Workshops are Saturday mornings from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. and Tuesday evenings from 5:30 – 9 p.m. at 120 N. 3<sup>rd</sup> St., on the corner of East State Street and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. Children ages 12-15 may volunteer with an adult and a signed waiver; 16- and 17-year-olds must provide a signed waiver. Volunteers are welcome to come to the workshops without prior registration. Workshops end on November 15.

## Sites & Attractions

Two new attractions are sure to please the crowds this year. Rockford City Hall will be transformed into a 'Twas the Night Before Christmas Headquarters sponsored by Barnes & Noble and GiGi's Playhouse. Kids are encouraged to come and hear readings of "'Twas the Night Before Christmas" and to write their own letter to Santa that will be delivered to the big guy himself. The Hot Chocolate Express, sponsored by Butitta Brothers Automotive and Rockford Marlins Swim Club, will be a new attraction this year featuring a special recipe hot chocolate and sprinkles of marshmallows.

Once again in 2016, the main event grounds will take place along State Street, from Main Street to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street.
