

FLYING TO OMAHA

Omaha's Airport (OMA) serves 4.3 million passengers a year and offers non-stop service to more than 28 of the nation's largest airports. Ranked #1 in customer service, you'll find getting in and out of Omaha's airport is quick and easy. The airport is conveniently located 4.7 miles from downtown Omaha, so if you're renting a car, taking a cab or hopping in an Uber it will take you less than 10 minutes to get there.

GETTING AROUND

With a Car: Omaha city streets are set up on a grid system and are easy to navigate. Dodge Street divides the city north and south, and numbered streets start at the Missouri River and increase as you drive west.

Without a Car: Taxis, Ubers and Lyfts are available throughout the city. The majority of Omaha hotels offer complimentary shuttle service to and from the hotel as well as within a specific mile radius of their property.


DRIVING TO OMAHA

Let this photo inspire you to travel the road to Omaha, and experience something new.







MAP OF DOWNTOWN







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
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WELCOME TO ZOO CITY, USA

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN AS ONE OF THE BEST ZOOS IN THE WORLD, OMAHA'S HENRY DOORLY ZOO & AQUARIUM IS MORE THAN A ZOO – IT'S A BIOLOGICAL PARK DEDICATED TO CONSERVATION AND FILLED WITH YEAR-ROUND WILD KINGDOM ADVENTURES.




From the African grasslands to the jungles of South America, get ready to experience an immersive animal world jam-packed with opportunities to engage with wildlife. The best part is every visit to Omaha's Zoo means an animal, or even an entire species, may be saved through the zoo's world-class conversation efforts.

In 2018, be one of the first to experience phase one of the new \$20 million Asian Highlands exhibit – an eight-acre journey from Northern India's grasslands and the Himalayan Mountains to northeastern China's boreal forests. Upon completion of this first phase, expect to see Indian rhino, tufted deer, crane and red panda.

DESERT DOME

Explore the world's largest indoor desert under the world's largest glazed geodesic dome, an Omaha landmark. The Desert Dome stands 13 stories tall and features plant and animal life from three deserts around the world: the Namib Desert of southern Africa, the Red Center of Australia, and the Sonoran Desert of the southwest United States. Scaling cliffs are rock hyraxes, klipspringers and meerkats. Within the desert caves live 21 reptile species, including venomous snakes.




KINGDOMS OF THE NIGHT

Underneath the dome, navigate nighttime in the world's largest nocturnal exhibit filled with creatures that surface only after dark. Travel through a canyon, wind through a damp cave, travel through a bat cave and check out the world's largest indoor swamp.

LIED JUNGLE

Hike through North America's largest indoor rainforest with roaring waterfalls and swinging gibbons in a tropical environment that will transport you to the jungles of South America, Asia and Africa. See more than 90 animal species in their natural habitats, from the forest floor to the highest jungle canopy. Don't miss the swinging rope bridge, and take a picture from lookout peak with a full view of silvered leaf monkeys, ebony langurs, spotted-neck otters and pygmy hippos.





AFRICAN GRASSLANDS

Take a trip to Africa in this \$73-million, 28-acre outdoor exhibit featuring breathtaking panoramic views and long vistas teeming with African wildlife like white rhinos, cheetahs, lions and elephants. North America's largest herd room hosts elephants, zebras and impalas, and features interactive guest and keeper areas. Giraffe herd rooms have feeding platforms which provide eye-to-eye views and feeding experiences. Get up-close to lions for a great photo op on part of a '73 Land Rover, and feed and brush African pygmy goats. Tip: Ride the Skyfari for a spectacular unobstructed view of this exhibit.



SUZANNE AND WALTER SCOTT AQUARIUM

Transverse the ocean floor and come nose-to-nose with sea turtles as large sand tiger, zebra and stingray sharks circle above. The 70-foot shark tunnel inside the Scott Aquarium provides a mesmerizing underwater experience.

From the ocean depths to the frigid cold, the aquarium also features ocean birds, including more than 85 penguins. Up to 20 tons of man-made snow can be churned out in one day from four snow machines.




CHILDREN'S ADVENTURE TRAILS

This new, fully immersive outdoor exhibit is designed to allow little (and big) kids to run wild, learn and play the nature way. Its five acres include climbing areas, rafting races, underground tunnels and baby goats to pet and brush. Waterfalls, creeks and ponds are found throughout the trail, inviting kids to jump in, stay cool and hunt for treasure. Kids can climb a 40-foot-wide by three-story tall treehouse with a climbing net, bridge and monkeys scurrying above.



