year olds comprise the largest age group (39.2%) followed by 65 and older (28.1%). Nine in ten (89.8%) are non-Hispanic whites and 46.1% possess a four-year college degree or more. The homes of one in four (25.9%) respondents contain children under the age of 18.

Another question asked respondents how long they had resided in the county. Very few (11, 0.7%) were newcomers having moved to the county within the past year, much smaller than the 3.1% as indicated by the Census.

A description of all 1,676 survey respondent characteristics including all online responses regardless of where respondents lived is shown in Appendix F including a Census comparison.

SURVEY ACCURACY

Surveys which gather public opinion such as this one are intended to represent the views of the population as a whole. While the degree to which the survey sample reflects that population is not known, the mailed-out version was purely random, sent to one in 18 households and therefore representative, although people who complete and return surveys may differ from those who do not, thereby affecting the overall representativeness. The online survey was not random but produced a high volume of replies generating much useful information. Examining the demographic characteristics of 2015 survey respondents to the Winnebago County population provides a base for understanding how well the sample reflects the population as a whole (Table 1.4). As typifies many community surveys, RACVB survey respondents were more likely to be female, older, white, and with higher education than the population as a whole. The mailed-in responses were a closer match than online to Winnebago County's population for gender, race/ethnicity, and education, while online was a better match for age and presence of children at home (See Appendix F).

In addition to representativeness, an important consideration in judging the survey's accuracy is the margin of error since a sample, not the entire population, was surveyed. Given the response rate and sample size for the mail survey, the margins of error for most survey questions are +/- 3.0% at a 95% confidence level and +/-2.5% at a 90% confidence level. When results are analyzed by demographic characteristics, margins of error are larger than the sample as a whole. Therefore, categories within two groups were collapsed to achieve an adequate cell size for survey analysis: length of residence (less than 5 years = under 1 + 1-4), race/ethnicity (minority race/ethnic = black + Hispanic + Asian + multi-racial + other).

Chapter 2 AWARENESS OF ROCKFORD AREA CONVENTION & VISITORS BUREAU

A two-part question asked survey participants about their awareness of the Rockford Area Convention & Visitors Bureau (RACVB). If they knew that RACVB existed, a follow-up question inquired about ways they had encountered the organization.

Analysis of these survey questions includes all paper returns since they were mailed to households in Winnebago County zip codes only and online returns in which respondents indicated their zip code to be within the county's boundaries.

Where comparisons to 2012 are drawn, 2015 survey responses are shown for this sample, as well as 2015 paper returns only since the 2012 survey was paper response only.

KNOW EXISTENCE OF RACVB

Almost nine in ten (87.1%) survey respondents said they were aware of RACVB before receiving the survey, surpassing the 2012 level of 84.0%. Among 2015 respondents, 9.7% did not know about RACVB, while 3.0% were unsure.

While gender did not make a big difference in awareness, age, race/ethnicity, and length of residence did. In addition, more online (93.8%) than paper (83.4%) respondents knew about RACVB. Based on both paper and online returns, groups surpassing 90% awareness were respondents ages 50-64 (91.6%) and 65+ (90.4%), much higher than ages 18-29 (61.2%) and 30-39 (73.3%). The same is true for whites (89.3%) compared to non-white groups; (54.8% Hispanic, 71.4% other, 72.3% black.

While lower awareness characterized those with no more than a high school diploma (75.4%), the other educational levels were quite similar at 85% and above. Awareness fell below 70% for respondents who have lived in the county for less than 10 years, more than 20 percentage points below 20+ year residents (91.6%).

Awareness also varied by presence of children at home and zip code of residence, though not to the same degree. Eight in ten (81.3%) households with children at home knew about RACVB versus nine in ten (89.1%) households without children. The spread by zip code ranged from 79.1% among Caledonia respondents to 94.4% for Rockford 61114. Table 2.1 shows responses by demographic group. In that table, "no" and "not sure" responses are combined.

Groups with the greatest awareness of RACVB's existence (Table 2.2) are residents living in Rockford zip codes 61114, 61103 and 61108, ages 50-64 and 65+, adults who have earned a four-year college degree, and long-time residents. On the other hand, the lowest awareness occurred among respondents of Hispanic ethnicity, ages 18-29, and those living in the county less than 10 years.

HOW DO THEY KNOW ABOUT RACVB

Most commonly, respondents who knew about RACVB encountered this organization through the local media (76.0%). Next highest, though considerably lower, is the calendar of events (43.2%) followed by advertisement in a magazine (36.7%) and Stroll on State (34.8%). Forest City Beautiful/downtown beautification (28.1%) and website/Facebook (23.9%) were each mentioned by about one-quarter of respondents, while amateur sports tournaments were how 17.2% of respondents knew about RACVB and working with RACVB on an event was noted by 11.6% (Table 2.3).

Compared to survey results of three years ago, respondents who were familiar with RACVB through the website/Facebook quadrupled from 5.6% to 23.9%, explained in part by the addition of the online survey option in 2015. Also witnessing a dramatic rise in the past three years was the proportion of respondents who had worked with RACVB on an event (3.1% 2012, 11.6% 2015). Two means of RACVB exposure, Stroll on State and Forest City Beautiful/ downtown beautification were not survey options in 2012 so no comparisons can be made.

Using 2015 paper returns alone, four ways held similar influence as was true in 2012 survey results: local media 81.5% versus 83.0%, 2012; advertisement 37.3% (39.8%, 2012) and website/Facebook 6.0% (5.6%, 2012); worked with RACVB on meeting, reunion, tournament 3.8% (3.1%, 2012). The other two, calendar of events (30.2%) and amateur sports tournaments (14.6%), show drops in 2015 over 2012 at 34.0% and 22.3%, respectively.







Chapter 3 IMPORTANCE AND EFFECT OF TOURISM ON LOCAL ECONOMY

Three survey questions addressed the role of visitors and tourism in economic development of the Rockford region. The first question asked about tourism's importance to the regional economy, the second asked about the effects, and the third wanted respondents to rate their likelihood of recommending a visit to Rockford.

Survey analysis is based on all paper survey returns along with online respondents who said they resided in a Winnebago County zip code. Where comparisons to 2012 are made, 2015 survey responses are shown for this sample as well as 2015 paper returns only.

IMPORTANCE OF VISITORS TO ROCKFORD'S REGIONAL ECONOMY

Practically all (96%) 2015 survey respondents feel that visitors and tourism are important or very important to Rockford's regional economy (Table 3.1). Claiming visitors are "very important" are 69.2% (all) or 65.4% (paper only) surpassing 2012 at 61.0%. Very few (under 1.5%) believe that visitors are not important, while don't know proportions resemble 2012 levels.

Using 2015 survey results (paper and online in Winnebago County only), the highest levels of respondents saying that visitors are very important to the regional economy (> 72%) are those living in Rockford zip codes 61101, 61103, 61108, 61109; Winnebago and Caledonia; and educated to the level of associate's or technical degree (Table 3.2). At the other end of the spectrum, with fewer than 64% saying that visitors are very important to the economy are residents of 61104-Rockford, Pecatonica and Durand, Hispanics, under 40 (18-29 and 30-39 year olds), and movers to the county during the past five years.

A summary score which take into account all three possible responses (very important=3, important=2, not important=1) shows an overall mean of 2.70 (Table 3.5). This score tops the 2012 mean of 2.61.

Differences emerge when comparing mean scores by characteristic. Females rate tourism's importance higher than males and so do respondents 40 years and older versus younger ones. Also giving higher ratings to tourism's importance are whites compared to other race/ethnic groups, respondents with associate/technical degrees, residents living in the county for at least five years, households without children at home, and respondents whose workplace is located in the county. Except for respondents from 61104 and 61102, all other Rockford zip codes, Caledonia, Cherry Valley, Winnebago, and Loves Park yield mean scores above the overall mean of 2.70. Online respondents' mean score of 2.76 was significantly higher than paper survey respondents.

EFFECT OF VISITORS ON LOCAL ECONOMY

More than two in three (68.5%) 2015 survey respondents believe that visitors to Rockford produce a strong enough positive influence to improve the local economy. Using 2015 paper returns only, 64.4% feel this way. These levels are higher than 2012 (Table 3.3). Also saying the effect is positive are three in ten (30.0%, 33.5% paper only) who indicate that tourism contributes to the economy through limited visitor spending. Only a handful feels that visitors have no or a negative effect on the economy. The few who said why the effect is negative claim the hospitality industry is low-paying, and visitors cost more than they spend and contribute to traffic problems.

While responses vary by group (Table 3.4), differences are not great. The widest gaps occur by zip code of residence. With more than 72% saying that tourism's effect is strong enough to bolster the economy are respondents living in Rockford zips 61108, 61103, 61101, Cherry Valley, and Roscoe. Fewer than 64% feel that way among residents of Pecatonica, Durand, 61109-Rockford, as well as Hispanics.

Mean scores reflecting all possible question choices where 1=negative effect, 2=no effect, 3=some positive effect, and 4=strong positive effect are shown on Table 3.5. Highest mean scores (3.70 and higher) are reported by females, respondents ages 50-64, those with a four-year college degree, resident 10-19 years, and whose employment is located in Winnebago County. Highest scores among zip codes are 61108-Rockford, 61103-Rockford, 61102-Rockford and 61016- Cherry Valley. Also of note is online respondents' higher score (3.75) compared to paper survey respondents (3.62).

SCALE FOR RECOMMENDING ROCKFORD

Respondents were asked on a scale from 1 to 10 with 1 meaning "absolutely, not under any circumstances" and 10 meaning "absolutely, enthusiastically yes," considering its attractions, parks, entertainment, restaurants, and other things to see and do, how likely are you to recommend a visit to Rockford to your friends, family, or colleagues?" Responses to this question produced a mean score of 6.64, a median (half above and half below) at 7 and mode (most common reply) at 8.

Not surprisingly, mean scores (Table 3.7) varied widely depending on some demographic characteristics such as age, race/ethnic group, and zip code of residence. Differences also occurred by education though the spread was not as great.

Among age groups, the oldest respondents who are ages 65 years and older give the highest recommendation score at 7.12, while the youngest the lowest (5.75). As age group increased so did the score. Whites generated the highest score (6.72) among race/ethnic groups, with blacks (6.20) and Hispanics (6.32) fairly close together. By geography, Loves Park residents give the highest score (7.19), followed closely by 61103-Rockford (7.16). At the low end were 61104-Rockford (6.06) and Rockton (6.09).

Online survey respondents produced a higher mean score (7.02) than paper (6.41), as did females (6.70) compared to males (6.55). Respondents with the most education rated their likelihood recommendation highest at 6.93, and associate/technical degree holders the lowest (6.28). Residents who have lived in the county the longest (6.69) rate highest among length of residency groups, though 10-19 year residents are not far behind (6.66). Households without children at home produce a better score (6.77) than households with children (6.27).





Chapter 4 SUPPORT AND FUNDING FOR SPECIFIC TOURISM INITIATIVES

Survey respondents were asked about their support for six tourism initiatives: a whitewater rapids course on the Rock River, the addition of attractive gateways into the city of Rockford and other towns, maintain/improve facilities for amateur sports tournaments, downtown Rockford revitalization, connecting bike paths to rural and outlying areas of county, and promoting ecotourism. Questions were posed about these potential projects' importance to the community and respondents' support for more funding. Survey analysis is based on all paper returns and online respondents who reside in a Winnebago County zip code.

RANKING OF POTENTIAL TOURISM INITIATIVES

Based on mean score which is a summary measure of the agree-disagree continuum, three initiatives emerge as clear favorites for their importance to the community: ecotourism, maintaining facilities for amateur sports tournaments, and downtown Rockford revitalization. Close behind is connecting bike paths. Much lower are adding attractive gateways and building a whitewater rapids course on the Rock River (Table 4.1).

The three highest-scoring tourism projects received strong support from about half of all respondents, with additional agreement about their importance ranging from 30-40%.

Ecotourism and amateur sports facilities exhibit extremely low disagree/strongly disagree levels (no higher than 5.2%). Downtown Rockford revitalization reports the highest degree of strong support at 52.5%, though composite disagreement (disagree and strongly disagree) reaches 11.1% indicating somewhat more divergence of opinion on this initiative versus ecotourism and amateur sports facilities.

Placing fourth is connecting bike paths, rated favorably with eight in ten stating that they strongly agree (41.4%) or agree (39.5%), while 11.9% disagree or strongly disagree. At fifth place, though quite a bit lower is adding attractive gateways with 31.5%. Offering strong agreement while 39.4% agree and 20.7% disagree/strongly disagree. Receiving the least support among the six initiatives is building a whitewater rapids course. One in five (21.6%) respondents strongly agree but a larger proportion (28.2%) disagree/strongly disagree that this project is important.

SUPPORT FOR EACH PROJECT

Differences separate the perceived importance of the six projects depending on respondents' characteristics. Overall, females are more favorable than males, though not for amateur sports facilities and connecting bike paths where men show a slight edge. For all projects except ecotourism, online respondents show higher support than paper respondents, sometimes with a sizeable gap.

In this section, respondents' replies are presented as mean scores ranging from 1=strongly disagree to 4=strongly agree as well as composite agreement (strongly agree and agree combined) and disagreement (disagree and strongly disagree combined) proportions. While mean scores take out the "don't know" proportion in their computations, the detailed tables show the composite agreement and disagreement levels as well as "don't know" which has implications for targeting audiences about the specific initiatives.

Promoting Ecotourism (Tables 4.2 and 4.9)

Widespread support marks this project with 90.6% overall agreement that promoting ecotourism is important to the community. Based on mean scores, that support is quite consistent among groups. The youngest respondents ages 18-29 show the highest support, followed by Hispanics and residents who have lived in the county 10-19 years or under five years.

Lowest mean scores are reported by blacks (the only group with a composite agreement level below 80%), other race/ethnicity, 5-9 year residents, and respondents with no more than a high school education. Blacks are the only group to exhibit a double-digit level of "don't know" (10.8%).

Facilities for Amateur Sports Tournaments (Tables 4.3 and 4.10)

This project also received widespread support at a 90.5% overall agreement that maintaining and improving amateur sports facilities are important to the community. Hispanics, adults ages 30-39, and blacks especially feel this way as do households with children at home and persons with a graduate/professional degree. Lowest mean scores occur among persons of other race/ethnicity, high school education or less, residents living in the county under 10 years, and respondents whose employment is located outside the county.

Downtown Rockford Revitalization (Tables 4.4 and 4.11)

Overall survey respondents favor helping to revitalize downtown Rockford, with 84.2% agreeing that this is important. Age and education of respondents are strongly correlated with that sentiment. As age increases, support declines, while as educational attainment rises, support goes up.

By subgroup, downtown revitalization finds greatest support among ages 18-29 year olds, Hispanics, blacks, persons who have resided in the county for less than five years, and adults ages 30-39. Expressing the least support are respondents with a high school education or less, age 65+, persons not currently employed (per location of employment question), males, and respondents who received and returned paper surveys. This project has a wider range of support from high to low than ecotourism and amateur sports facilities.

Connecting Bike Paths to Other Areas in County (Tables 4.5 and 4.12)

Altogether, 80.9% of respondents agree that connecting bike paths to rural and outlying areas of the county is important. Higher agreement occurs among age groups under 50 than those 50 and older, while whites are more supportive than the other race/ethnic groups. Persons with a four-year college degree or more are more enthused than those with less education.

Using mean scores, connecting bike paths is desired most by persons with graduate/ professional degrees, have lived in the county for less than five years, are ages 30-39, responded online, and are from households with children at home. Lowest support for this project comes from persons of other race/ethnicity, having no more than a high school education or an associate/technical degree, age 65+, and are not currently employed.

Adding Attractive Gateways (Tables 4.6 and 4.13)

Seven in ten (70.9%) survey respondents agree that adding attractive gateways into the city of Rockford and other local towns is important. Curiously, a wide gap between online and paper respondents exists with far stronger support among online respondents. In addition, Hispanic and blacks are more supportive than whites as are ages 18-29 and 65+ compared to other age groups.

Building a Whitewater Rapids Course on Rock River (Tables 4.7 and 4.14)

Receiving the least support of all six projects, building a whitewater rapids course obtained just over half (56.8%) of respondents agreeing that this was a good idea. Based on mean scores, Hispanic respondents are the most supportive as are residents under 5 years, the only groups producing a rating exceeding 3.0 which equates to "agree." Near that level are persons living in the county 10-19 years, ages 40-49, and online survey respondents. Showing the least agreement about the worthiness of this project are other race/ethnic persons, 5-9 year residents, paper respondents, males, ages 65+, and those whose employment location is outside Winnebago County.

FUNDING FOR PROJECTS

After assessing projects' importance, survey respondents were asked which of them they would support for more funding. They could select multiple projects.

Downtown Rockford revitalization ranked first in terms of funding support, despite its thirdplace mean score ranking based on community importance. Six in ten (59.8%) respondents felt that the downtown revitalization efforts merited more funding. Ecotourism ranked second for more funding with 55.6% support. The next two, both close together, are amateur sports facilities (52.1%) and connecting bike paths (51.2%). Considerably lower is adding attractive gateways to Rockford and other local towns (39.7%). Support for funding the construction of a whitewater rapids course on the Rock River received little agreement, barely over one in four (28.9%) respondents.





