Athens Community Career Academy




CVB Director **Chuck Jones** attended the April 18 governance board meeting of the Athens Community Career Academy. As a board member, he represents the hospitality-tourism industry. The academy continues to garner increased student interest and attendance; there are already 171 students registered for next fall. For the Youth Work Readiness Summer Program, there are 34 students registered, and these students will be paid over a two-week period. The career academy is in sync with local industry needs and is committed to providing a well-trained

workforce for our community's employers.

Strengthening International Relations

On April 28, **In Dong Cho**, the vice mayor of the Seodaemun District of Seoul, SK, came to Athens to strengthen the relationship between Athens and his district since a collaborative MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) was signed last year. He also met with **Mayor Nancy Denson** and ACC Manager **Blaine Williams** to discuss future exchange between those two cities. The prior day, CVB Director Chuck Jones met with a 14-member delegation from the Governor's Association of Korea about the CVB's tourism program and discussed the city's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats related to tourism. Tackling Panhandling



The Panhandling Roundtable met May 3, with participants including CVB Director **Chuck Jones** and other community representatives from ACC Police, the county commission, and downtown business owners. The group continues to address how to mitigate the situation, taking into account legal ramifications as well as business, resident, and visitor interests.

Moving forward, the group identified five initiatives:

- 1) more UGA outreach;
- 2) update of resource card indicating area resources and how best to donate to panhandlers, to be widely distributed to residents and visitors:
- 3) additional outreach on downtown streets;
- 4) more interaction with police to aid in the situation; and
- 5) increased visibility of meters, where people can make donations instead of giving directly to panhandlers.

Downtown Athens is a major attractor for visitors, and the CVB, as well as others, would like to ensure that it is as inviting and welcoming as possible to visitors.
