Bringing together approximately 50 paintings, some of which are autographed by the artist himself, the exhibition offers the public the opportunity to explore the opinions of scholars and collectors as they illustrate what constituted as an autographed Rembrandt, more than a century ago.

### **Gregg Museum of Art and Design Gets New Home**

N.C. State University is undergoing a \$7.5 million project to relocate the university's Gregg Museum of Art and Design. The Museum will move from the university's Talley Student Center into a new, freestanding LEED Silver-certified facility that will include a renovated 7,000-square-foot chancellor's house and a new 16,7000-square-foot wing.

The Museum's design will be completed under guidance from Durham architecture firm The Freelon Group. The projected is slated to be completed in October 2013.