Chapter 5 QUALITY OF LIFE

QUALITY OF LIFE MEASURES

New to the 2015 survey were four questions about quality of life in Rockford along with a question about what respondents' perception of safety is based on. The quality of life statements asked whether survey respondents agreed or disagreed with the following:

- "I am pleased with Rockford/Winnebago County as a place to live,"
- "Overall, I think Rockford/Winnebago County is headed in the right direction,"
- "Rockford/Winnebago County's appearance and physical upkeep should be a high community priority,"
- "I feel personally safe in Rockford."

The distribution of replies is shown on the table below. Survey analysis is based on all paper survey returns along with online respondents who said they resided in a Winnebago County zip code. In addition, the safety question compares respondents who live in the county with those who do not (online respondents who indicate zip code that is not located in Winnebago County).

PLACE TO LIVE AND DIRECTION (Tables 5.1, 5.2, 5.3, 5.6)

Most commonly, respondents are pleased with Rockford/Winnebago County as a place to live, with more than half (56.2%) agreeing and 16.5% more stating strong agreement (Table 5.1). Similar proportions characterize response to Rockford/Winnebago County being headed in the right direction (50.1% agree and 14.9% strongly agree). Disagree/strongly disagree levels just under one-quarter of respondents for both measures (24.1% place to live, 23.7% direction).

One in nine (11.3%) say they don't know whether Rockford/Winnebago County is headed in the right direction or not. Mean scores for these two measures fall just below 3.0, which equates to "agree" on the four-point scale.

For both statements, differences emerge by demographic group with online respondents more positive than paper, whites showing higher agreement than non-whites, and households without children at home more favorable than households with children. Looking at the top and bottom scoring groups, older and better educated respondents produce high mean scores, while persons of other race/ethnicity and 61104 residents show the lowest scores.

APPEARANCE AND PHYSICAL UPKEEP (Tables 5.1, 5.4, 5.5, 5.6)

Widespread agreement is evident for Rockford/Winnebago County's appearance and physical upkeep deserving high community priority. Almost two in three (63.4%) say they strongly agree and the mean of 3.58 also leans heavily toward "strongly agree." There is a much narrower spread between the highest and lowest scores for this statement than the previous two questions. Relationships appear to exist between the importance of appearance/physical upkeep and education or length of residence. Specifically, as education increases, so does agreement that the local area's appearance and physical upkeep should be priority and shorter term residents feel this is more important than those living here ten or more years.

Among all groups, the strongest supporters of appearance and upkeep are young respondents ages 18-29, 61102 households, and recent movers to the county. Residents of Pecatonica and Roscoe express lower agreement, though still high, as do persons of other race/ethnicity and lower educational attainment.

SAFETY (Tables 5.1, 5.5, 5.6)

Of the four questions, the feeling of personal safety received the lowest overall agreement and mean score. Only 4.8% strongly agree that they feel safe in Rockford and 39.3% agree. With a mean of 2.35, a higher level of disagreement is expressed than agreement. More online survey respondents feel safe than paper respondents, men feel safer than females, and persons with a four-year college degree or more feel safer than those with less education. Zip code of residence matters with respondents living in 61103, 61114, and Cherry Valley feeling a higher degree of personal safety in Rockford than residents of Winnebago, 61104, and Roscoe (Table 5.5).

For this question, an additional personal safety perception analysis was made of online respondents comparing those (n=557) who live in Winnebago County and outside (n=99). The mean score of county residents at 2.45 falls substantially below the score of outsiders at 2.77 meaning those inside the county feel less safe in Rockford than those living outside.

A second safety question asked upon what the respondents' perception of safety was <u>primarily</u> based, with three choices being personal experience, word of mouth, or media reports. Personal experience was mentioned the most frequently (57.8%) followed by media reports (36.4%), and far lower, word of mouth (5.8%). Those who selected media reports were asked whether the medium was social media or other factors. One in three (33.0%) indicated social media and 15.4% other factors, though more than half (51.6%) did not answer at all.

Chapter 6 COMMENTS ABOUT MAKING ROCKFORD AND WINNEBAGO COUNTY MORE WELCOMING TO VISITORS

As a final survey question, respondents were asked "What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?" Seeking respondents' opinions and ideas, response to this question offers observations, anecdotes about personal experiences, and suggestions to enhance life and tourism in the greater Rockford region. Numerous specific ideas are proposed, either drawing on past successes in the region or events held in other parts of the country. These verbatim comments are extremely valuable input for building tourism efforts and deserve careful reading. See Appendices D and E.

More than six in ten (62.9%) survey respondents responded to the final question, generating more than 2,000 remarks because most comments addressed several topics. Topics are tabulated separately.

Given the open-ended nature of the survey question, responses cover a wide range of areas, both positive and negative. In many cases, respondents wrote about the area's attributes and praised efforts, both current and past, to cultivate the strengths of the Rockford region. More often, however, respondents mentioned items that are working against the region's prosperity and tourism, not surprising because of the question's wording.

Receiving more than 200 mentions each are four areas:

- Activities/festivals/attractions/entertainment
- Better and cleaner roads/lighting/sidewalks/landscape
- Crime/violence
- City upkeep/neighborhoods/demolish buildings

ACTIVITIES, FESTIVALS, ATTRACTIONS, ENTERTAINMENT

More than 400 comments mentioned the addition of more to do in the Rockford area because in their view, current entertainment options are limited. To remedy this, they mentioned specific events that would draw visitors such as musical events, outdoor concerts, large-scale festivals, sporting events, arts-related activities, an aquarium, and casino. At least two dozen people regret the loss the "On the Waterfront," while others remarked on the popularity of existing attractions such as the RFD air show, Stroll on State, City Market, and Anderson Gardens. Activities for certain ages were suggested, especially adults 30-50 year olds due to the perceived shortage of options for this age group. Also important are events that are familyfriendly and affordable.

Rockford should try to dominate more in amateur sport tournaments because of the perceived economic impact of these events.

ROADS, LIGHTING, SIDEWALKS, LANDSCAPE

Infrastructure problems were on the minds of many respondents. The conditions of certain roads are horrible, some said (survey was administered in January which may explain some of the complaints). Potholes, dirt, litter, and faded lane markers characterize numerous local roadways. They leave a very poor impression on visitors and are hard on local residents too. Specific roads mentioned were Alpine, Rockton Avenue, Morgan Street, 11th Street/Sandy Hollow to Charles Street.

Sidewalks are sorely lacking in some parts of town, negating the "walkability" of these areas. Others were upset about the inadequate outdoor lighting. Put the street lights back on, said a couple of respondents, adding that better lighting deters crime. Better and more attractive signage should also be incorporated.

CRIME, VIOLENCE, SAFETY AND POLICE

Rockford's reputation for high crime is a major drawback to tourism efforts, respondents say, as well as eroding many local residents' feeling of personal safety. Until crime is curbed, many are reluctant to pursue or recommend activities in areas in which they do not feel safe, especially after dark. Several respondents who live in the county but outside the city say that they would not live in Rockford due to the frequency of crimes.

Some propose more police protection and a stronger police presence. If the comments for these topics (crime and violence, safety, police) were tallied together, this area would produce the greatest volume of comments.

CITY UPKEEP, NEIGHBORHOODS, ABANDONED BUILDINGS

Many voiced the sentiment that parts of the city are unkempt, dirty and dingy. Some entrances into the city are also uninviting. Abandoned, dilapidated homes and buildings are an eyesore and a danger; they should be demolished. Clean-up efforts need to be intensified. The abundance of litter is unsightly. Current beautification activities such as the flowering plants and hanging baskets that adorn streets in summer are widely appreciated.

DOWNTOWN ROCKFORD AND ROCK RIVER

Numerous aspects of downtown Rockford were addressed in the comments. Lack of ready access from the interstate or Route 20 bypass into downtown Rockford is an issue because travelers simply go around the city instead of stopping for food or entertainment. Parking was also mentioned repeatedly as a problem.

Most respondents who commented on revitalization are eager that such efforts continue. Improving the appearance of downtown, the addition of a decent hotel, more and better shopping options would help boost tourism. Safety is a concern of some who do not feel safe in downtown. Bicyclists want bike lanes and easier routes into the city by bike.

More than 50 comments were directed toward cultivating the use of the Rock River. This natural asset could be enhanced with riverfront attractions, cafes/restaurants, walkways, water taxis and other eco-friendly recreation options. Several mentioned the potential whitewater rafting course with a 50-50 split between those who favored and opposed it.

OTHER ISSUES

The limited train and air transportation in Rockford hampers tourism. Many advocated for train service between Chicago and Rockford. The airport is a big plus, and could be used for more passenger flights. Comments were made about improving schools, government policies, high property taxes, and the importance of a stronger economy with better jobs which will strengthen the region which in turn draws visitors. Respondents suggested specific restaurants and stores that they wish would come to Rockford.

Some remarks were directed toward heavier promotion of attractions we currently do have, including the parks, forest preserves, gardens, bike paths, sports centers, museums, theaters, and riverfront. More advertising could be incorporated into regional publications and on billboards located in Rockford and on the outskirts of Winnebago County. Even local people are not aware of some of the area's best features and attractions, according to respondents. They also propose more use of the Coronado, BMO Harris Center and Davis Park for quality music events.

POSTIVES

Numerous respondents commented that Rockford is headed in the right direction, even saying that Rockford has "turned the corner" on some ills that have plagued the area in recent years like the economy. Rockford has a lot of heart and soul, said one respondent. Keep moving forward urged several people. There is positive momentum going on right now and they want to build on that.

 - Advertising our strong points: parks, air show, RVC (aviation), Rock River, Sports Core I & II, ease of access, cost comparisons vs. larger cities, atmosphere (people).
 - Sidewalks, safety, getting rid of the bad wrap, family-friendly events, getting rid of abandoned buildings, street lights, and sidewalks.
 - Clean up abandoned buildings (no broken glass) and housing. Beautify vacant lots keep tended.
 - Less crime. Less empty and discarded buildings. Better streets.
 - Improve downtown, need hotels also.
 - Better traffic control. I hear many complaints from visitors about the number of people who run lights. Yellow lights are for those already in the intersection to complete their turn and those too close to stop. Hate when the light turns yellow and the car in the intersection turns left and the five cars behind goes as well, even after the light has turned red. Cleaning up the areas dilapidated housing and businesses. East State between Fairview and Alpine has so many signs it is distracting and hard to actually find the business you are looking for. We need directions to event venues to be more visible. They are small and lack directions. (Such as Sports Score II is the next right, etc.)
 - Downtown Rockford needs a number of businesses to make the downtown more welcoming. It is lacking a place to get a cup of coffee and a newspaper, before 8 am. I have been at Firestone at 7 am and walked from the Restoration Cafe to Stewart Square and nowhere could I find a cup of coffee or newspaper before 8 am. That is ridiculous for a city the size of Rockford. Also, the downtown needs a nice hotel. One that is clean, has reasonable rates, and is in a location that does not have vacant buildings. When I visit other cities, it is nice to have a fast food restaurant near the hotel, especially if you have children or young adults that just want a 'bite to eat' at odd hours. If no other businesses are going to be open in the late evening/early morning, I think a McDonalds would be a great addition.

I would like to see the RACVB promote some of the surrounding venues more. Severson Dells is a gem and the new area for children is wonderful. They should also promote the campgrounds in Winnebago County. I am on the western edge of the county and the Seward Forest Preserve is a beautiful park with campgrounds available. Also in Seward, we have a Doctors House Museum, owned by the Seward Historical Society, which is an interesting place to visit.

Finally, I would like to see more info provided about musical attractions. I know that there are many available, however, there is not much publicity for these. In our area, we get a weekly free publication which would be a great spot to publicize these events.

You may be sorry you picked our address to send your questionnaire to. YES! We would love to see a white rapids course on the Rock River which is just 2 blocks from our home and the same for revitalization of the downtown area along with beautiful gateways to our fair city. But, what will we gain by all this beautification if just a few blocks away we have rampant crime, gunshots almost daily, gangs, drugs, and prostitution galore, along with the falling down and ill kept homes.

Two years ago we took a chance and bought a beautiful home on the edge of downtown Rockford. We hesitated at first because of the way the surrounding area looked but we figured if this home had been rehabbed and it looked like there were more in the process, we would be okay down the line. We knew it would just take time. Now, I am not so sure. All the groups getting together for a better Rockford want to make improvements that will appeal to tourists. How many tourists do you think are going to come when they find out they could be the victim of a stray bullet or have their vehicle broken into or stolen while they are enjoying an outing on the river?

I would love to see the downtown businesses looking more inviting. In the 2 years we have been here, we have not patronized one of the businesses on State St. as they all look like dumps from the outside. I do hear from younger members of our family that once you get inside, they are fine. I just hate the thought of walking into one of them and then having to walk out. When we eat out or shop, we head to East State. When friends come in from

Chicago we entertain in our home, head to East State St. or as far as Huntley just to dine where we don't have to worry about walking on the street to our cars.

The previous owner of our current home spent over 120K rehabbing it and then taking perfect care of it. Next door is a home that was rehabbed on the inside but the owners never got around to the outside before they went into foreclosure. A family purchased it over a year ago and have not touched the hanging siding or the insulation that is exposed along with sections of the house that were never painted. The house across the street is owned by a slumlord and has been condemned. Last winter the water pipes burst, water was pouring out of the basement windows. The result was mold and mushrooms growing all over the interior while the renters lived there. If we get a heavy snow the roof will probably fall in due to the severe moisture that has weakened the ceilings and floors. Across from that house is a lot attached to the home where the weeds were so tall last summer that the view of traffic was hindered. I guess someone made the owner finally cut down the weeds which now have been sitting under blue tarps since then.

If there is going to be any beautification in Rockford, it needs to start with the people who live here. There has to be a way to force people to be responsible for their surroundings or develop groups who will help them. I realize a lot of the folks that live on the West Side don't have the funds, so instead of worrying about bringing tourists to town, let's worry about the people who live in the town. And, again, the bad element has to be forced to just go away. I know they will just take over some other area but at least they won't be Rockford's problem anymore.

It is very frustrating as we take care of our home as if it were next door to one of those estates out on Spring Creek Road. And, we are still hoping for a miracle that will make our neighborhood presentable to us and outsiders. We already have family who refuses to come to visit as they deem our home unsafe. Well, could be. We actually feel pretty safe here, maybe we are in denial. We are 3 generations living in the home. One has been robbed, one has been propositioned 50 ft. from the driveway, and 2 weeks ago the Police captured 3 teens hiding between our cars out back. They had stolen a car and crashed it into another car a block away and were on the run. So maybe we are going to have to finally face the reality that we are not as safe as we think we are and definitely not as safe as we want to be.

When the talk started about building a luxury hotel for tourists out of an old building downtown I thought someone had lost their marbles. Who the heck would spend money on a luxury destination in downtown Rockford. The Rockford Airport is the best thing Rockford has going for it. It is no hassle travel if you are going to a destination the airlines serve. It would be great for folks to travel to our area, but we have to give them something to come to and not just a nice hotel and sports venues. They need to not fear for their life when they get here or have a view of the poor and downtrodden who roam our streets or the thugs that also roam our streets. On the way in from the airport they need to see a well-maintained environment surrounding their final destination.

