

## Fort Worth Convention & Visitors Bureau Celebrates National Travel and Tourism Week Free Cliburn Event at Modern Museum of Art; First Ever Front Lawn Concert: Sunday, May 5 at 3:30PM

**FORT WORTH, Texas** — In recognition of National Travel and Tourism Week, May 4-12, the Fort Worth Convention and Visitors Bureau (FWCVB) will host a special event in the Cultural District at the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth on Sunday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at 3:30pm. The event will celebrate travel, tourism and the rich arts and culture for which Fort Worth is so well known.

Special guest Mayor Betsy Price will welcome the crowd and begin the festivities. The celebration will feature the first-ever concert on the Modern Art Museum front lawn and is free and open to the public.

The celebration at the Modern Art Museum will showcase a sampling of the performing arts and culture in Fort Worth that attract visitors from all over the world. The event will include *free* admission to the Modern Art Museum, *free* Spanish language tours (at 2PM) and a *free* outdoor concert by Cliburn performer, Spencer Myer, celebrating the Fourteenth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition to be held May 24-June 9, 2013.
