5. Fly and Climb Through the Trees

<u>Adventure parks</u> are becoming an increasingly popular activity in the Pocono Mountains, containing family-friendly activities like ropes courses, all-season tubing lanes, coasters, climbing walls and zip lines.

<u>Waterparks</u> are the perfect place to cool off on a hot day. Explore waterslides, rides, and attractions under the summer sky.