I am in my mid 70's and am sure I will never get to see the Rockford I am hoping for. Sincerely, A Rockford Resident

 - Bring back the downtown area. Improve the West State area and do more all the way to Meridian Road.
 - Original ideas for activities we seem to copy other cities a lot. Capitalize on what we have symphony, sports facilities, and fabulous parks and preserves.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Get rid of the "cheap" gambling places and go with a river boat or regular casino. Access to more restaurants/entertainment stops via bike paths. Create larger river walk area with restaurants/shops. Expand City Market days.
 - Utilizing Davis Park or other parks for quality live music for educated people (i.e., not country music). Utilize the BMO Harris Center for something other than redneck events. Develop outdoor shops like Madison's State Street downtown. City market is a good start.
 - Less crime. Billboards with things to do in Rockford.
 - I feel we really messed up by not continuing On the Waterfront. But since we have continue increasing outdoor venues as much as you can!
 - Getting the crime under control. Rockford has many great attractions but people I've talked to are worried about crime and safety.
 - Reducing gang related crimes and minimizing blighted areas.
 - Clean up crime, West Side. All that's wanting to be done with sports complex seems wonderful but as someone who has traveled to many cities for sports, where are they going to stay? Where to eat? You walk to these places of the time and I wouldn't walk in that area! At night?
 - Continue adding activities like City Market, the wake board park, snow board hill, and zip lines are also great. People need constructive things to do.
 - Better roads, lower taxes, less crime.
 - Too many minimum wage jobs under \$15 an hour need more decent livable wage paying jobs over \$25 an hour. Too much blight/poverty. Demolish all empty homes that have stood empty two years or more. Fix roads correctly, streets are a horrible mess. Keep giving contracts to Williams Charles, Ltd. = poor quality materials. Get rid of crime, prosecute criminals. The citizens of Rockford do not feel safe at all. Worst crime in the entire U.S.A. Most on welfare/handouts in a five-state area. Worst school system (RPS 205) in the entire state. And then there is mayor "more for me" Morrissey (all money in his pockets) forgivable family debts. And the worst Chief of Police Epperson "the attitude" in the city.
 - Reduce crime. Improve sidewalks on East State Street. Increase police presence everywhere.
 - Lower taxes, more jobs.
 - Easier access to downtown and better parking.
 - A visitor tourism information center on East State Street near the I-90 exit.
 - More recreational things for visitors to do while they are in town. Volcano Falls is a good example. More restaurants in areas of hotels.
 - Clean up vacant buildings, improve streets.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Better access to downtown area. More quality signage along I-90, I-39, and shopping/ hotels along these highways (including Bypass 20).
 - Rockford needs to turn the lights back on and lower crime. They need to support the local festivals like On the Waterfront and ethnic festivals. All were run out of the city. More support for RACVB, the police and fire departments. Less for TIFF Districts and commercial projects.
 - Parking, because I can't walk long distances. But not bad enough yet to have a handicap card. I can't go anywhere by myself, like going downtown on my own, etc.
 - Revitalize downtown! Send gang bangers/cons back to Chicago!
 - More variety on activities/entertainment for visitors and residents of Rockford as well. Lower crime and more positive things for young people to do in the area.
 - Clean it up! Landscape and the thugs!
 - Strong leadership with a reasonable vision to improve Rockford's image. With a willingness
 to compromise and work with all groups to that end. Something that is lacking on all points.
 Improve the infrastructure, schools, taxes that would draw people not only to visit but even
 move into Rockford. The tourist industry can be an important part of any city/area
 economy but tourism jobs do not support a local economy. Most jobs are part-time and
 low pay.
 - Jobs and things to do more plans, etc.
 - Just keep doing what you are doing. Very pleased to live here.
 - More family events and athletic events and lots of advertising.
 - A downtown area thriving with theater, restaurants, night life, art galleries, and parking.
 - Clean up crime.
 - Reduce crime. The residents of Rockford need to be more positive about their city. Media needs to focus on the good things. All we ever hear is about the bad things. That is what sticks in your mind. Example How many articles in the paper do I need to read about recent murders?
 - (1) Sidewalks connecting hotels and restaurants. (2) Public transportation (small vans) to various venues. (3) Fewer empty public buildings.
 - Focus on cleaning up the West side. Crime, vacant buildings, etc. It would be a major improvement.
 - Better roads. Ours are embarrassing!
 - Advertising, Rock Cut Park.
 - Make the city more inviting!
 - More festivals, like Stroll on State.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Improve physical upkeep and overall appearance, more sidewalks in areas where visitors traffic.
 - Improving streets too many rough roads.
 - More connections with others.
 - Need a casino, but not downtown.
 - I'm not sure, but I have enjoyed the downtown activities Stroll on State, Friday Market Day, etc.
 - Decent roads with construction completed well and within a restricted timeline that doesn't drag on forever ... frequently with little work being done.

Rock Valley's automotive program and truck driving certification are excellent adaptations for the community. If the Rock Valley development at the airport is handled properly, it too will be a vocational Godsend for the area.

We pick up travel info and keep filers for future reference when traveling. Not overly impressed with what we've found for the Rockford area. We travel a great deal and add much to local economies through our lodging and hotel tax, etc., meals out, gas, purchase tickets to events and purchase antiques for a sideline business.

The gaming parlors (5 machine deals) are also a determent to the looks of the community. I frequent several major casinos in different parts of the country and have difficulty believing what has been allowed to develop, especially in the "Parks."

- Better streets, fewer vacant buildings, visually appealing, more activities.
- Reduce littering/garbage around city, promote positive aspects of Rockford in the media.
- Coming from Wisconsin to Rockford crime is <u>unbelievable</u> afraid to walk down the street.
- Stop patting themselves on the back and get some real help. The Republican ethnocentrism of the leaders make it difficult to have a good vision or self-assessment.
- Have more flights out of the Rockford airport (i.e., New York, Los Angeles, and Denver) and then advertise on Chicago radio and TV about these flights. (Free parking convenience from western suburbs.) Attract businesses like Costco, Whole Foods, and Trader Joe's which will bring more people into Rockford from the surrounding areas.
- It's hard to build up your community when there are losers tearing it down. Get rid of all the crime and drug addicts.
- Clean up the West side of Rockford and NOT just the downtown area!
- Stop shootings, drugs, and gangs in Rockford.
- I have commented many times about the gateways into downtown and/or the I-Pass west and north. We have a limited access road system for the remainder of downtown. No stop light until exiting downtown, many cities this size have an easy access to downtown - better streets would help that.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - A more inviting vibrant downtown would be helpful, currently looks rather rundown.
 - Less crime.
 - Play to the strengths tournaments of all types. Dominate amateur sports huge impact for economy, tourism. A decorate gate waste of money, same with nature paths no economic impact/payback.
 - High demand events/performances in a revitalized downtown, hunting areas.
 - Offer things to do, and not just promote one side of town. Look and explore growing all areas of this town. Bring more jobs here. This use to be a town that offered some opportunities, but now it doesn't offer anything. It's very depressing here. I would not recommend anyone to live here. As soon as my child graduates, I'm leaving this town. Everyone else has already left.
 - Not so scary.
 - Keep improving all areas listed. Items #15-19 and somehow get a handle on crime; especially West side "hot spots."
 - More events in Rockford.
 - More visible (or advertised) unique local eateries and shops, otherwise, one city is the same as another!
 - A hotel/convention center downtown, with more events at the Metro Centre and Coronado theatre.
 - Less crime shootings.
 - Lower taxes make improvements stop wasting tax money.
 - Clean up the streets. Add more family-friendly activities.
 - Keep cleaning up Rockford. Keep tearing down rundown property and certain places where people gather and then get into trouble. Tear these places down. If you are a first time visitor, you could get the wrong impression.
 - Create a safe town. The homeless in the downtown district is a horrible sight to see. Bring in/create more theater shows but not at the Metro Center. The Coronado is a beautiful venue that needs to be used more.
 - Amtrak.
 - I think downtown needs to come to life again. More shops, places of interest. Safer areas to walk through the main streets. My father-in-law lived in Rockford in the late 1960s. He walked to work (an insurance firm). We need to bring it back!
 - Easier access to downtown attractions and restaurants. And improved downtown sidewalks, snow/ice removal, and parking.
 - Better leadership.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Make the area safer. Hate not being able to go places because you are not safe driving through town. I could never live in Rockford. I work there but we are safe in our little town.
 - Increase police patrol in Southwest Rockford and parts of Northwest Rockford.
 - A vibrant, thriving downtown and fewer empty factory buildings. I personally would spend more time in Rockford if RACVB and others promoting tourism cared less about sports and more about the arts. The sport tourists were horrible demanding people at least to the hotel staff people. So please find others to promote Rockford to!
 - Lower crime rate.
 - Curb crime, make safer better place to live and work and fix up area so better to come to, live in, work in, and want to be in!!
 - Make it a getaway place city people wanting to visit more country or small town with grand amenities.
 - Help transform Rockford. Develop positive enthusiasm and attitude for itself.
 - Cleanliness of city. Reconstruction of roads and bridges. Positive reports from media and social media.
 - Employment opportunities, education excellence, positive thinking environment.
 - Keep improving school system. Make safer.
 - Clean up the "bad" rundown side of Rockford. Need kid-friendly outdoor activities (teens).
 - Revitalize downtown (i.e., one-stop shop, dining, shopping, shows, seasonal events, movie theater, mall, train.) Stop developing the outskirts and give businesses incentives to go downtown.
 - Improve roads, fill in the potholes. Sidewalks along East State Street shopping corridor so they may walk from the hotels. Continue cleaning up and revitalizing downtown.
 - With respect to a gateway, refer to Beloit, WI. The smiley face on the water tower and welcoming website invite visitors. Developing the Rock River corridor including the Main Street space would be helpful to successful businesses already on the Main and Morgan area. The Main St. corridor needs to act as an artery allowing quick and easy access to downtown from the highway. The State St. route is too slow from the highway.
 - Promote and improve golf. More unique shopping.
 - Free downtown parking, river walk, craft shows (like they used to have at the Metro Center).
 - Kid-friendly environment package deals good hotel rates. Fliers listing activities and attractions.
 - Casino, shopping centers, downtown shops like years ago, less crime, no housing projects. Venita Harvey has it right!!!!

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - More things like RFD Air Show.
 - Better parking downtown, less abandoned buildings, lower crime rate. Rockford needs a better reputation, no one wants to come to the ninth worst city in the U.S.
 - Make parks accessible to archery hunters. It is done all over, why not here? Parks do and could generate so much more if you would utilize and market the acreage going to waste. Bike paths are awesome. Keep up the forward thinking "for all" processes.
 - More convenient parking downtown. More art events.
 - Eradicate gangs, drug dealers, and prostitution. Stop Rockford and Winnebago County from being another Chicago. Gangs, drugs, and politics.
 - Tourism is important to the economy, but Rockford is NOT a tourist destination by any stretch of the imagination. We have Jane, and the Rockford Museum Center, and Burpee Museum, but after a day of them you're done. We have quite a few small boutique museums, i.e., Tinker Cottage, Erlander House, and several others but nothing to really draw the masses.

The BMO Harris event Centre is only open with concerts sporadically. There should be 2-3 events there every week. Concerts draw people whether they are rock, country, classical doesn't matter. We have a beautiful facility and it stands empty.

The Strollon State was great. It drew thousands of people, and the city complained there were too many people and it was too crowded.

On the Waterfront died a slow death because the quality of music went downhill. No big names and the people quit coming. It used to be a great event. It could be again.

The City Market is another great event, but it is only a one night event. When it closes at 8:00 pm there should be something else going on to keep the people downtown. Perhaps a street dance or concert.

Reroute the traffic to Jefferson and Walnut so shoppers have room to visit the shops in the area. Have the Forest City Queen running for a river cruise. Have some carriage rides.

East State has the small eateries and a few shops. That is a good start. Expand on it. Cities like Omaha, NE and Chattanooga, TN have well-developed downtown areas. There is a very small town in Indiana, Nashville, in Brown Co. about 50 miles SW of Indianapolis that is a great example. Check it out. Dozens of small shops and eateries. People flock there by the thousands.

When it comes to restaurants, we have a handful of local restaurants but mostly we have the same-o-same-o restaurants as every other town in the country. Some grants or low interest funding to get more new locally owned restaurants possibly on the river, or a downtown marina similar to the one on Riverside in Loves Park by the bridge with an outdoor deck would be another possibility.

The whitewater course would be great. We have a beautiful river, use it. Kayaks, canoe races, sculling, raft races, and speed boat races are all possibilities. Oregon has a river

boat restaurant that is really nice and a river boat casino is another possibility.

We had a chance for a race track. NASCAR people spend millions of dollars a year. We blew that and it went to Joliet. Ask them how it has improved their economy.

There is always going to be someone who doesn't like what is going on. Don't let them hold you back. As for feeling safe, I feel safe. There will always be someone who wants to cause trouble, but a small police presence at these events would stop most trouble before it starts.

- On the Waterfront.
- More funding for public safety.
- Bring in more entertainment. Quit spending money on roundabouts. Bring in more things to do.
- Newer, cleaner buildings/streets. Less rundown areas and vacant buildings.
- Less crime.
- Get Rockford/Winnebago County off all the lists of "worse place" and ask local media to stop reporting this information!
- Fix Alpine Road!
- True reduction in the crime rate. Not the smoke and mirrors, feel good programs of Mayor Morrissey and Chief Epperson! Transparency in local government, too!
- Improve safety and overall appearance. Transform Rockford downtown hotels.
- Fix the roads. There's nothing to show off in Rockford. I plan on moving back to CA cause Rockford is screwed. I would never recommend someone visit.
- The appearance of the city overall not just making attractive places more attractive. The perceived crime in many neighborhoods. Solve the poverty of the economy, not just making the rich opportunities richer.
- Less crime. An efficient and non-confusing way to get to downtown from the interstate.
- Clean it up and promote the outdoors.
- Putting attractions and complexes outside of Rockford city limits.
- Boo Rockford! I am a Chicago transplant. Rockford needs to embrace businesses from the Chicago area. For instance, the horrible way Beef-a-Roo owners have blocked Portillo's for the past ten years.
- Clean up the West side of Rockford.
- A significant reduction in all crime; an increase in high-income, well-educated professions living in Winnebago County; and an overall positive emphasis on quality of life in Rockford and Winnebago County.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Try to fill empty buildings. Repair streets.
 - Fix roads and reduce crime to lower fear and perception of Rockford as unsafe and lacking entertainment.
 - Less crime.
 - Lower crime rate! Waterfront type festivals. Casinos. Improve mental health care in the county too many mentally ill on the streets that shouldn't be. Improve the first impression of Rockford when arriving from the West (Business 20).

 - Less crime.
 - I think there have been too many negative reports and lists that Rockford has been included in. Bringing down the crime rate and making the community safer for everyone should be the first priority.
 - More jobs and employment of minorities, increasing minimum wage, crime control, etc. (oh, freedom and justice for all!)
 - Less crime.
 - Stop the crime.
 - Less crime and urban blight. More beautification project love the flower baskets and planters.
 - Many streets need repainting of lanes this would brighten our look, and make it easier for folks to safely find their way.
 - High employment = happy population = money to spend = better for business. Roads kept up some landscaping on main roads.
 - Use some of the substantial tax dollars RACVB receives to improve facilities that will generate traffic to Rockford area.

 - Lack of sidewalks and crossing on State Street is a disgrace. Video slots are out of control. Also paycheck lenders. Streets need to be swept.
 - Do the same things Machesney Park is doing. There must be attention and focus by Rockford to I-90 if there is to be any hope of attracting people to downtown Rockford.
 - Removal of abandoned buildings at all gateways of city and main thoroughfares, better streets and roads, lower crime rate, and promotion of attractions and activities open to the public. I think a major hindrance for Rockford is the terrible rating of Rockford in nationwide lists (crime).
 - Less crime and lower taxes.
 - Improving the West side of town less crime, more police presence, and more hotel establishments.

There is really nothing of interest downtown since it seems that the only venue is Ice Hogs games. I don't care for sporting events, certainly not a small time affiliation like the Ice Hogs, and would like to see concerts and other entertainment back at the BMO Center for which it was originally designed. I would like the names to be headliners, well recognized and not just country musicians, which it seems, have been the majority of the artists. I think it was a mistake for "On the Waterfront" to stop, since it did bring in tourists from other cities. I don't know if it was mismanaged or what exactly was the issue for it to end, but I do know that a lot of the names that were brought in were either outdated or unknown to the general public. The prices for food and drink were too high, plus the cost or admission was too high, especially when you can drive to Milwaukee and go to a wonderful festival (every year) with non-stop music and food, and the cost to enter is below what Rockford charged. They were intelligent enough to have festival grounds planned and executed, with the same vendors year after year. You knew what you could get in the way of food, and consequently look forward to it. I think it would have been advantageous for Rockford to have done the same thing, actually have a festival grounds planned and have the area concreted so that if the weather were inclement guests did not have to be concerned with getting muddy from

walking on grass. It was too spread out; it should have been more localized to a specific area, so that you didn't have to walk so very far from parking to program. Rockford should look to Milwaukee as an example and to Wisconsin in general. The festival grounds are not just used for a one-time event, but are utilized for several festivals throughout the year, i.e., German Fest, Italian Fest, and Greek Fest, etc. The summer is definitely long enough to provide more than one event each year. Also, look to the Wisconsin Dells for inspiration. If there are more water parks, and entertainment and lodging centrally located to the events, with parking, I believe it would bring much needed tourist dollars to this area. This area (Rockford) has been the same ho-hum area for as long as I can remember, and has always made too much out of the parks and bike paths, etc. All of which are okay if you have small kids and want to enjoy nature for a while, but how much nature does one person need, and for how long? Once you've seen one tree and a lake your pretty much done with that. There is nothing to do at a lake (other than picnic, hike, and camp which the geese have made difficult because of the feces, not to mention the tics). If you can't launch a motorboat, that takes Pierce Lake off the table. There should be great entertainment for single adults, of all ages. There should be a variety of musical events, to interest groups of all ages. An area that is built up with several bars and restaurants should all be in walking distance to one another. There isn't an opportunity to go anywhere in this city without driving, the public transportation is just not efficient or readily available enough. It doesn't run all night, limited hours. Public buses should be running every 15 minutes, no longer, and waiting areas should be clean, safe, and well lit - with someplace to sit that is protected from the elements. There are no taxis readily available. You have to call ahead and they may or may not show up, or show up late and their prices are too high. It seems like the city planners have done a poor job for many, many years and it is time to get young fresh minds with vision planning this city. Once again, the planners really need to look to Milwaukee for ideas. I go every year to Milwaukee Fest, and would always bypass On the Waterfront. Better entertainment, better food, and less expensive. Cleaner, concreted, and I knew just what to expect, and I look forward to it again this summer. These are just my opinions, and I thank you for your time and attention.

Note: First thing I noticed in that survey was once again, trying to be nature oriented. Nothing referencing real entertainment. The whitewater rafting is pretty farfetched. That river looks dirty, doesn't have a safe current flow and is a lawsuit waiting to happen. There has to be some adjustment to the thinking if they're leaning to that!

