U.S. Grant Trail Guide to Civil War Sites in Kentucky and Missouri Published

The "Confluence Segment" of the U.S. Grant Trail features points of interest from Hannibal, Missouri to Paducah, Kentucky that witnessed Ulysses Grant's rise to fame.

A joint project of communities in Kentucky and Missouri, the Paducah Visitors Bureau facilitated local partnership with the Kentucky Humanities Council, Missouri Humanities Council and Missouri Civil War Heritage Foundation to develop the guide.

"Working with Missouri's Civil War Heritage Foundation on the U.S. Grant Trail allows us to expand the story of western Kentucky's involvement in the War Between the States through U.S. Grant and his quest to control the western rivers," said Mary Hammond, Executive Director of the Paducah Visitors Bureau.
