Dasher Dash 5K, Holiday Parade, expanded hours and more live entertainment highlight downtown Rockford festival

1. The Fun Starts at 2 p.m.

The official start time for Stroll on State is 2 p.m. We are adding one extra hour so patrons will have more time to experience the awe and wonder of the festival. The event concludes at 9 p.m.

2. A Reimagined Holiday Parade

The Stroll Parade started out featuring a few horse & wagons and Santa Claus leading up to the tree lighting. This year, the parade is super-sized! **Stroll on State's Holiday Parade, presented by National Electrical Contractors Association and International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local 364**, will step off at 3 p.m. and stroll from the Rockford Public Library on Wyman Street south to State Street and then east across the State Street Bridge and ending at N. 3rd Street. Featuring festive floats, high school marching bands and a few extra surprises, the parade will be a new highlight of the event. In addition, our partners at WREX Channel 13 will broadcast the parade live from start to finish.

Calling for Parade Entries: Local organizations and businesses are invited to participate in the parade. In order to be part of the parade, participating floats must be decorated with a Classic Christmas theme such as the North Pole, Santa's Workshop, or Winter Wonderland. The parade committee is pleased to provide commercially prepared floats for rental and use. These floats average 28' in length and 8' in width, include the business or organization's name on both sides, and are ready to ascend and ride. Deadline is November 1 to register. 3. Dasher Dash 5K

RACVB and Fleet Feet Sports Rockford are excited to start a new holiday tradition in 2017. The Dasher Dash 5K, which starts at the UW Health Sports Factory, will be a holiday themed race through historic parts of downtown and central Rockford, including four bridge crossings, Haight Village and Founders Landing District, and the lovely grounds of Tinker Swiss Cottage. Runners shouldn't spend too much time sightseeing though, because once they cross the finish line on Grove St., they will receive a specially designed finishers medal, hot chocolate and yummy Christmas cookies.

This certified 5K course has been created for everyone with awards for overall and age group winners, finisher medals, and special pricing for kids 12 and under. Cost is \$30 (price increases November 21, 2017 at 11:59 p.m. CST) Children 12 and Under is \$15 (price increases November 21, 2017 at 11:59 p.m. CST). 4. More Live Entertainment

Each year, guests ask for more live music and entertainment throughout the festival grounds, so in year five, there will be three music stages throughout the grounds – The Merry & Bright Stage sponsored by SwedishAmerican, next to the City of Rockford's Christmas Tree, as well as the Silver Bell Stage at the corner of N. 2nd Street and State Street and the Jingle Bell Stage at the corner of Mulberry and Main Streets – both sponsored by the Northwestern Illinois Building Trades Unions. In addition, selections from the "Nutcracker Suite" will be performed by Steps to Grace Dance Academy throughout the event at Veterans Memorial Hall; and at the Nordlof Center The Studio presents: "James and the Giant Peach"; Gigi's Playhouse presents: an adaption of the "Wizard of Oz;" and there will be a "Christmas-Kwanzaa Celebration" by Rockford Readers Theater.

5. Tasty Treats and Drinks

As the event grows, so do the great food and drink vendor offerings throughout the festival grounds. Stop by Frosty's Bites & Brews outdoor market sponsored by Mercyhealth to sample a wide variety of offerings from local food trucks and restaurants. Frosty's markets are located at —MORE—

Classic Attractions

The popular Hot Chocolate Express, sponsored by Butitta Brothers Automotive, will return with their special recipe hot chocolate and sprinkles of marshmallows as part of the MovieLand sponsored by Comcast experience where you can watch the classic cartoon version of "How the Grinch Stole Christmas."

Once again in 2017, the main event grounds will be along State Street, from Main Street on the west to 3rd Street on the east. The **Official City of Rockford Christmas Tree** is at the corner of West State Street and Wyman Street; and located next to the tree is the Merry & Bright Stage. Both the tree and stage are sponsored by SwedishAmerican, a division of UW Health. The official tree lighting ceremony will begin promptly at 6 p.m. with the Sky Lights Fireworks presented by Gallagher Williams-Manny immediately following the tree lighting.

Along the banks of the Rock River, catch the synchronized light show Rockford's River Lights sponsored by ComEd or stop by and say high to Santa at City First Church's outdoor SantaLand located at the Millennium Fountain on Water Street (shhh ... don't tell the kids, but a second SantaLand is also available indoors at Stewart Square located at the corner of South Main and West State Streets.) The Riverview Ice House will once again be open for free ice skating throughout the night. The indoor ice rink will be available for skating with costumed characters