- Terrible reputation West side needs to be cleaned up and crime needs to come down. I wouldn't come to Rockford if not being born and raised here. ☺
- Rockford feels like the dumping ground for criminally inclined persons, much like ungoverned border control of people moving or trying to gain access to a community or country not their own. Unregulated character types allowed.
- Better roads, fewer "cash and go" stores, more businesses (food) downtown, sidewalks on State Street/main roads, clean roads, and tear down abandoned buildings/houses.
- Lower crime, better news highlighted about region.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Many rundown houses and areas put off friends and family from Northwest Chicago Suburbs. I mostly feel safe in Rockford but not as safe as 20 years ago. Also, some areas I would not be alone in at times.
 - Improving our schools. Having places for teens to go instead of hanging out on the streets. Lights should of never been taken down. Ridiculous. Also, do not change 9th Street and 6th Street. Too much waste of money. For visitors - better directional signs.
 - Less crime and lower taxes.
 - More attractions for the 30-45 year old demographic.
 - Revitalization of rundown areas in Rockford, lower crime rate, need sidewalks, more bike paths, beautification efforts for main thorough fares. The Nicholas Conservatory is way too expensive! It's a shame that we cannot bring visitors there without considering the high cost!!
 - Repair and replace the streets of Rockford and clean up and fix up the decaying and blighted neighborhoods.

 - More parking downtown, especially for events at the Metro Centre. Demolish unused buildings and factories.
 - Amtrak service more than once a day similar to Harvard for small towns and Chicago to travel to area and to go to outlet malls and other places of interest. Easier, better, and more access.
 - Get rid of the blight and violent crime.
 - Thriving economy (jobs) and better schools in Rockford. Happy residents.
 - Perhaps something for senior citizens that's fun!
 - Clean up the city. Tear down junk houses. Get rid of non-running cars. Make the streets safe. Get rid of the punks that run the city and the bad cops.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - More outdoor recreation!
 - More parking downtown, fewer vacant buildings, free/low-fee activities to enjoy year-round.
 - More attractions at the BMO Centre. Weekend events in the summer ex like Beattie Is Festival.
 - Improve street and road signs making it easier to get around. So many streets are missing name signs, stop signs not marked "Cross traffic does not stop." And we must have 100 streets that changed their names multiple times.
 - Place more emphasis on outlying villages. Rockford isn't the "be all to end all" of Winnebago County.
 - Less crime.
 - Drive Highway 20 East daily. Smells like poop two or three miles east or west of the river. I'm not in favor of giving one more red cent for an already way too expensive place to live!
 - I am not one to ask this question, as I am 65 years old and my focus is more on survival than attractions or entertainment. I think it is best to ask age groups between 25 and 50 years old.
 - Considerable reduction of drugs and its culture. Rockford has become known as a melting pot for drug dealers (heroine) and the main reason we will likely be moving away. We love our home but it is becoming intolerable.
 - Upgrade the West side of town before it is too late.
 - Downtown cannot be revitalized without good (within walking distance) hotels. Hotels will not be built without more draws downtown. Vicious circle.
 - Pave roads, clean up the town, stop the crime rate, lower property tax rate, get rid of empty buildings.
 - Good news stop the negative and print more positive news.
 - Lower crime rate, more officers, more good paying jobs.
 - Safety, getting rid of the condemned buildings in town.
 - First general aesthetics of the city show pride, care about the city. Downtown and riverfront development is a must.
 - Good restaurants and shops.
 - Clean up downtown and demolish homes and old businesses that have been empty for years.
 - Less crime, more parking.
 - Appearance, safety, more festivals, outdoor attractions.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - I am relating two personal experiences which I am labeling as two hidden taxes to live within Rockford's city limits population and surrounding area shoppers, etc.

The first hidden tax costs are for premature and costly vehicle suspension repairs and replacement costs due to the poor condition of most of the city streets and avenues.

Since 2006 I have spent nearly \$4,000 on such vehicle suspension repairs. I absolutely hate driving on Rockford streets and avenues, so can you imagine the shock and poor impression made upon tourists who have come here?

The second hidden tax costs are associated with Rockford's old city water infrastructure. That infrastructure is generally described as having approximately 155,000 citizens. I can understand why the city put the \$1.8M water filtration plant online to comply with EPA requirements to treat that putrid water, but in my opinion, it was an emergency stopgap to get into compliance, not the wiser course of action which should have been planned for and developed in the past several decades. The deteriorating quality of the Rock River watershed led me to experiment and take action.

A hidden tax cost of just under \$600, plus upkeep by installing a practical, self-cleaning Whirlpool Whole House Water Filtration System to remove salt particulate and chlorine.

I placed it after my water softener, and adding a valve from that output to a 5 stage reverse osmosis system to remove worse including fluoride and remaining chlorine to give me kitchen drinking/cooking water quality. My TDS readings before the R.O. are 248ppm, and after the R.O. are 4-6ppm (parts per million) soluble solids. Water at ppm is very drinkable water. Are tourists/shoppers served that quality of water?

The City of Rockford has an online Water Department video claiming a high quality test of local water? In my opinion, that water cited is from their best new well, probably at about 80% quality. Also in my opinion, the 5% get the 80% quality water and the 95% population gets the 20-30% quality watershed water. Additionally, in my opinion, the City of Rockford watersheds quality as related by the EPA is an average of several watershed sources of municipal water.

Search online best places.net, enter Rockford, IL, and navigate to health for the ratings on air and water. Do you know what that 53% watershed quality means? It is my learned opinion that the actual % quality is much lower for the Old City water infrastructure for the 155,000. It tells me that the 53% is an average of the impaired Rock River watershed and the more healthy well sources in other locations in the City of Rockford. How else would a potential resident, visitor, tourism/shopper, viewing the city water quality video claimed water purity? If I were a potential tourist visiting Rockford, I would look up the foregoing facts and conclude that something smells in the City of Rockford, IL.

The City of Rockford needs quality, improved streets/avenues, and new watershed sources to close down the impaired Rock River source. That is precisely what should be done to get positive tourism/shopper feedback. How is that for tourism appeal?

How do I know that the Rock River is my watershed source for my water? I searched online at EPA.gov and navigated to My Water, where I entered my street address, and up popped my residential source as the "impaired Rock River."

How convinced am I? Besides for myself, my home improvement of added water filtration system is an added selling point for a potential buyer. Imagine the City of Rockford making a tourism drawing card of advertising quality water during their visit, without any added jolts while driving on streets/avenues.

Conclusions - Rockford has been going in the wrong direction. I have been going in the correct direction. I was shocked to see where this survey is focused. The City or Rockford should be focused on keeping citizens here, a focus which would then naturally attract family visitors, tourism, and shoppers.

Whoever, in the governance of the City of Rockford, over the past 3 decades had decided to forgo sound and vital economic development and financial reserves to weather the reality of repetitive recessions, have miserably failed this community.

The only sound notion in this survey is to maintain and improve facilities for amateur sports tournaments because Iknow that naturally draws outside visitors.

A whitewater rapids course on the impaired and foul Rock River? Are you kidding? Every time I see anyone fishing it or sporting in it, I cringe. Can you imagine the impressions on new visitors or tourists experiencing the impaired Rock River by drinking it, showering in it, or sporting in it? In my opinion, it is a fishy and dead issue.

To summarize: Do you want to know what Itell any relative who plans to visit me in Rockford?

- 1. If you plan on parking your RV in my driveway, you can have access to my electrical power, but I do not recommend that you tap into my outside water faucet because the water is putrid, has more chlorine than a public swimming pool, and smells of rotten egg gas.
- 2. Don't plan on anything on or in the Rock River.
- 3. Don't plan on driving all over town because you will destroy your vehicle suspension, and if you are very unlucky, hit a fully open and exposed deep pothole. If not a pothole, an innocuous series of high ridge seam repairs that will rattle your vehicle or a series of open seams, and be careful to pay attention to another driver ahead of you suddenly slowing down when encountering the same.
- 4. If it is shopping you are looking for, save yourself the grief and shop online and let UPS destroy their vehicle suspensions.
- 5. If you happen to be driving on a street or avenue getting a cheap resurfacing, be alarmed about any high V.O.C. asphalt being used in the resurfacing, simply because cheap smells bad. Just do not breathe it and get off of that street or avenue ASAP.
- 6. If you go to a restaurant, first ask if the R.O. filter the water used in cooking or for drinking.
- 7. If you go to a motel or hotel, first ask the same, and in addition if the motel water has been filtered to remove any excessive city water chlorine. Ask what the ppm reading is on their water.
- 8. If anything I have warned you about is alarming, find another city rated better than Rockford, and I will visit with you there.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Improve roads, clean up spaces, de-clutter signs especially for closed businesses.
 - Better zoning and higher-end shopping similar to St. Charles.
 - Better jobs to support improvements.
 - More activities within the community, fewer abandoned buildings.
 - Stronger laws against punk gangs to make visitors feel welcome. More independent restaurants.
 - Bring more stores to Rockford. We are headed in the right direction with new restaurants and stores. We would love a nice department store like Nordstrom.
 - Increase support for the public schools would be a great place to start.
 - Metro Policing, zoning setbacks, change perception of poverty, blight, crime.
 - Eliminate many of the video gaming slot places there are so many in everything but bars it is making Rockford look cheap and tacky, dingy and dangerous. Develop the Rock River Waterfront like San Antonio, Texas big draw and attractive, fun and interesting. We could use the waterfront so much more. Be creative.
 - Less crime and blighted areas, distinctive attractions, improve access from highways.
 - More positive press about what Rockford offers visitors and residents.
 - Start having more events that are diverse in ethnicity, for everyone. And make the appearance of our city and county more attractive and welcoming to visitors. We need to utilize social media to promote and advertise all the great attractions that we already have open to visitors in our city.
 - The City of Rockford needs a stronger police presence. I don't feel safe in Rockford at night. If that were to change, I think more people would visit.
 - Better street upkeep! (Remarks from out of town visitors!) Fix the streets! Better looking gateway/welcome.
 - Better roads! All visitors comment on how bad they are!
 - Less crime.
 - Better roads, less crime, and keeping all highways and rural streets clean of debris.
 - Control the crime rate! Everything else is right on track. Would like to see a river boat.
 - Better upkeep of roads and properties.
 - Clean and fix up the city to make it more presentable, which includes roads. Potholes, littering, abandoned homes, buildings and warehouses that take away a lot of property value from Rockford. All the abandoned homes, buildings, and warehouses should be reversed to better the value of Rockford's economy. More recreational things to do for children and young adults.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Dramatically, lower crime rate downtown and West side of Rockford. Improve facades on State Street corridor. Improve attractions, attract large chain restaurants (i.e., White Castle, Dunkin Donuts, Home Run Inn Pizza, Jewel Food Stores). Renovate or tear down abandoned buildings to accommodate above (i.e., Sears, CVS, Menards, etc.).
 - Positive media!
 - Reduce crime and corruption.
 - On the Waterfront, 4th of July fireworks, more big events/festivals.
 - Safety in the community and things to see and do.
 - Overall Rockford is not horrible. There are just so many areas that need fixing or help, that it seems overwhelming and impossible without funds. An easy access from I-90 to downtown, there are so many lights and it takes time, presently. Until the area west of downtown is cleaned up, and far more safe, people will not visit there. Even where the possible rail service is, that's a shady area. Get more events with free admission. Charging for every little venue is crazy. Repair the streets too. Main roads are in bad shape (areas of Alpine, Whiteman, Rockton Ave.).
 - Safety and well-being to live, better education system.
 - More home owners vs. less people dependent on the tax paying citizens.
 - A better website showcasing features and local attractions. Basically, a things-to-do in the area.
 - More confidence in personal safety, reduce crime. More sidewalks on East State Street, especially on hotel row. Better maintenance of streets, too many rough roads in and around the city.
 - Reduction in crime and low-income housing.
 - Clean up the West side and make it more presentable. Have the West siders include the East siders in their activities and projects as we do them.
 - More events.
 - Better/new roads. Have more through roads and streets.
 - It's hard to get too enthused about Rockford when no one does anything to promote or improve much of anything for this small western Winnebago County communities!
 - A new mayor, a different chief of police, and a real city council with a backbone.
 - Overhaul downtown.
 - Reduction in crime.
 - Some areas look very rundown. Kind of "dirty." I really like the "Transform Rockford." I believe it helps.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Bike paths, green space, and remodel or removal of abandoned buildings and houses.
 - Better crime control, more businesses, clean up Rockford looks rundown and dirty in many areas.
 - Know they are safe at malls, and downtown; media focus on good things as much as bad, promoting the areas that many youth are involved with.
 - Things to do for young adults besides bars, food, and movies.
 - Lower crime rate!
 - Please keep updating Rockford like you have been. Please continue to have developmental and educational programs for young teenagers so they avoid gangs. Encourage churches, schools, and families to watch out for each other. By all working together, the area will continue to be safe for all and bring more people into the area.
 - Improve roads. More attractions, i.e., whitewater rafting.
 - Decrease crime rates, improve the schools.
 - Bring in attractive businesses; clean up Rockford (roads and buildings), casino, airport expansion (more flights).
 - More promotion of all we have to offer. The videos were fabulous!
 - Promotion of festivals. Festivals every week/spring/summer/fall.
 - Reduction of crime, more aggressive prosecutions.
 - More events to attract tourism. Advertise what we have (parks, river, attractions). Advertise packages (hotel, car, tickets to things).
 - Make it a more diverse area.
 - Lower crime rate, revitalizing downtown events such as Screw City Festival and Stroll on State, promoting State Park.
 - More parking downtown. Utilize the river draw people downtown, i.e., river walks in Oklahoma, Texas, Cleveland, OH.
 - Straighten out North Main Street through Harlem Blvd./John St. make it a two-way street into downtown. Support the hotel downtown. Straighten out, simplify the streets. Make Chestnut/First a two-way to connect Sports Center to hotel.
 - Less gambling promotion, promote faith board, multicultural. Prosecution of police misconduct in Winnebago County. Promotion of gender equality and safety. Promotion of faith-based sites of interest to visit. Create super hospital, like John Hopkins.
 - Safe, contiguous, walkable downtown restaurant nightlife entertainment district.
 - Amtrak train!!
 - A vital, developed waterfront.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - The many people I know from outlying communities hate our confusing one-way street system. They refuse to come visit for that very reason. Ben Franklin on advice: A wise man won't need it, a fool won't heed it.
 - Appearance/condition of properties is important because first impression coming into city. Abandoned properties need to be dealt with.
 - More parking I haven't been to Rockford in three years. I got a parking ticket at the unemployment office in a one-hour parking space after 13 minutes. I won't be back.
 - Would be nice if you saw Rockford police once in a while. We go into Rockford at least once a week and never see a patrol car we visit all sides of Rockford.
 - Change of perception for safety in the city.
 - Better communication.
 - Less crime, bring back Fazoli's restaurant.
 - Revitalize the Rock River front. Make the river front more family-friendly and attractive by building more paths, jogging trails, and entertainment along the river. Improve safety along riverside and West side.
 - Have more things to draw them here.
 - Start with positive attitudes!
 - Water taxis on the Rock River (parking up/in Machesney Park/Loves Park), bicycle tours, horse drawn carriages, street food vendors along river path. We have a natural attraction that is not being utilized to its maximum potential. Street repairs that hold up more than a year no more band aids!
 - Law enforcement discourage gang activity.
 - More events.
 - Reduce crime and violence.
 - Lower crime.
 - Need to get the crime under control, then improve our roads.
 - Same as Beloit, continue to publicize the positives that are happening!
 - A better overall appearance; fewer vacant commercial buildings and fewer abandoned houses.
 - Having a safer city and county. Fixing our roads (North Alpine Road). Tearing down old buildings. Filling empty buildings, especially on Riverside Road when you get off toll on Riverside. There are so many empty buildings.
 - Better signage and road directions to Discovery, museums, Metro Centre where is our Visitor's Center or Centers located?

