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DIRECT AMTRAK SERVICE BETWEEN VANCOUVER, USA, AND VANCOUVER, B.C., BECOMES PERMANENT

Travelers can now leave Vancouver, Canada, in the morning and be in Vancouver, Washington, in time for dinner

VANCOUVER, Wash. – Due to its immense popularity, the Amtrak *Cascades* train that has been providing direct service between Vancouver, USA, and Vancouver, B.C., on a temporary basis, has been made permanent. Originally slated to end on October 31 of this year, the route between the two cities will continue indefinitely based on a recent decision by the Canadian government to permanently waive a proposed \$1,500-per-day inspection fee.

"The continuation of this popular route will allow Vancouver, B.C., residents to travel to Vancouver, Washington, in one day without having to get off the train," said Kim Bennett, president of the Vancouver USA Regional Tourism Office. "Everyone from history buffs, to families, to foodies can now get to know both cities, which although share the same name, offer very different experiences."

The pilot project, which has been operating since August 2009, added a second *Cascades* train between Seattle and British Columbia creating, for the first time, same-day service between the two Vancouvers. The train departs from Vancouver, B.C., at 6:40 a.m. and arrives in Vancouver, USA, at 2:25 p.m. Conversely, passengers can catch the train in Vancouver, USA, at 3:05 p.m. and arrive in the Canadian city by 10:50 p.m. Prior to the addition of the second train, passengers who boarded anywhere south of Seattle had to either stay overnight there or catch a bus to Vancouver B.C., discouraging all but the most determined.

According to Amtrak figures, between July 2010 and June 30, 2011, the second *Cascades* train carried 233,325 passengers, of which 28,129 crossed the border into Canada. Several groups worked closely with Amtrak and the Canadian government to change the train route to permanent status including the Washington State Department of Transportation, the Pacific Northwest Economic Region and All Aboard Washington.
