Fairfax County, VA – March, 2013 – Throughout this year's National Cherry Blossom Festival®, Visit Fairfax and its partners are celebrating the splendor and majesty of our parks and gardens, as well as Japanese culture, with exhibits and self-guided garden tours that showcase the natural beauty of Fairfax County in bloom (www.fxva.com/cherryblossom).

Glorious Gardens Tour

There's no better time to experience nature's beauty than during the National Cherry Blossom Festival[®]. Between March 20th and April 14th, Festival visitors are invited to plan a self-guided tour of the area's splendid gardens. In addition to the District's iconic Tidal Basin and the U.S. National Arboretum, plan stops at the following not-to-miss sites:

River Farm www.ahs.org/river_farm (703-768-5700)

A historic 25-acre site on the banks of the Potomac River, River Farm was once part of George Washington's original five farms, and currently the headquarters of the American Horticultural Society. The grounds offer spectacular river views, a wildlife garden and delightful children's areas.

Meadowlark Botanical Gardens www.nvrpa.org/parks/meadowlark (703-255-3631)

More than 100 cherry trees surrounding a lovely lake, an extensive shade garden, native wildflowers, gazebos, birds, butterflies, seasonal blooms and foliage. Also be sure to visit the singular Korean Bell Garden while you're there. There is a nominal entrance fee.

Green Spring Gardens www.fairfaxcounty.gov/parks/gsgp (703-642-5173)

There's something here for everyone: a wooded stream, valley with ponds, a native plant garden, over 20 thematic demonstration gardens, and a greenhouse filled with tropicals. It's an outdoor classroom, a museum and a national historic site.

During the Festival, visitors are encouraged to check in at the main desk at each garden to receive a special complimentary memento. Log onto the individual websites or call for hours and directions.

March 2-April 7 – "Ephemeral: Interpretations of the Cherry Blossom" Exhibit at the Workhouse Arts Center Curated by Laurel Lukaszewki and Komelia Hongja Okim, this month-long exhibition on the ephemeral nature of the Cherry Blossom will explore fleeting moments captured in art while celebrating the bloom, as well as Asian and American relations. Artists in this exhibition include: glass artists Michael Janis and Robert Kincheloe, photographer David Douglas, painters Sumita Kim and Jun Chul Kim, and sculptors Akemi Maegawa, Dalya Luttwak and David Loren Gerlach. March 23 – Japanese Garden Design Seminar at Green Spring Gardens

Ikebana, the Japanese art of flower arrangement, is a disciplined practice inspired by nature. Learn the rich symbolism and fundamentals of this art and take home an arrangement of your own. April 6 – Asian Art and Culture Day at the Workhouse Arts Center

Enjoy a full day of workshops, demonstrations, performances, talks and exhibitions featuring Asian art and culture from 11 am to 4:00 pm. The day will feature Japanese tea tastings, origami workshops and film, brush painting demonstrations, artist talks, cherry tree planting, and other cultural activities for all ages. Presenters include Japan America Society of Washington DC, George Mason University, Workhouse Ceramic Artists and Ikebana International. Highlights include guest lecturer Dr. Svitlana Shiells on the Japanese influences of Gustav Klimt's work and the Japanese aesthetic in contemporary art; a special Ikebana exhibit by Workhouse ceramic artists; a presentation of <u>The Magic Fan</u> by students from George Mason University's Japanese studies program; and an Anesama doll-making workshop with Anne Cox.