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - The park district is wonderful in this area. More media promotion of events, RCCA, Rockford College, Metro Centre, etc. Connect bike paths - Perryville with Caledonia for one. Develop hotels at Riverside exchange and more large chain restaurants on 173. Rockford has great music venues in the summer - really a lot of free or very reasonable cost entertainment.
 - Hearing about excellent: schools, visitor experiences (hotels, restaurants, entertainment), Rock River and Rock Cut activities, and safety.
 - A welcoming downtown would be nice. I'd love to walk and shop and eat downtown on a regular basis.
 - There's a lot that this city needs as far as top notch entertainment and various other things. Lots of people go to Chicago or further away for that and shopping.
 - More jobs/more entertainment.
 - Less box stores, more town planning which probably is too late. It appears there was no thought given to any town planning.
 - Smooth streets and roads!! Neat, clean streets, sidewalks, and parking lots. Less crime.
 - Possibly better hotels. A hotel downtown. For concert goers and restaurants would be helpful. We need an overpass at State Street and Bell School Road for safety for travelers getting off at bus station. Mandatory! Keep up the good work!
 - Get professional jobs, not service jobs. Property taxes higher than Chicago. Young professional people not staying in Rockford, no international entertainment, no train station, higher drop out college rates.
 - Keep doing what you are doing headed in the right direction. Need more police patrols, less crime. Get rid of that darn roundabout.
 - More major concerts (like Carrie Underwood, Celine Dion, Rascal Flats) and rodeos. A major baseball team playing here, hiking, horseback riding, and other excursions that are led by a park person. Special events at campgrounds. Even a county fair right out by the airport.
 - Get rid of all that free Section 8 housing and the community may become safe again.
 - Continue parkway developments along river. Improve reputation regarding crime, government corruption. Continue urban cleanup West State Street home demolitions was a good move toward eliminating blight image. Conversion to green space was good. Lower taxes to encourage new business and residential property. Improve the activity and options at the airport.
 - I have noticed in different travel magazines that Rockford doesn't seem to advertise as much as some smaller cities.
 - Safety while visiting. Many people in surrounding towns are afraid to visit Rockford because of the level of crime. Taxes are high all the way around. Sales tax and property are higher

 - Visible commitment to fighting poverty, support for creation of a visible, vibrant LGBT community, visible continuing commitment to a promoting diversity of all types.
 - More family-oriented cultural events.
 - Destination restaurants, nice shops, beautification, flower baskets everywhere.
 - Upkeep of West side. Demolish all property ASAP; faster that's not feasible to repair, remodel.
 - Get rid of crime.
 - Continue working on present goals to improve area.
 - Remove the drugs and thugs! It is sad what has become of Rockford. This city is a dump. If the working middle class could afford to move they would.
 - Eliminate unemployment and crime labeling.
 - You're well on your way. My family enjoyed the four-day stay! 😊
 - Downtown Rockford as it was in the 1960s 1970s before "symbol" killed downtown.
 - Elimination of crime and safety in downtown areas. Promote entertainment and the arts, especially local, more use of BMO Center for contemporary entertainment.
 - More attractions, need people to work instead of sucking the government's funding, less violence.
 - Cleaning up the city and making it more enjoyable to see.
 - More sports venues, entertainment easy access.
 - Improve the appearance of Rockford. We build and add landscaping then don't take care of it. Harrison Avenue for example.

Focus on Southeast side, around 11th Street area, used to be nice but now too much blight, and dirty looking. Too many vacant houses/buildings, too much crime. I believe due to the RHA destroying building. Now they move into nice areas and bring drug dealing, gangs, shady people in our once nice areas.
 - Rockford needs a book fair!
 - We cannot compete with Chicago and Milwaukee for music venues and major league sports, so stop trying. Concentrate on quality of life for young families, schools, youth sports, etc.
 - Safety. Commute to downtown, downtown development, 24-hour public transportation, balance East side to West side. Not much open downtown after 5 pm.
 - Better cultural, diversity and better education.
 - I would not support any of the unmarked questions if property taxes would be used.
 - Less crime. Don't let repeat offenders out of jail without monitoring them. It's sad that people are afraid to go out anywhere in Rockford not knowing what might happen.
 - Exciting shows and expos.
 - Get to the root of the crime epidemic in Rockford. More mentoring, training, education for families in poverty instead of handouts.
 - Pretty good job being done now. Always emphasize the positives and what is being considered.
 - A population that has an income sufficient to maintain their properties. Crime can be reduced by creating jobs for descendants of the factory workers lured here by "The Captains Industry" and forgotten when they sold and closed their factories.
 - Costco/Trader Joe's/more West side development.
 - Clean up and attractions.
 - A better economy.
 - Reduce crime, rail connection service.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - We do feel safe going to RSO at Coronado. The area is very well lit and there is a large police presence. A lower crime rate! There are many wonderful tourist attractions in Winnebago County but some of them are in unsafe areas (Metro Centre). I was in an Aldi's (North Second and Riverside) when three young people (late teens) punks came in and were obnoxious throwing food, yelling, pushing carts around scary! Cashier told us they come in a lot. They were two Caucasians and an African American.
 - The murder statistics are ridiculous. We need to improve our safety. Make Rockford more welcoming and not so racial.
 - More tourist attractions.

The bad rental element around Mulford and State have caused crime in the shopping district to grow and it must be stopped. We have great theaters and other venues, let's promote those more. Spending mass dollars downtown right now just won't work. Spend the resources to build from outlying Winn/RFD areas back into downtown. It may take 10-20 years but with jobs anything is possible. Lastly, the Rockford Airport, yes the Rockford Airport not Chicagoland Regional is huge. I'd update/repair the Bypass 20 exits at 11th St. and Rt. 2 so people traveling see clean safe areas, word of mouth about parking, ease and airfare rates will do the rest. Thank you for all the effort.
- I am retired and an amateur photographer. Members of my camera club and myself probably make the drive to Rockford about 3 to 5 times a year for photo opportunities. I have already planned three trips for the club in 2015.
- Better signs on the Interstate!!!!!!!!!! Like which exits to use for what services.
- More parking and better access to downtown.
- Make Rockford more like an extension of the suburbs. Connect with Marengo, Elgin, Crystal Lake, etc., consolidate space and leave the ghetto out of the nice part of Rockford. The only reason I live here is because of my spouse's work. The only positive I would have to say is there are plenty of restaurant options, the cost of living is cheap, and the part of town I live in is pretty safe.
- Crime rate reduced; sidewalks on far E. State for safety; better nighttime lighting on streets; put the street lights back in; people in jail doing work for us rather than having rights. They could clean up areas like the former chain gangs which I have seen in the 2000's in NC.

- Have things to do that are free or low cost.
- A better landscape when entering the city. Less cost for hotel rooms. Better roads and a regional train. Updating Sportscore.
- Make it a safer place with less crime.
- If Rockford Citizens would be more positive in talking about how great it is to live in this area that has so much to offer all age groups. And if all businesses would have employees that are positive to customers and sell how great an area they live and work in! We need to be the Face of Rockford. People sell to people! If you like where you are, it is easy to sell that feeling to people coming here. Rockford has reinvented itself over and over. I think that is pretty exciting. I think it's awesome to think of what will be coming next. The sky is always

the limit and the dreams are opening doors all over town!

- Improved access to downtown attractions.
- Is a beautiful place.
- Improve downtown area and make it safer.
- It needs to be more safe, first of all. People aren't going to come visit (or move here) with the headlines that we've been getting. Downtown has a great start for things to do, but there is no place for people to stay down there. And family/friends that have stayed out by I-90 complain that there are no sidewalks to safely get to places to eat over there. It's disjointed. The sports complex downtown will be wonderful and hopefully bring a hotel and tourism business to downtown as well. After seeing the plans for the building, I'm surprised and disappointed that there aren't windows so that you can see the beauty of the river from inside. If we spend the money to renovate a huge building that takes up precious waterfront space, yet we still aren't going to be able to enjoy the waterfront from it, post-renovation, is that the best possible use of the space? Though tourists will use the space on some weekends of the year, why not put a sports-themed restaurant and deck (aka brewhouse) on the river side so that the citizens that live here 365 days a year can enjoy and use the space the rest of the time?  - Lower crime!
 - When we advertise diversity of our community.
 - More family-friendly events, not just appealing to singles. 1. Carousel downtown.
 2. Paddle boat area on river. 3. Downtown college campus. 4. More convenient parking.
 5. Police on foot or bikes.
 - I lived in Rockford for years, and as a kid in South Beloit trips to the "big city" to the south were fun. Now the business I own is in DuPage County. Many cities have drawn new life to downtown by going for "quaint." Look at Hinsdale, Sycamore, or Elmhurst. They've made city center a destination. The river is beautiful and anything to make it a destination is great. It has to be unique and something no one else can offer.

- River District transportation on the water and on the shore and a trip ticket/passport for downtown attractions.

The commercial development stands out and makes a difference! Developers will still come, maybe even in higher demand. The costs will be passed onto the tenants. But, attractive high end commercial development will bring more traffic to all stores and bring the image of Rockford up a notch! The housing development needs the same improvements too! QUIT LETTING THE DEVELOPERS BUILD CHEAP, UNATTRACTIVE, UNIMAGINATIVE BUILDINGS AND STRIP CENTERS THAT LAST FOR YEARS AS EYE SORES IN ROCKFORD, WHILE THE DEVELOPERS ARE DEPOSITING THEIR MONEY ELSEWHERE IN THE COUNTRY OR EVEN IN OTHER COUNTRIES!  - Far more sidewalks on major thoroughfares such as Alpine and Riverside so people can walk/bike more easily, encouraging better health and easier access. Better, pothole-free smooth roads. An outlet mall.
 - Public transit from Chicago to Rockford; enhance and fully utilize the maxing bicycle trails, Rock River, and hiking.
 - I have heard of the great ideas of building a great hotel in downtown and a sport convention center around the most unsafe area of Rockford. I think if we want to attract visitors to the Rockford/Winnebago area we want to make sure that they feel safe. I live outside of Rockford, but I have spent my last 20 years working in the Rockford/Winnebago area as a social worker with the State of IL and in Mental Health Services. I'm familiar with the locations that are in the plans for rehabilitation, and the people that live there. - 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - SUPPORTING & ADVERTISING MORE OF THE ARTS FOCUS ON SOME OF THE NON-PROFITS that are scratching & clawing to make a difference. SUPPORT & HIGHLIGHT LOCAL BUSINESS.
 - Increased support of the classical performing arts outside of the Symphony. Hosting musical events such as major pipe organ, choral, and other classical instrumental contests, seminars, national gatherings, etc. Increasing the encouragement of Rockford to draw folks to our local theaters for live streaming of Opera from the NY Metropolitan Opera. Combining these sorts of events that can overlap would draw a whole new type of visitor to Rockford. Supporters of these events tend to spend money at other places such as shopping malls, restaurants, etc.
 - Aquarium
 - Consider moving the main office out of downtown Rockford.
 - I feel we need to change the negative perception of Rockford as being a violent unsafe place to be. We need to focus, and get the media on board with promoting the POSITIVE in town. Also, the revitalization of downtown is still key.
 - Keep moving forward!
 - Less crime! The media to broadcast good things that are happening, not just the bad. Better word of mouth!
 - Outlet mall, more music coming to the Metro Center or whatever its current name is. Miss On the Waterfront. More family activity areas that are well priced. We have been to the new zip line course and will be trying the new Gateway Park for sledding/skiing. Stroll on State is a nice concept but needs to have more for the kids, my kids are bored, so many people and not much for them to do.
 - We need to start cleaning up and maintaining Rockford and the surrounding area. If we can't make ourselves look better, then why would people want to come to, move to, or invest in the area? An example is that no one takes responsibility for the dead animals in the roadway. They just sit there and bloat. Another example is all of the trash and vacant buildings in the downtown area. If we don't take care of "ourselves" who will? It is kind of like a depressed person who stops caring about themselves, we need to start taking care of Rockford.
 - A more connected cultural and retail town center.
 - An Aquarium in Rockford. Better snow removal on downtown sidewalks. A welcome wagon type experience for the airport when passengers are stranded. A volunteer group would handle this. Another "Why I love living in Rockford!" Campaign.
 - More to do and see on the river. Shopping, more restaurants with river view.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Safety, good advertising stating exactly where to go, walk, and things to do without going through any unsafe areas. Rockford is a short drive for me and I would go, but I am concerned about safety. I also like to have activities primarily in one area. For example, Galena, Illinois has a main strip you can walk, eat, and look at museums without moving your car. That's what I like the best. I don't mind driving a little, but most activities should have a good parking place even on the street or secure parking garage and you should basically be able to get out of your car and start doing things.
 - I believe we do a good job of this now, especially with visiting sports teams. When/if the Rockford downtown sports complex and hotel (or hotels) are built, there MUST be plenty of additional parking options available; there is not enough parking space downtown as it is now. It is not welcoming to potential masses of people coming to downtown Rkfd events if they become frustrated because of inadequate NEARBY parking people do not want to walk a city block or more, especially in winter months! Also, if the above mentioned developments take place, more casual, reasonably-priced restaurants/cafes are desperately needed in downtown Rkfd.
 - I would like to see the downtown area taken care of by putting in new sidewalks. I would like to see more festivals in the Rockford area. The crimes in Rockford area are a deterrent to people visiting in Rockford.
 - Much higher standards need to be incorporated for community development and public works. Nice sidewalks, roads, attention to weeds in the medians, modern wayfinding, grand entrances/gateways, more flowers and planters in downtown, public art, water features, lighting displays, walking police presence; interacting with people, nice outdoor cafe's at restaurants downtown (set up with high standards), litter control, sweep and snow removal on sidewalks and parking lots daily, street sweep, planned and integrated outdoor seating, new trees needs to be larger and maintained at a high level, light trees with soft white Christmas tree lights, sculptures in downtown, nice trash receptacles, bike lanes, infrastructure improvements on Main Street to Discovery Center, place a high value on customer and citizen experience, if citizens appreciate their surroundings so will visitors. Improve connectivity; start with downtown and work out. Plan with the end in mind. Plan, master plan and execute. Would rather see the downtown be a focus area for improvements with phased in strategies for other areas. Aldermen need to continue and see the bigger picture, voting together for improvements that will impact the greater good. Then move toward improvements. The downtown needs gathering places such as City Market, outdoor seating for dining during lunch and dinner, infrastructure to set up for great street festivals. Invite people to experience our assets, set up places to eat along the river such as food vendors and seating. Support with dollars and commitment the organizations that are making significant changes and experiences happen. Functioning well within a community is more than fix and repair that which is broken. Do you want to live in a family that operates that way? Bring financial experts in who can help direct the dollars we have so that dollars are spent to clean up and present our city well. Lastly, while most cities have those among them who are homeless, most cities absorb them better when there are a lot

more people walking around and there's hustle and bustle. During the day, every day, downtown, if the majority of who you see walking outside are people carrying a bag and stick, perceptions are real. The problem will continue. If you walk into a stairwell of a parking garage, and cardboard tents are made in the landings which you must use to get to work ... and it happens daily ... this might be a problem. It feels threatening, frightening, sad, and leaves one feeling hopeless. We can do better than this. Many positive changes are happening that are moving the city in a positive direction, however, I don't think the city should count on volunteers to be the investors into the city. The standards need to be set, master planning in place and staff employed with accountability, pieces in place for execution. Changes that zero in on what our community and visitors want to experience is the key to unlocking people's happiness and trust with our city leaders. What will help them fall in love with our city? Strategically, plan with the end in mind and execute. Thank you for the opportunity to share my opinion in an honest forum.

Again, green is nice. I would like to see a rest area added off the State highway. Maybe up near Roscoe.
- Downtown river boat casino instead of hundreds of little video gaming shops that are popping up all over the city.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Less blight and more road improvements on all sides of town. More green space promotion. Better race relations. Lower crime rate. Extending the Golden Rule with visitors, helping them to feel instantly welcome and at home.
 - Less violence. Too many shootings. People need to feel safe and when they read or hear on TV all they get is shootings. More positive news needs to be reported.
 - More things to do, we have a lot, but not enough to keep people occupied for a cold winter weekend. My niece and nephew have been coming to visit from CA for over 25 years, they were a few weeks ago during the horrible cold, I just couldn't find anything to do with them. We ended up going to Galena and Madison. Since they have been coming since they were babies, they have been to Discovery Center numerous times and Burpee so many times that they ask not to have to go again and they are adults now. We are on the right track. The entry to Rockford from I-90 is a bit boring, could use something to help make people see us for who we are. The drive down several main throughways is embarrassing. 11th St. is a horrible street, the actual street, bad condition. South Main, Alpine is a disaster. I try to view it from their eyes and not my Rockford born and bred eyes. I love it here but I can see why others may not share my enthusiasm.
 - Get rid of all billboards on East State.
 - Safer community.
 - More unique beautification and art-filled entrances. Literature for folks that spend either a day, three days, or an event weekend in the city. The New York Times runs a column every weekend on spending 36 hours in a given location they unearth the unique whether it is restaurants, shops, museums, etc. It is complete with times, addresses, and so on. SIDEWALKS that connect instead of just in front of one building or block. Better bus routing for shorter waits, bus stops that are covered or have seats and sidewalks instead of mud or snow. Evening bus

40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?

routes to stores and malls. More special shuttles for events from remote parking spots. Free/low cost shuttles from hotels by the I-39 to downtown events. Special/Direct bus services to large employers from inner city neighborhoods or remote parking based on shift hours. Think Lowes, Call Centers, Malls. College/Student passes at free or added cost to tuition for bus service. Bus services connecting the airport to VanGilder or Greyhound bus pick-up for people who might want to fly into/out of RFD and then travel to Chicago, Madison, etc.

