## CHARLOTTESVILLE AND ALBEMARLE COUNTY: A FESTIVE & FUN WONDERLAND TO VISIT DURING THE HOLIDAYS

The holiday season is a wonderful time to visit the Charlottesville area with a plethora of activities including special evening tours at Monticello and Highland, illumination events, and First Night Virginia

**CHARLOTTESVILLE,** Va. (November 16, 2017) – The <u>Charlottesville Albemarle Convention & Visitors</u> <u>Bureau</u> (CACVB) invites everyone to consider the Charlottesville, Virginia area for a festive and entertaining holiday season.

The holiday fun starts off with several terrific Thanksgiving dinner options at various hotels and inns located throughout the region. The Charlottesville area has received numerous accolades for its culinary scene and has even been proclaimed as the "**locavore capital of the world**" by *Forbes Magazine*. Experience fine holiday dining, cozy ambiance, and luxurious accommodations at properties such as <u>The Clifton Inn</u>, <u>Keswick Hall</u>, and the <u>Boar's Head Inn</u>, all of which offer up Thanksgiving feasts to hungry visitors and locals alike. Keeping in line with the destination's rich culinary history and farm-to-table practices dating back to the days of Thomas Jefferson, ingredients for these meals are sourced locally whenever possible, which will help to make these holiday dining experiences truly unforgettable.

Lovers of holiday lights will not want to miss two popular annual events taking place in the Charlottesville area. On **November 30<sup>th</sup>** from 7:00 – 10:00 p.m., the University of Virginia will host its 17<sup>th</sup> annual **Lighting of the Lawn** event. This enchanting evening draws thousands every year to Thomas Jefferson's historic university, all in anticipation of the magical moment when the switch is flipped and The Lawn, Rotunda and all of the historic buildings making up the Academical Village begin to glow from the light of thousands of LED bulbs. The event wraps up with an orchestrated light show coordinated to music.

Taking place the very next day on **December 1<sup>st</sup>** on Charlottesville's historic pedestrian Downtown Mall is the 20<sup>th</sup> annual **Grand Illumination** event. The Grand Illumination is a holiday tradition among visitors and locals and draws hundreds of people each year to Central Place on the Downtown Mall to watch as the beautiful decorated tree begins to sparkle with more than 20,000 LED bulbs. The festivities begin at 5:30 p.m., with the tree lighting set to take place at 8:00 p.m. This family-friendly event is free and will also feature special musical performances, kids' crafts, a visit from Santa Claus, and much more. The fun will continue with a free showing of *A Christmas Story* at 8:30 p.m. at the historic **Paramount Theater**. More information about the Grand Illumination event can be found at

The Charlottesville area will once again be host to two festive holiday parades this season. The <u>Barracks</u> <u>Road Annual Holiday Parade</u> will take place on **Saturday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>** beginning at 9:30 a.m. at the Barracks Road Shopping Center. This parade route, which runs the length of the shopping center, features Santa Claus, colorful floats, costumed characters, impressive marching bands, horse-drawn carriages, and various community members. The following week, the **Wells Fargo Holiday Heritage Parade** will take place on the historic pedestrian Downtown Mall on **Saturday, December 9<sup>th</sup>** starting at 10:00 a.m. This parade is comprised of a series of decorated golf carts, all proceeding down one of the longest pedestrian malls in the country. In addition to colorful floats, there will be holiday music, marching bands, animals, Santa Claus, and even the Grinch!

The holidays are an amazing time to rediscover history in an interesting and unique way at several of the presidential homes located in the Charlottesville area. <u>Thomas Jefferson's Monticello</u> will be offering an array of special events during the holiday season, including wreath-making workshops, a free holiday open house, the 6<sup>th</sup> annual Monticello Holiday Classic 5K and Deck the Halls Kids Dash, holiday evening tours of the home which include the iconic Dome Room, and a children's woodland ornament workshop. James Monroe's Highland will be opening its doors to special evening tours on four dates in December, giving guests a unique glimpse into this presidential home. Visitors will be able to take part in cooking demonstrations on open hearths to create several different Monroe-era desserts, all enjoyed by candlelight. Guests will then receive a guided visit of the presidential guest house and museum spaces, which will be decorated for the holidays. Located a short and scenic half-hour drive northeast of Charlottesville is James Madison's former home of Montpelier, which will also be offering a special holiday-themed event. A free holiday open house will take place on **December 2<sup>nd</sup>** from 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., giving guests the opportunity to tour the Madisons' home, decorated according to 19<sup>th</sup>-century customs, and visit with James and Dolley Madison. At the David M. Rubenstein Visitor Center, guests can enjoy visits with Santa, hands-on history activities, and delicious food offerings. Located at the heart of Charlottesville's historic Downtown Mall, the historic <u>Paramount Theater</u> has several exciting and festive performances lined up for the holidays!
