Global Meeting Industry Day demonstrates direct economic impact of meetings

Albany, NY – The Albany County Convention & Visitors Bureau and the Albany Capital Center will celebrate the first-ever Global Meetings Industry Day (GMID). These meetings will bring 4,150 attendees to Albany County, generating 5,500 hotel nights and close to \$2.8M in direct spending.