- Sadly, the roads in Rockford are terrible. Having traveled to Madison often, my husband and
 I have often commented on how their roads are far better than those in Rockford. Stop
 doing the same thing in construction and maintaining roads if it has been proven that IT
 DOESN'T WORK! So much money has been spent in this city on "research." How about we
 make calls to communities that have success in road construction and maintenance, find out
 what they do and change what we do! Pretty signs are ignored when the roads are so bad.
- Take it one step at a time. The shotgun approach does not work well. Fix downtown first, get it looking beautiful and full of great venues, shops, and restaurants/bars. Do more pocket parks and KEEP THEM LOOKING GOOD, if you don't know what a pocket park is, they take the place of lots where buildings have been torn down. Keeps everything looking good till new development arrives. Make all the main avenues to downtown look pristine and welcoming.
- Basically, just the two working together more!
- A livelier downtown with more invitation for walking, outdoor cafes, and more attractive.
- Less crime.
- Less crime.
- People with pride in this city would help make this city more welcoming. It really is a great place to live and visit but it seems that people who were born and raised in this city do not believe in this city and most importantly in the potential of the city. I have heard and have personal experience with residents who are shocked when they hear that someone visits this city or moved to this city to work or because of the great location and proximity to all the major cities in the area. They immediately say, "Rockford? Why would you choose Rockford?" It's always fun to hear their responses. I think having pride in our city would make this city much more welcoming. But, beyond a better attitude, I think more options to play would be awesome, building up more places to visit near the river such as shopping or activities. I love the announcement of the new sports center near river and will likely be there for volleyball leagues and volleyball tournaments! With that, we need more cheap, quick, and easy food options for sport tournaments within walking distance of that location and ample parking. When events happen downtown, parking is definitely an issue. I would love to be able to park my car and walk to everything and make a day or afternoon/evening of the activities. Also, more festivals year round and near the river. Stroll on State is great for something to do in the winter and we love the City Market. Are you dreaming of anymore? This is a great start! Keep up the good work!

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - More festivals. Reviving "On the Waterfront" don't know if that is exactly it, but something along those lines.
 - Upscale shopping.
 - A more positive attitude by the residents.
 - More fun things to do amusement park, more concerts, etc.
 - More hotels in downtown area, safer cleaner streets, and sufficient mental health facilities to keep unstable people off the street and in a good place where they can obtain the help they need.
 - Continue to grow the downtown area with local restaurants, businesses, and entertainment attractions. Utilize the Rock River for more water activities. Present the community with more family-themed events, like Friday Night Flix.
 - I was there as a tourist for one month, and I've been warmly welcomed wherever I have been.
 - Less crime, less gang activity.
 - Free beer.
 - Less crime and/or more police. Better streets and lighting.
 - Keep prices low for admissions to attractions.
 - More attractions, love the Japanese garden, more things like that.
 - Less violence, clean streets, less abandoned buildings, more choice in shopping, (Whole Foods, Trader Joes, etc.), better restaurants in the downtown (W. State and Main) area. Free activities - I have no idea how a family of four can afford to go to museums, movies, or much of anything else, even some of the parks and outdoor recreational areas cost. I work and my husband is retired, we can't afford to go to Nicholas Conservatory, we're barely getting by. Better jobs, better pay. Better transportation - Trains to Chicago, Madison, and Milwaukee more than once a week or day. We need trains to these areas at least 3 or 4 times a day, with a way to get back no matter what time you leave these cities. An airport with more airlines coming and going. Southwest would be the best!!!!
 - Having things that would be attractive to all types of people, not just for a certain segment of people. I live in 61102 and when I have out of town visitors, if we don't have enough rooms in our homes, we have to take them all the way across town on East State St. to a hotel because the city has not saw fit to develop the west side of the river. Despite the perception that people have of the South and the West sides of the city, there are productive people who work every day to maintain homes and want the same things as people on the East side secure, clean neighborhoods, and a city they can be proud to invite people to come and visit. We would like to have nice hotels for our family and friends to stay at; nice restaurants to take them to; stores to shop in so we don't have to travel all the way down East State Street. Rockford's entertainment is WEAK. Sports events are about the only thing that is a

major draw. Bring a variety of people to the table to help figure out what would make Rockford an attraction, instead of relying on the same old mindsets who come up with the same tired ideas. On the Waterfront was a great attraction when it started out, but it got old and stale because the people who were in charge ceased to come up with anything new that would make it a continued attraction. Festivals are a big draw, but the division in Rockford is prevalent in the way the different nationalities have different ethnic festivals. Rockford is divisive enough! Why can't there be one big festival to bring together the different heritages? Stop taking everything to the East side. The crown jewel of Rockford, the Coronado Theatre, is seriously underutilized. Develop the Times Theater. Make downtown Rockford a "showplace" and a "destination" instead of a place to work Monday through Friday and avoid on the weekends.

- Easier access, train, more Eco-friendly public transportation efforts similar to Atlanta, GA. Improve relations with businesses for travel needs. More P.R. for local attractions, more unified. IMPROVE DRIVING AND PARKING FOR DOWNTOWN AREA!! Roads are too narrow, crazy, dangerous, hate (and hear this from visitors) to drive down there. Too confusing! Embrace the neighboring towns and cities so all benefit from relationship with Rockford.
- Control the gang activity, make sure the staff of county offices are true to the community.
- If we want to revitalize the downtown area you have to move the social services offices and subsidized housing out of the downtown area. I think we need to use the tax dollars we are already collecting to fund projects. We already have high enough taxes. Currently, people and business is leaving the area because of high taxes. If you keep raising taxes people will not come here, and the ones here will leave. The park district should be very close to self-funding instead of being subsidized by tax dollars. Why do we need a Park District Police force and a city police force? Can't the city police patrol the parks?
- Better schools and less crime.
- More development downtown. More locally owned businesses unique to our area. More focus on the Rock River. City and County leaders to work together to make our area safer.
- I think anything that would appeal to families. I have a young son and I would love to take him to events that showcase what Rockford and Winnebago County have to offer. Also, I know for a fact that State Bowling Tournaments bring a lot of people into the city for a few days. It would be nice if we had a bowling alley that could hold that, but I do think that the location of Rockford is the main reason why they don't have it here.
- Vibrant downtown, well light, safe, fun, unique, hip.
- Change the Southwest, West, and Southeast side of town. The choice grant voted down is an absolutely criminal. We should be ashamed of our City officials.
- Upkeep of existing structures.
- Free downtown parking Joe's Crab Shack.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Downtown hotels, restaurants, cafes, and cultural venues!
 - Less negative media coverage.
 - The city caters to the masses (meaning non ethic groups) and so the entertainment is geared toward those individuals that are more likely to attend. When events for African Americans occur they are held during the week and are more often than not "gospel" events assuming that all African Americans are only interested in that type of venue. If the RACVB is truly interested in making the city more accessible for all individuals, investigate what cities that are the same size as Rockford do to become more inclusive. I have not, nor will I encourage anyone to visit here because it is my belief that our entertainment/recreational activities are one sided and not geared for younger or older African Americans including this survey which although random many of the AA household will not receive.
 - Improved safety and better downtown area with possible river boat casino.
 - To not be always on the bottom of published lists. I love the parks and the museums and all the arts. We are blessed. I have been a community nurse working for the health department and my clients are spread all over but most are in the projects. How sad, how scary for them, for me. How many murders this month already? Too many for sure. Visitors will know these things. Closing of Singer really? I work three blocks from our beautiful Coronado and see our citizens with mental illness all over. I understand but unfortunately "visitors" don't. I would love to live downtown but my kids would never let me. That has always been a dream of mine. Sad. Wish I could fix it.
 - If we who live here embrace it! Peace through music.
 - Safety
 - Restaurants/hotels greeting people with, "Welcome to Rockford! We're glad you're visiting. Here is some information about local attractions (pamphlet). Enjoy your stay!"
 - Bigger name-brand retail (we lose Gap, Eddie Bauer, World Market, Papa Murphy's, etc. Can't attract Trader Joe's or Whole Foods, etc.). Less rundown areas, less crime, bigger name entertainment. Rockford has the cons of a larger urban area, not as many pros.
 - Gateways to enter the city, and reduction of crime.
 - More places to stay! And also highlighting the wonderful things we do have such as parks and forest preserves.
 - Continue adding programs to draw visitors to Rockford. So sad that the On the Waterfront event was given up. Do enjoy the Stroll on State. Sports and Theatre events are good draws.
 - More advertisement, more spending on tourism, and make gateway appearance welcoming.
 - Family-fun activities. Beautification not just in downtown.
 - Winnebago County can work on its own problems, we in Rockford need to make it safe place to live and grow and to clean up the city. Too many abandoned buildings and houses, they

say it is tied up in litigation, nonsense, change the rules and clean up the physical appearance of the city. I have never seen a town with more excuses than Rockford.

- I am very hopeful that the "Transform Rockford" project will accomplish that! In the meantime, "Regaining First" will do positive things also.
- Making downtown a viable destination is a priority. Connecting bike paths into a cohesive whole is also a plus. The Riverfront area needs to be advertised more as a go-to-destination. The live music scene needs to be promoted not only to visitors but the community as well.
- Sporting events and other fun events. More events like Stroll on State.
- First and foremost, curb the crime. Stop front yard parking, trash curbside all week and throwing yard waste into streets by residents and grounds maintenance companies. Limit number of cars tenants can have when off street parking is not offered by landlord. Crack down on slum landlords. In general, keep city clean. What good is appealing gateway to city, if you have to look at trash all over streets as dodging bullets to get to destination? But worrying about tourism when it is scary in our schools, on our streets, and in our businesses, is a little hard to fathom. Take care of the residents that pay taxes and the rest, such as tourism, will become easier. We need way more law enforcement than we have right now. Some of us can no longer visit grave sites of our loved ones because of the groups that hang out at our cemeteries. So much has changed. Maybe unsuspecting tourists will come here, but will they ever come back? Fix our city and county and then bring tourists in. So many people would even go to events alone if they didn't have to be afraid. Most Rockford residents will only attend functions with a group.
- Not sure.
- Less crime. Less vacant buildings. More entertainment and activities.
- Hotels close to downtown & where events are held. Having little shops like Galena. For them to feel safe especially downtown Rockford.
- Keep improving the downtown!
- Better control on violence and safety concerns. Beautifying and revitalizing downtown area. People will only go where they feel safe. I personally feel pretty safe going downtown and other parts of the city, but I know others that do not and will not go to those areas. Safety should be one of our top priorities.
- Revitalize downtown, also develop the riverfront to showcase it and make it a destinationbut with practical improvements, NOT like the "bridge to nowhere" behind Riverfront Museum Park. That's useless.
- Convention Center Complex that accommodates business shows as its main function as well as hard surface sports.
- Nicer neighborhoods. A lot of stuff is downtown and most people don't feel safe going into the heart of Rockford, especially at night.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Work on clean streets. Street cleaners can do their job during the night. Build sidewalks and decorative street lights. Archway to city is nice. Make major streets into the city look inviting by adding trees and gardens.
 - New entertainment complex with shopping, restaurants, gameworks, outside kids' play area, and concert venue perhaps? Next to or near the AMC on East State. It has open space, next to the interstate and close to hotels and the mall.
 - It would be great to have a pamphlet or program showing "what to do in 3 days in Rockford" and produce a different one for each season. For example, page 1 has day one: in the morning, eat brunch at Stockholm Inn, spend the afternoon exploring Anderson Gardens or the Nicholas Conservatory or Klehm Arboretum or Rock Cut State Park, have dinner downtown Rockford at one of these unique places (list options), grab a drink at Prairie Street Brewhouse or the Rathskellar, and end the night at your hotel (list options). Fall could highlight Edwards Apple Orchard, the Pumpkin Patch, a corn maze, the winery out in that area, and Fall Diddley. Winter could highlight ice skating rinks, shows at the Coronado, and the Stroll on State. Spring could highlight the gardens and parks plus places like Midway Village. Summer could highlight outdoor restaurants and beer gardens, events at Davis Park, and fairs/festivals. I think there are lots of interesting things to do in Rockford, but unless you know the area well (I grew up there), it's hard to think how you would spend a whole weekend there. If you give people a sample itinerary, it will advertise the highlights while demonstrating that this is a worthwhile vacation destination. I've seen this format used for another area's visitor's guide (I think it was in Northwest Indiana or McHenry County) and it was very effective. I hope this idea is helpful!
 - More festivals, sporting events, and trying to clean up the rundown areas of town.
 - Lower crime rate, free downtown parking.
 - Inclusivity of all. Family-oriented activities that promote the multiple ethnic groups in Rockford. Better communication and a unified vision of what Rockford has to offer, i.e., Premier Sports town with outdoor recreational activities including golfing, Alpine Hills, arts and performances, and vibrant cultural experiences downtown through restaurants and shops. Each business downtown should speak to the variation of populations in this community.
 - A safer city and less rundown/abandoned buildings and trash littered lots. Too much old and not maintained. We could have old buildings that still look beautiful if they were just maintained.
 - I think the residents having a more positive outlook. I came to Rockford about 4 years ago and I see all of the positives the community has to offer. However, it seems like those who have lived here for a long time don't see any positives nor do they try. Also, crime and the perception of crime is a factor. I have heard residents say, "I don't go out after dark" or "I don't go downtown because of the crime," that is a problem when you are trying to welcome outsiders. I work downtown and have never felt unsafe but if those who live here believe it is unsafe, you'll have a hard time convincing additional visitors to come.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Better public schooling, lower taxes, better return on home investment, improved infrastructure (streets, lighting, bridges), cleaner neighborhoods, better paying careers (keep work local, stop awarding work to out of town professionals/companies).
 - Continued improvement to downtown. When I visit other cities/communities I am looking for unique experiences and opportunities to engage in the local culture. Downtown Rockford has the potential to offer these experiences and opportunities to visitors. Currently, there is a lot of potential energy focused on downtown which needs to be realized in order for Rockford to be truly transformed.
 - Easy transportation to get from Point A to Point B. No cabs or trains make it difficult for people to get here and to explore while here.
 - Part of what makes Rockford attractive to our family living out of state is that Chicago is nearby. When friends and family come to visit, a trip to Chicago is usually also involved.
 - Fewer empty storefronts and abandoned homes. Removal of downtown one-way streets. Gateway improvement to downtown.
 - Locking up all of the gang leaders, giving extremely harsh punishments to the murderers, and having mandatory classes/training for all people who receive government assistance. Basically, doing something about the people who give our city a bad name.
 - Just let them know about all the great things we already have. I forward emails to my family out of town and they always "have no idea" what Rockford has to do! Lots of fun stuff to do here!
 - More job opportunities.
 - Clean up the city tear down unoccupied buildings and reduce the crime rate.
 - Bring some chain restaurants or Beef-a-Roo downtown. Families coming in to use the Ingersoll building for sporting events are not going to be interested in the restaurants downtown. They will head out to East State Street to places they are familiar with. You want to build up downtown with quaintness and that won't keep visitors down there.
 - Continue to improve the downtown area with more shopping, restaurants, hotels, music venues, add more festivals and bring back a weekend music/entertainment festival to replace On the Waterfront. It's clear the community and surrounding areas want more music festivals; we need better planning and execution of an event like On the Waterfront. Look how successful Stroll on State is!!!
 - Continue to add and grow attractions that welcome visitors. Control crime throughout the county. Deal with blighted areas by improving them to be more attractive. Visitors come to see and do. They will only come if they feel safe seeing and doing.
 - TRAIN!!!!!!!!!! So tired of having to catch the train in Harvard just to get to the city! Better bus system. Empty buses driving around seems like a waste of money. If the bus system was more efficient, people would be taking the train from Chicago to ROCKFORD!!

