Noblesville, Ind. – Hamilton County Parks and Recreation announced Koteewi Archery Range is now open for both seasoned archers and beginners to practice target and 3D shooting. Koteewi Range is offering range passes starting at \$10 as well as memberships for families and individuals.

The fall opening will give people the opportunity to preview the attraction before the grand opening in Spring 2015.

The Olympic-size facilities at Koteewi Range will feature:

- 90-meter variable distance and target range with 64 shooting stations
- 30-yard practice range with 30 shooting stations
- 3D archery trail
- Handicapped accessibility
- Recreational and competitive shooting
- Fixed and variable targets
- Girl's Archery pro shop
- Archery safety and education classes
- Gear rentals
