CLARK COUNTY, WASHINGTON, SCENE OF FUN-FILLED FALL AND WINTER FESTIVALS

VANCOUVER, Wash. — Even before the leaves begin to change, Clark County, Wash., is gearing up for a busy fall and winter festival season. From the Birdfest & Bluegrass Festival to the Christmas Ship Parade, Vancouver and surrounding Clark County boast numerous music, historic, cultural and family events for locals and visitors alike. Upcoming festivals include:

<u>September</u>

- Labor Day Weekend Wine Tour (Sept. 2–5) Wineries throughout Clark County, Wash., will be hosting wine tastings and a variety of special events throughout Labor Day weekend to bring attention to the exceptional wines being produced in Washington's newest emerging wine region.
- Campfire and Candlelight at Fort Vancouver (Sept. 17) This annual event held at Fort Vancouver National Historic Site will depict an evening as it would have been for U.S. Army soldiers, Fort residents and Oregon Trail immigrants in the 1840s. Visitors will experience numerous re-enactments of nighttime activities taking place throughout the Fort grounds and inside Fort Vancouver Village.

October

• Birdfest & Bluegrass at Ridgefield Wildlife Refuge (Oct. 8–9)

Now in its twelfth year, the Festival celebrates the natural beauty and rich culture of the Refuge as well as the beginning of fall migration and the return of the Sandhill cranes. Activities will include Sandhill crane tours, raptor shows, guided walks, and kayak tours as well as live bluegrass music, a Birders' Marketplace and guided tours of the historic Cathlapotle village.

• Screaming Pumpkin Derby (Oct. 29)

While many people will be carving pumpkins in traditional fashion, families from near and far will have the rare opportunity to actually race them. The second annual Pumpkin Racing Derby will take place at the Serendipity Event Center and feature man-made Pumpkin Race Cars rolling down a track constructed outside the Event Center. Whether a competitor or a spectator, this day at the races is a must-do fall activity. Spectator admission is free. Owners of the pumpkin cars must pre-register and pay a \$15 racing fee, which will make them eligible for trophies and prizes. Lunch is free to all registered racers and kids are encouraged to wear costumes and trick or treat in the haunted house.

November

• 25th Annual Veterans Day Parade at Fort Vancouver (Nov. 5)

Residents of Clark County and surrounding communities will gather to celebrate the region's 150-plus year history. The parade will be held at Fort Vancouver and pass by the historic houses of Officers Row, the Vancouver Barracks, and end at the Pearson Air Museum. More than 2,500 individuals and 100 military, veteran and civic organizations participate in this parade, one of the largest on the West Coast.

• Thanksgiving Weekend Wine Tour (Nov. 25–27)

Wineries throughout Clark County, Wash., will be hosting wine tastings and a variety of special events throughout Thanksgiving weekend to celebrate the end of fall harvest in Washington's newest emerging wine region. This year's theme will focus on food pairings.

<u>December</u>

• Christmas Ship Parade (Dec. 3–20)

Now in its 57th year, this special parade showcases the lighted displays of more than 50 boats as they sail along the Columbia River, delighting thousands of residents with their spectacular nautical holiday light displays. Festivities will kick off on December 3, when the fleet will gather and have a special performance at the Port of Camas-Washougal.

• Christmas at Pearson Air Museum and Fort Vancouver (Dec. 10)

Traditional holiday festivities will take place at the Fort, while Santa Claus, a North Pole mailbox, hot cocoa and cookies will await visitors at Pearson Air Museum. Visitors will enjoy both Vancouver's military history and charming Christmas fun for all ages.