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Just the other day, I saw the "Rockford" welcome out on Business 20, after getting off I-90 and must say it's a sad statement. Needs sprucing up on all entering corridors "Welcome to Rockford."
 - While most shops and employees downtown are always welcoming, some are still pretentious. I recently shopped downtown for Christmas and was not acknowledged in a local shop that had 2 workers and only one other customer in the place. Maybe it was just a bad day but it has happened in the past in other establishments. I guess the attitudes of employees is out of your hands but feeling welcome in a store would be more welcoming to visitors. Also, I would love to see a venue for independent films again.
 - Better roads and out of area advertising.
 - Fix the roads throughout the entire city (not giving contracts to William Charles Limited for construction work). Second, get rid of the current mayor and chief of police (Morrissey & Epperson). Third, raise the standards back up for all police department personnel (height and weight limits must be kept up) too many unhealthy hires on the force today. Fourth, get the criminals out of Rockford (no more dropping point for paroles). Too many toxic charities in Rockford/Winnebago County area (everyone knows we have charities that give/provide free everything. Too much Section 8 housing and welfare recipients). Sixth, stop bringing all the crap from Chicago to Rockford - way too many on wait lists to come here for free housing, snap, and slum landlords that bring them here. Seventh, bring good jobs back to the area that pay a decent wage \$50,000 annual salaries and above. Eighth, more needs to be done for those already on welfare and having baby after baby and generations on welfare (40 hours of community service, cleaning up the streets where they live, volunteer soup kitchens, mow/rake/shovel their residences' yards and sidewalks) - way too many lazy people on welfare in Winnebago/all of Illinois. - 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Rockford needs more quality shopping options for adults. It seems like everything is geared toward low-income teenagers. We also need good bookstores; Barnes and Noble has become a huge disappointment since relocating to the mall. I want a better selection of books, not more toys. Also, there are so many lovely historic buildings and homes, especially on the West side, that are in decay because nobody is seeing to their upkeep. We have so many hidden gems that even locals don't know about, like the Rockford Rage roller derby team. I'm also sick of hearing how awful Rockford is in the press. How do we go about instilling a sense of personal responsibility and pride in people about their neighborhoods?
 - Having lived here all my life, what is there to do in Rockford besides eat, go to church, go to the park?
 - Much lower rate of crime and if people actually took care of their own property. Even picking up litter would be nice. Garbage trucks are the biggest litterers. Have you ever driven behind one? Stricter penalties for crime and bringing the death penalty to Illinois (eye for an eye!) please! I am very afraid for the outlook of Rockford and would like to care more since I have been here since birth. The future of my grandchildren looks bleak. Seriously considering moving to another state. Thank you for your concerns, however.
 - Enforcement of new zoning laws regulating the look and placement of big box stores on the State Street corridor, and much beautification of State Street west of Alpine Rd heading into downtown.
 - Less bad media but that is not avoidable no matter where you live. I promote Rockford all the time. However, I do hear people talking it down, and I just don't see that is bad. People are truly nice here. Rockford cares about extracurricular activities for the children and teens. Homeschooling is great here. So many wonderful opportunities.
 - Something like the River Walk they have in San Antonio.
 - Fixing our roads and bringing in more businesses.
 - Better public safety and lower crimes. It is no secret that we are on the top of this list for Illinois. I don't think anyone would feel safe coming to Rockford for an evening or overnight activity.
 - Repair roads and make lane markings more visible, at night or when it rains you can't even see the lane markings. I don't know how out of towners can navigate. Clean the streets of litter, doesn't look very welcoming maybe misdemeanor arrestees could pick up litter as part of their sentencing. Advertise in Midwest Living magazine things to do on a weekend while in Rockford.
 - Safer places to live and better schools. Revitalizing the downtown is a great idea, but the neighborhoods and surrounding areas should improve also. If the neighborhood around downtown is not good, there is no point improving it. Personally, I do not like to park off the main strip and go to places when there are always places for people to loiter and creep in the shadows.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Safety and reducing stigma about Rockford. More positive events. Make the city prettier to look at. Increase social services so there are less homeless and mentally ill with nowhere to go. And please improve the school district. Get the kids involved in the community!
 - Sidewalks on East State Street from hotels to restaurants. Better parking downtown. Concourse garage leaves bad impression. More attractive streets aping on South Main and West State Street.
 - Bringing the Amtrak back and not spending money on stupid stuff like the roundabout at North Main and Auburn. Make the town a safer place and have more fun festivals to get the people active in being a part of our community like it was for Stroll on State and make it fun for outside people coming in.
 - More city events like Stroll on State, City Market, and Dinner on the Dock. Those are the Rockford events that make me proud to invite my friends/family that are not from Rockford to go to. We're moving in the right direction and the Nay-Sayers have got it all wrong.
 - A loop highway that leads directly into downtown area where many events are held. Hotels. More businesses and better shopping options downtown. Some kind of aesthetic standards for buildings need to be in place. Driving through town I cringe at the thought of what our buildings look like to visitors. There is so much architectural ugliness here!
 - I recently moved out of the Rockford area and I realize now what visitors see. First, improve the roads. Secondly, create inviting gateways to the community. I've always loved the signs and landscaping using the purple coneflowers by State and I-90 exit. Rockford is surprisingly filled with many locations that out of town visitors would love. I think the RACVB does an amazing job of marketing my former city. I love Rockford and miss it, but thankful for the 23 years I lived there. Keep moving forward and don't let the people at CAVE (Citizens Against Virtually Everything) get you down. You are an awesome city! Love and miss you all.
 - Better roads.
 - Stopping the shootings.
 - I think that improving the downtown area and improving the infrastructure would be good places to start. The City Market and Stroll on State have been great ways to introduce people to the potential of the area, but there are still empty buildings, roads/sidewalks are not in the best of shape, and let's face it, available municipal parking stinks. Rockford tends to be Reactive, not Proactive when it comes to improvements. Also, Stroll on State was held on Small Business Saturday, but some idiot decided to start blocking streets before 7 a.m. Those businesses that were open for regular Saturday hours lost all of that business. Making the area welcoming to visitors should not be at the expense of the residents, or the people whose shops are what are bringing people downtown. Keep the business owners involved and informed, they have a better idea of what can bring people in. Try and get more flower shows to come here, we have wonderful gardens, promote them more in the Spring & Summer.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Keep the streets repaired. Less gang/criminal activity. Improve the schools which can only be done by the vast improvement of home situations. Too many bad environments. So you or I won't be able to really help. I'm very sorry about this. Churches' active involvement (not just Christian churches) & maybe good grandparents can be of great aid!!
 - Improving and maintaining the roads and sidewalks and sweeping the streets free of litter.
 - More family-friendly activity, beautification including less litter! Less crime/improved police force, better roads.
 - If we want people to visit Rockford, go back home to suggest that others visit Rockford and get people back here at least annually, we have to be known as a safe and welcoming place, both in reality and in the media. It is, also, important to be connected and in the loop with other major areas. Amtrak service and inter-city bus services would make Rockford a great gateway for departure to places like Chicago, Madison, Milwaukee, Galena, St. Louis, etc., as well as, Rockford becoming a great destination from those other great cities. This could facilitate an increase in attendance for events that are held here and, also, increase visits to all of our local attractions. If we encourage people to leave their cars at home, we need a transit system that easily links visitors with all of the major attractions, airport, restaurants, and lodging in our city. Bike rentals should also be readily available to allow visitors and locals to reach all neighborhoods and attractions. Neighborhoods should be more walkable, so they can easily get around when they get off at their stop. Water taxis could link all of the hotels, restaurants, and events that are located on or near the river. What about "cultural and fun," hop on/hop off trolley routes that would link up with each other, offer day passes and service all of our major attractions, including Clock Tower Resort, Showplace 16, Magic Waters, City Market, Aviator's Stadium, Starlight Theater, Anderson Gardens, Midway Village, Alpine Hills, Tinker Cottage, Rockford Museum Park, Davis Park, the Coronado, Klehm Arboretum, West Rock, Metro Center, Children's Farm, etc. The trolleys could also have a stop in each major business district in order to connect people to some of our great, local restaurants and shops that are located in different neighborhoods. This could, also, increase ridership from those neighborhoods. There could be daily service from Memorial Day to Labor Day and weekend service only the rest of the year. Locals would also use this system. The stops for most all of our bus and trolley routes should be covered to protect passengers from the elements. There should be phone Apps for knowing when the next bus or trolley will arrive, a map of what is around each stop, etc. Think "user friendly"!
 - Professional level jobs and safety.
 - The police department in the city needs to follow policy and create police reports on all incidents needing reporting. The school system needs to follow policy on violence and be fair with all children. Word of mouth and Media on all of the violence in the city scares people away. I personally feel safe walking down any street in the city, however, many people are frightened. The more businesses that open and remain opened in the downtown area should continually bring more visitors. The loitering around the McDonald's on State and Jefferson needs to clean up. Also, more police traffic downtown will show that safety is

of utmost importance. The park district is the BEST!! Free movies in the park is great, music downtown from local singer songwriters with lighter rock, not too heavy, outside in the summer months of the cafes or on the river. If it was promoted, then the local musicians can sign up and people can watch for free down by the river couple days a week. Then it would bring more traffic into the small eateries.

- Clean up crime.
- More things to do, especially for younger people.
- More parking.
- More stuff to do besides eat and have children. That's all people do around here. Base yourselves off of Chicago.
- Sidewalks and pedestrian crossings near hotels, eating establishments, shopping. I know that the West End entrance has been spruced up, but the East End off I-90 is less than inviting. The ramp exit onto State Street is confusing and dangerous (yield/merge, need an extra lane). Brighten up the area and make it inviting flower boxes and good lighting. Example, the beautiful baskets over Rockford's bridges. If the main roads into Rockford (State Street East and West, South Alpine) are inviting all the way in, people will feel safe to explore Rockford as they pass through, and maybe the next time, may make it a destination for the Burpee Museum, Discovery Center, BMO Events, Coronado Events, Magic Waters, etc. And not just stay cooped up in hotel and neighboring fast food establishments.
- I've been thinking about this for a very long time, okay check this out. How could/would it be to have a plaza downtown? A plaza big enough to have around a hundred people? It would include a beautiful Fountain (Tourism) (pictures) (people could say, hey! Meet me at the fountain downtown!). Tables so people can hang out. Wi-Fi. It could be surrounded by coffee shops or existing stores and restaurants around it. Live music would be great. Some sort of area where kids can play. Modern playground. TREES, TREES, TREES. You're welcome. Think about it. I'm pretty sure people would LOVE it.
- Less crime, more shopping, Portillo's more than just one.
- Better venues at our beautiful Coronado Theater & BMO Harris Bank Center.
- Take a look at statistics!! How many fatal shootings have we had in Rockford just in the 2015 year? The morale of the Police Department is at an all-time low and is justified. You can't bring visitors into the city if, as a resident, you don't feel safe.
- Sidewalks around the hotels and on State Street so our visitors will stop getting hit!!! And sidewalks in general along the main roads. Also, how about a sign ordinance? Ridiculous signs and billboards all over State Street looks junky. Perryville has some nicer, less obnoxious signage. Also, Discovery Center is a huge draw, but they need some restaurants in that area. It would be nice, if we could attract some nice retailers, too (Whole Foods, Cherryvale). And, Milwaukee has that awesome public market. It would be awesome to have a year round Rockford City Market. Just thoughts.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Beautification of gateways. Better signage. Positive Public Relations in area media. Positive energy and recommendations from all citizens.
 - Maybe nice lamp banners along E. State. Maybe make the other entrance of Rockford on N. Alpine more welcoming too!
 - I don't know.
 - Downtown hotel.
 - I lived in Rockford for 23 years but I am uncomfortable if I am downtown alone. The roads in Winnebago County are bad and worse in Rockford. The Sports Cores and golf courses are a definite positive. Empty homes and businesses look as though our area is not maintained.
 - More friendly, safe, welcoming feel. I feel we have enough events and activities. Don't "feel" that hometown safety we use to have.
 - More police!!
 - Lower crime rates in Rockford. A casino in Winnebago County. More cooperation between Rockford and other villages/cities in Winnebago County.
 - Safer neighborhood. Updated downtown. More security.
 - Street lights! Taking so many out was a stupid move with little thought about the overall effect. Makes our city look poor with little actual monetary gain.
 - Multiple downtown hotels. More frequent and smaller theme-based music and art festivals. Downtown has great resources to support these events. Development of neighborhoods and neighborhood businesses. Some are a regional draw: Stockholm Inn, Raskeller, Olympic, even Uncle Nick's.
 - Quit putting money into making the place look pretty. Maybe invest in a actually fixing the community and controlling the crime rate, then focus on spending all of our hard earned tax dollars on "pimping" your city. This city has its priorities out of line.
 - Reduce crime, improve public schools, and reduce homeless walking around downtown.
 - Thriving downtown with shops, better roads/infrastructure, and a railway.
 - Several things that are already being done, revitalizing downtown, which has started with Friday night activities during the summer, we need more outdoor concert events, really miss On The Waterfront, renovate our old historical buildings, a key area I've noticed is across from Carlyle's. Also, a great new addition is the Rockford Brewery, with Dinner on the Docks; making safe connections with bike paths in Winnebago County to adjoining counties; most of all, getting railway connection accomplished.
 - Innovative recreational activities, attractions, and train to/from Chicago.
 - A revitalized downtown with restaurants and shopping, movie theaters, and entertainment. More restaurants and bars on the river. Build those and bring people to them, and people

will want to come to town for conventions, sports events, and entertainment. They will want to stay downtown in little boutique-type hotels. The hotels can't exist w/o revitalizing the downtown!

- It will be soon once there is more viable hotel space, not just on the tollway perimeter.
- I see that show on TV (Discover WI) and I wish IL had a show like that. I'm sure IL has a lot to offer even Rockford that people in southern IL or even WI don't even know we have in Rockford, IL. Rockford needs to get the word out somehow about all that we have!
- This town and county is a joke less crime might help out a lot. We make the top 5 with every worse town survey to live in all the time. We have no jobs that offer people to come here that pays any wages for a family to live anymore. It's sad, a very sad situation and it has become a very ghetto place to live. That is why more and more people are trying to get out!
- More family- and kid-friendly events and activities. As a mom with 2 young kids, I'm always looking for new options of things to do with my kids, especially in the winter and easily accessible.
- Work on more safety!!!! Promote more neighborhood watch areas.
- More events like City Market and Stroll on State.
- Getting rid of the West side gang banging. Promote higher education and programs involving kids, community, and police right in the heart of these areas. Maybe a carnival of some sort for the police and community can really get to know who they are trying to help and help raise awareness of the way police are perceived and take out of the minds of that police are all bad because their parents raise them that way. Clean up the "ghetto"!!!
- Rockford needs to take control of the rampant crime that happens all over town. Their schools are just now heading in the right direction. Again, clean up the issues concerning a good quality education for their future citizens.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Crime must get under control. I don't even want to go out and do things so I sure wouldn't invite family or friends to town. It feels dirty because there is so much crime.
 - More attractions: bigger water park, big festivals, well-known bands (concerts), better name brand stores in the mall. Kids, teen, adult group sporting events, i.e., football, basketball, cheerleading, wrestling, soccer tournaments. Make Rockford seem more inviting in your advertising. Show the East side more and the downtown district. Put more businesses downtown, not just restaurants but not too many small boutiques. You need something that will last and thrive. BRING THE METRO that runs from here to Chicago. Bring in private investors if the state or city won't pay for projects. Just get things done.
 - Stop the crime on the West side everywhere really but the West side is like the wild, wild, West with people shooting each other.
 - Reduce crime, add more affordable attractions, and beautify downtown, more shops downtown, presence of security!
 - Update or redo the Davis Park stage and have more outside concerts. Have more familyoriented events. A GameWorks or Dave & Busters.
 - Upkeep of ALL areas of the area, particularly the City Downtown, West Side. The whole world doesn't exist on Perryville.
 - I would suggest more inviting entryways (East, West, North, and South), removal of unsightly billboards, uniform regulation of esthetic signage, positive conversation by residents, adequate/convenient/reasonable lodging, diversity in events for age and ethnic groups.
 - Stop pushing so hard for downtown. It is a high crime area and many people will not go there because of it no matter what you say. You say you don't have money for so many things, yet you continue to try to force feed people on downtown, public money should be spent on public safety, raises and job security for city employees, crime fighting, enhancing the police force, and programs to help people in need. Make it a better place to live for your citizens. You should also show more appreciation for the many East side attractions already in place.
 - More manufacturing companies, better roads, put neighborhood parks on vacant land, more police patrolling.
 - Make safety a priority and tear down those ugly, vacant buildings.
 - Downtown Rockford needs dramatic improvement and development, particularly, along our largest and most obvious resource, the river. Boating, docs, river-side restaurants, and shops. These are desperately needed to capitalize on the huge attraction we have, and to further capitalize on the fantastic state and local parks, recreational paths, and fairly low traffic. Cities like San Antonio, St. Charles/Geneva, Lake Geneva, and others have done much to bring Spring/Summer/Fall traffic to their waterfronts, no matter how large or small the body of water. We have a tremendous resource, and this kind of development needs to happen here.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - Safety. Make Rockford safer.
 - Strive to improve what works for Winnebago County and surrounding areas. Make sure the area is being advertised in Chicago, Milwaukee, and cities in Iowa. We need to let people know we are an area with beautiful parks, golfing, churches, and other culture activities. One of the biggest things is improving the education system. Without a good educational systems the rest will not be very relative to seeking permanent residents.
 - Learn from other cities' planning and events. Less politics! Work to preserve the past as much as building new parking lots!
 - Having a more appealing and safe downtown, organizing more activities and spreading the ones that are organized.
 - Rockford would improve by leaps and bounds if we could attract higher paying jobs.
 - Less negativity by many of the locals.
 - Improving our sporting facilities, more activities/trails in Rock Cut and other parks, cracking down on crime/gang related violence, more advertisement.
 - Safety and more concerts, festivals.
 - More family-friendly things to do downtown. Easier access to places.
 - Less crime. Making all of the most dangerous cities lists is not good. Less drugs on the street. We need some community drug rehab problems and more police.
 - Sidewalks, bike paths connecting neighborhoods. Rockford is so cutoff from itself and other communities. I would like to see Rockford work with the county to increase the access for its residents. There are no paths in my neighborhood but I see so many people walking down my street (and it's a busy one!). The closest bus stops are a mile in each direction so I know that is one of the main things people are walking towards. One of my neighbors was hit by a car recently because there are no sidewalks even to shovel, it forces street walking even more and it becomes so dangerous. I have lived in Winnebago County my whole life but not always in Rockford. Surrounding communities are putting in bike paths and most have sidewalks everywhere. I love living in Rockford and look forward to raising my children here. I have already enjoyed the many things that have been promoted, changed, and updated in the city, especially downtown. I am excited to see the city continue to improve! Thank you.
 - Cleaner city, more big attractions!
 - A new city administration that supports its fire and police. A new city administration that actually cared about the advancement of the City of Rockford as a whole and not their personal agenda. Less greed and ignorance in our elected officials. More attention to what

the citizens actually want and not what the mayor and his friends feel will give them the most gain. Address our city services and infrastructure first and then adding tourist attractions. If we continue to take money away from the essential city services and infrastructure, no matter how much you put into new attractions, people will not come. You could probably find some extra cash for tourist attractions if we eliminated some of the 12 attorneys the city has on staff. No other city our size has anywhere near that. Yet, they still seek outside legal advice. - I am not so much worried about visitors as I am about the people that live here daily. I would like to see the neighborhoods cleaned up, roads repaired, abandoned buildings torn down. I would like to feel safe when out and when I am home. I would like to see more shelters for the homeless. I don't like my tax dollars being spent on building more hotels or motels. I don't see the need for more hotels, motels, and convention centers. We spend so much money for surveys to bring more things to Rockford. How many people want to come here for more than a day? We have so much crime, our education system is not what it used to be. We have arenas, ball parks, sporting events, Metro Center, and now the city wants more. So many people that live here don't have the money to enjoy any of these venues. I think that it's sad that we don't seem to care about Rockford's people.
- Change in public perception.
- Affiliated baseball!!!!!!!
- Developed waterfront on the West side with water taxis.
- Get tough on crime. Celebrate the diversity that exists in the Rockford area. Work on turning unused factory buildings into newer high-tech manufacturing spaces. Create a sense of ownership in Rockford and get people away from the constant complaining that we are so very good at.
- Putting more attractions downtown.
- Better parking and no one-way streets.
- Rockford has the huge advantage of being right off I-90 in-between Chicago, Milwaukee, and Madison. This means we get a TON of travelers coming through Rockford every day, whether it be commuters or businessmen/women coming to Rockford to meet with locals about possible business opportunities. I find when travel, the first thing I notice about a town is the infrastructure. WE NEED BETTER ROADS. East State Street over by I-90 all the way west down to Fairview (State/Alpine area) is AMAZING. We need to make all major roads in Rockford like this (Alpine, Riverside, Perryville, Mulford, Harrison, 11th Street). Every time I drive down Alpine (north of Riverside), I feel like I'm going to get a flat tire. In my honest opinion, Rockford is already pretty attractive to other visitors. We have basically

every national chain-type restaurant in Rockford, plenty of gas stations, plenty of hotels. People like things that look good. I recently traveled the entire length of Illinois and all the towns/cities down South do not even compare to Rockford. This city has huge potential; we just need to focus on IMPORTANT things and not how to make the quickest buck. Thank you if you actually read all this. I have to be somewhere so that is why it's not that thought out and organized.

- Bring back the sports tournaments. Our kids were involved with travel sports teams. Rockford has some great facilities and can be even better. Clean up the major entrances into Rockford, publicize what Rockford has to offer in areas outside of Rockford. Get the word out. Offer the "fun" things for the younger adults to partake in. Whitewater rafting, love the idea of the winter tubing, (but keep it affordable for a family). Look at other cities and see what they are doing. Rockford needs to work with surrounding communities to draw people in, stop the political bickering amongst communities and work together!
- Revitalization of downtown Rockford would be a major step in the right direction. Sponsoring more attractions in the area could serve as catalyst to that effort. This wouldn't necessitate large expenditures. Having business establishments host events, on a frequent basis, that showcase local talent, i.e., music, sporting events, amateur theatrical skits (could be high school and college drama clubs), etc. Businesses could provide incentives such as food and refreshment specials to those patrons attending supported functions. Additionally, offering family activities such as ice skating (perhaps the BMO could avail their facilities on occasion) and giving the public the chance to meet local celebrities could likewise garner participation. Businesses that are directly consumer based need to promote the efforts of social organizations such as Transform Rockford, RVC, Rockford University, high schools, civic events, etc. Charitable organizations (such as churches) should also voice support and positive encouragement for community involvement within their congregations. Finally, I believe there needs to be a greater social media presence. The community should be notified of upcoming events well in advance, perhaps a social calendar should be tweeted at the beginning of every month/week. There should be plenty of photos posted following the event as well, to promote ongoing attendance. Through my experience working at a major advertising company in New York City, I know how important it is to get the word out. Social media is a great, if not the best, platform for doing this, as it generates a contagious enthusiasm and is something people constantly check. As a photographer and owner of my own business here in Rockford, I believe that photos can do something that words cannot. You can't capture the smiles and the joy on peoples' faces with words. If people see photos of their neighbors, classmates, co-workers having a great time at a community event, they will be more likely to attend the next one. I can't categorically state that a picture is worth a thousand words, maybe it is worth more. But I can attest to this: where words and text messages are frequently overlooked and ignored, seeing is believing. For my fiancé and I, this area is near and dear to our heart, as we have personally taken initiative to promote civic events such as Stroll on State, RVC's Rumble on the Rock, Ice Hogs, etc., through photography, which you can view on our twitter page (tuogiornophoto) or through my fiancé facebook (William Ciaccio). We are interested in getting more proactive with the Rockford

improvement process.

- Better police actions, quit having the Mayor and Co. Chairman arguing all the time, I suspect it is the Mayor's fault.
- I believe our community has a host of interesting things for residents to explore, but out of town visitors require a cluster of activity targeted to their needs to make a stay meaningful. A family may want to visit Discovery Center or Burpee Museum, but there are no family restaurants or kid-friendly places to stay downtown. People may be interested in visiting Anderson Gardens/Klehm, but the hotels are all on the Far East side. Local restaurants downtown are wonderful, but there is little to support daytime activities (shopping/retail experiences) for visitors. It's a cluster of options and activities that makes a destination attractive. Clustering would also allow us to invest in the physical appearance of entry points into our community, facilitate packaging of activities, and provide meaningful amenities and services for the appropriate target audiences.
- Like the question asked Gateways. There is not much at all exciting about entering our city. West State and South Main are getting improved but there is still much to do to make them attractive and inviting. North Main (Rt. 2) is ho-hum at best and East State looks just like any other city in America with its many hotels and chain stores/restaurants. Not much can be done there, however, there is nothing that sets us apart either. Crime is a HUGE issue, our reputation in that dept., along with high taxes, is absolutely horrid, and have made me contemplate leaving several times myself. And I was born and raised here. This is NOT the same Rockford it used to be. I feel for any student having to come back here, to be honest. The opportunities just do not seem to exist (cool downtown or not).
- A better self-image, better-educated populace, less sprawl, more commitment to live music, updated Riverview Ice House, more pedestrian- and bicycle-friendly community.
- Reduce crime and/or encourage our local media to provide a balance of negative and positive news reporting. I understand that "if it bleeds, it leads," and more negativity=more traffic=more \$\$\$, but this is becoming a nationwide problem not just a local problem and it's creating a fear that isn't justified. A hotel presence downtown is a must that's where all our theaters and museums are, not to mention the Rock River, YMCA, Nicholas, etc. More lighting! The one thing I've noticed in traveling to other cities of our size is that they do a much better job of lighting their points of interest and downtown areas.
- Hosting more festivals and special events.
- Reduce crime, beautify entrances to city, especially on South and West sides.
- If they add air conditioning to the ISC expansion they would attract larger events. More events downtown, but really need more parking that is close to the events. Some Friday nights you can't even go down for dinner because there is no parking.
- Improved and modern wayfinding, pride and value for aesthetics, i.e., sweep roadways, add trees and flowers in medians, do not allow medians to be filled with weeds, litter removal, plant mature trees along streetscape not tiny trees, need great sidewalks, and community

spaces downtown. A clean city creates a positive culture. Higher standards for outdoor dining.

- Perception is a big issue. We need to continue to improve our image. Improve the gateways to the city. Work on the safety issue.
- Jobs, entertainment, PARKING, safety while visiting our area, hotel/motel ease of access, better routing signs throughout town.
- Keep working on downtown area and a hotel for downtown would be great.
- Lower crime. More unique, original shops and restaurants. Better public transportation.
- Upgraded hotel stock and comprehensive effort to attract tournaments and conferences to facilitate all of the necessary details in a coordinated manner (including competitive hotel rates negotiated in the suburbs).
- I would like you to promote Old Settlers Days more. It's our areas biggest Music Festival. You need to get behind this event and help promote it better!!!
- Make it easier for young entrepreneurs to start innovative small businesses, and increase arts and entertainment. Make downtown a cool place to live and work, young people will move in, start businesses and people from the outside will want to visit. Look at Austin's legalization of food trucks, it enabled creativity to thrive and now people travel to that city just to eat at the food carts. Rockford is not friendly to innovation or creativity.
- Reducing the gun-related crimes.
- Rockford is great community in which I have lived and worked for 71 years. I have had many occasions to work with the RACVB over the past 30+ years. They are a fine group of leaders who know how to get a task done. Working with sporting events on a major scale was a wise move. I don't believe it has diminished their attention to other events. John Groh is a strong leader when steering the boat through some tough waters. The staff is great, however, I shall single out Lindsay A who also knows how to make an event work. Applause with a BRAVO.
- More historical and environmental sites to visit. Better restaurants. A vital downtown (even more than there is now going in the right direction). Less gambling places.
- More things to do. Fix up downtown, make it safer.
- Lower crime, get rid of gangs!
- Much more emphasis on the Arts, Culture, and the Environment we have with the rivers, forest preserves, conservation areas. We need to emphasize these strong attributes for our own citizens as well as visitors. We do not need to spend more dollars on attracting amateur sports facilities. We need to highlight these incredible attributes to residents of the suburbs and new employees of companies so that they will want to settle here and increase the percentage of young professionals and families. I like tourism but if you market us as a community regularly, the major athletic events you publicize will have a much better view of

us as a community and be more likely to attend and/or settle here. Enhancing our community is common work - we all have a roll.

- Perceptions are shaped in large part by resident's self-image. Our property taxes are already ridiculous. Adding another line won't help.
- Dedicated areas (for instance, State Street downtown or Midtown) for Art Galleries, shopping, restaurants, music. An "entertainment district." Rockford has a high percentage of artists and musicians. Making sure they are represented in developing districts will attract people from other cities.
- Sidewalks along "hotel row" on the Far East side out by I-90. In fact, sidewalks all over wherever there are none now. Letting businesses get built without any sidewalks was stupid to begin with. We also could use more bike lanes in shopping areas.
- The east side river walk between Jefferson Street bridge and the YMCA, relocating Cellusuede off of Madison Street.
- More public art and participatory arts festivals. Free parking downtown. Fun family runs. Identify a strength/asset and build from there.
- I just want to comment on a few things. I don't feel safe 100% of the time but I still love it here, I really do. Rockford has a lot of heart and soul, and a vibrant, diverse community full of a lot of young and motivated people looking to make a difference. I think change can be firmly planted by 2 things. A better school situation, and I think more tourism can be achieved by making our community enticing and enriching to entrepreneurs through more opportunities and benefits for startups, entrepreneurs, and local businesses. Not as a temporary thing for the summer or for the staple businesses, but as a major element that is a constant. Cities thrive around the local businesses that make it unique. I don't mean downtown, but everywhere in Winnebago County. The more difficult it is for local businesses to succeed the less 'unique' features Rockford has to offer any outsiders or insiders. Overall, I believe the RACVB IS doing a great job to focus on this more than ever before. But I always live my life knowing that MORE can always be done. My work is never over, and if I can say anything, this is what I would say! Thanks for a wonderful year.
- Heavily promoted cultural events. Creative, visual, performing Arts events and venues. Experiences over materialism, even in the buy local move. The experience is far more important than the goods.
- Less garbage in the media.
- Improve safety.
- A positive attitude with the many opportunities for the various interest groups at the tips of our tongues. We need to emphasize and celebrate the positives rivers, parks/preserves, access to getting involved (huge draw for young people with degrees to be told you can walk into a job in our city and be a part of working boards and non-profits, that these young people can be leaders NOW vs. when they are 40+). Arts and Culture our music and art

scene is vibrant, but the creation of a unified effort to be seen/heard is missing. Our arts and music groups need a meeting place where we can create and make music together in an unofficial way.

- Safer, more things to do, and more attractive.
- More diverse restaurants or eateries. Wide variety of inexpensive venues for local or regional musical or other talents. Everything seems to cost so much. I'm aware that booking acts or speakers cost \$\$\$, but speaking to a load of deep pockets, at \$100 per plate at Giovanni's really not positively affect the vast majority of Rockfordians. Highly paid Doctors, Lawyers, or Indian Chiefs, won't help the people who could really need the help. This is a POOR city that needs some things to entertain us on the sheep. Years ago some fire dept. group used to book the Metro and put on an oldie show or a Country night. It was around 15 some years ago. What happened to those dates? Thank you for what you are trying to do. Alam
- Less violent crime and bad press.
- Less crime, litter, rundown areas.
- Educate locals and regional families about all the things going on. Many families just do not know.
- Keep moving the direction you're going. Don't let the negative people affect your direction!
- I work in Chicago and Burbs. Every area has its issues but for the most part I am in areas, including Wisconsin, that are clean, populated by polite people and by people that take pride in their homes and themselves. I make the commute because I cannot make the same salary in Rockford. We need more people that are genuine in their desires to make Rockford better. My wife and I have discussed many times moving to the burbs or into Wisconsin and the conversations are becoming more serious in tone so now, unless things change dramatically, in terms of cleanliness, education, and overall safety, it will just take the right job offer and we are gone.
- High quality, excellent lodging in the downtown (near downtown attractions such as performance arena (BMO), Coronado, cultural corridor, museums, and some of the best restaurants in the city).
- Getting rid of the negativity the Mayor and Chief bring to this city and to focus on getting crime down in the city instead of the politics going on at city hall.
- Promote more cultural activities available through local organizations.
- Less violence. More sit down family-oriented restaurants, less fast food, more family-friendly activities.
- A safe community that is not continually on every list of high crime areas. A downtown that is safe and fun. Quality grocery stores like Whole Foods. Streets without craters. A new mayor and police chief without personal agendas that listen to the tax payers.

- 40. What would make Rockford and Winnebago County more welcoming to visitors?
 - While much of the work lately seems to be centered around bringing visitors to the area, at the same time, I hope some of these projects also bring opportunities for the community to take advantage of them. For example, having the new downtown sports complex be open to the public a couple days out of the week for open gym.
 - More signage of places to see and visit. Signs of city pride, i.e., invest in better flags/signs of upcoming events on light posts on all bridges; invest in plants/flowers on bridges.
 - Unique shopping and dining. Sporting events. Unique venues. Things that no one else has that makes us different. Then rail into Chicago.
 - Promoting Rock Cut Park, promoting Midway Village and Anderson Gardens. Free concerts at Sinnissippi Bandshell (RSO type). Have a Ravinia-type venue, outdoors in summer for concerts upscale and in safe area.
 - Walkability and bike ability or better public transit. Unique shopping experiences. More riverfront attractions, especially restaurants closer to downtown area. Downtown small music venue nicer than Mary's, but not as nice as Coronado. Like Shank Hall in MKE. Oh and well maintained street lights, plantings, etc. Just drive downtown St Charles. Their street looks awesome. Thanks!
 - Attractions and events. And having a hotel within walking distance of downtown sporting and cultural events to encourage people to stay and do more in our community.
 - Clean up the political corruption and crime in the city. The mayor and the conga line of freaks that we have as "leaders" are not doing the city any favors.
 - Making both the new downtown sports center and the current Indoor Sports Center multisport (include turf sports and hard court for both). The Rockford area is large enough to support two multisport facilities. What is planned is a disservice to the people.
 - For starters, keeping them away from downtown. You'll get visitors for tournaments but most will only come once. When they see what a crap hole our downtown is and our "exceptional" crime and violence rate, they won't come back. I have talked with many, many families who are in programs out at the ISC and NONE of them will bring or even let their daughters drive downtown if you move the program down there. You will basically be killing a community program that has been around for 30 years! PLEASE do not move all the court sports downtown!
 - A train from Chicago to downtown. More going on downtown, restaurants, and shops.
 - More commercial attractions and more appealing accommodations downtown.
 - Better roads and a cleaner city. More sidewalks and transportation to/from Chicago.
 - Why do we have to do things for visitors? What about the residents already living here? Personally, I go to other places for things to do. Place I don't worry about crime rates.
 - Better and bigger indoor entertainment businesses and facilities (it's cold here 9 months out of the year), i.e., trampoline park, Main Event, Dave & Busters, aquarium. I think the

downtown nightlife area has potential but there needs to be a mall area of a block or two of just restaurants and bars, (also where one can walk around in that area with to go cup beers/alcohol drinks like Savannah, GA - that would be awesome). Need create a place for sport tournaments so people have a reason to come. Once they come, then you need a reason for them to want to come back.

- Continue to develop main entry corridors and highways/streets leading into Rockford's downtown. Continue to replace abandoned rundown houses/buildings with green areas or new business sites. Share the great history of Rockford's beginnings with promoting small as well as large museums downtown. Work with the governor to get the rail station downtown to bring visitors to the community.
- Getting rid of the gangs and revitalizing Rockford. Upkeep and looking face is extremely important.
- Clean up the rundown and vacant private and commercial properties and roads, especially the West side! It's really sad looking over there! There has also been a lot of crime and violence which doesn't help the image of Rockford. Rockford reminds me of Gary, IN ... would you want to stop by Gary for a visit?
- Lower crime rate; a public university; respect for ALL PEOPLE; respect for authority; no intergovernmental fighting; tolerance, in fact, acceptance of all regardless of who they are.
- I am against moving the adult volleyball leagues from ISC to the downtown location. I do not feel that there is enough parking close enough to the building to ensure safety of the player paying to play. Six blocks is a long way to park away from a venue at night, especially when it's an all-women's league.