ALASKAN ADVENTURE

Pack swimsuits for this wildlife adventure in the Alaskan wilderness. Kids will love this splashground featuring 100 water jets and over 75 bronze sculptures of jumping salmon, puffins, sea lions, orcas and brown bears, most to-scale. The centerpiece of the exhibit is a tremendous 18-foot humpback whale. This is a can't-miss experience; open May through October.





THE DURHAM MUSEUM

HOP ABOARD HISTORY AT THIS ART DECO TRAIN STATION TURNED HANDS-ON MUSEUM.

Step back in time as you enter the museum's Great Hall. Enjoy the same grandeur that millions of rail travelers did during the train station's heyday from 1931-1971. From its terrazzo tile flooring to the ceiling's \$10,000 gold-leaf decoration, the lobby is a sight to behold. Life-like bronze statues seem to come alive with travel stories of people who once passed through the station.

Designated as a National Historic Landmark in 2017, this Omaha gem is filled with an extraordinary array of permanent exhibits including restored train cars, 1940s store fronts, numerous artifacts showing the history of the region and the Byron Reed collection, which includes some of the rarest coins and documents in the world.

If you listen closely, you'll hear the travel stories of people who may have once passed through the station from the life-like statues, ranging from couples to military men to children.





Train enthusiasts and history buffs alike will delight in The Durham Museum's offerings.

Climb aboard and stroll through historic passenger trains from the 1940s and '50s and feel what it was like to travel back in the day. Learn about the fascinating culture of the Omaha Indian tribe by stepping into a rawhide tepee or sitting by the fire in a replica earth lodge. Peek into the attic, parlor, kitchen and bedroom of blue collar workers to experience the way families lived more than 100 years ago. Walk through the Buffett Grocery Store, a replica of the original grocery operated by three generations of the storied Buffett family from 1869 to 1969, and where Omaha native Warren Buffett garnered his famed business savvy, and earned the first of his billion dollar fortune.

Satisfy your hunger for food and nostalgia at the train station's original soda fountain. Enjoy a sandwich and an old-fashioned phosphate made with your favorite flavoring and soda water straight out of the fountain dispenser. Add some hand-scooped ice cream and it becomes a luscious ice cream float (root beer also available). Malts, shakes and sundaes are also among the many favorites. The retro candy shop offers a variety of nostalgic, hard-to-find candies along with fresh popped popcorn.



THE HOLIDAYS

A magical way to celebrate the holiday season in Omaha is during Christmas at Union Station. In November and December, see the region's largest indoor Christmas tree and enjoy special events like the annual tree lighting ceremony, Ethnic Holiday Festival, a concert series, family nights with Santa and Noon Year's Eve.







HISTORIC ATTRACTIONS

EXPLORE OMAHA'S RICH AND DIVERSE HISTORY THROUGH A UNIQUE BLEND OF MUSEUMS AND HISTORIC SITES.

At Mormon Trail Center at Historic Winter Quarters, learn of the triumphs and tribulations of the great Mormon exodus of the 1800s. Experience their journey firsthand: tour a makeshift cabin, pull a handcart and "travel" by covered wagon. Optional guided tours; free admission.

World-renowned **Boys Town**, a National Historic Landmark District, features chapels, statues and gardens, Hall of History museum, Father Flanagan's House* and the visitors center – home to the world's largest ball of stamps at 600 lbs. and 4,655,000 stamps. Take the QR code tour using your smartphone for instant access to info and media of top attractions throughout the campus.

The **Strategic Air Command & Aerospace Museum** is a Smithsonian affiliate and home to the nation's largest collection of Cold War aircraft and artifacts. Its 300,000 square feet of exhibit, education, and event space features a flight simulator, children's learning center, and an impressive collection of iconic aircrafeet

Soak up Omaha's rich jazz heritage at **Love's Jazz & Arts Center**, the region's only African-American-based art
exhibit, performance and education center. Love's calendar
features live performances and special exhibits throughout
the year.













Get a glimpse into 19th century life at **General Crook House Museum***. This living history museum is Omaha's only authentic Italianate house. View period costumes, furnishings and decorative arts, and stroll the heirloom garden. Audio tours available.

Located in history-rich, culturally-diverse South Omaha, **El Museo Latino*** is one of only 17 Latino museums in the country. This intimate museum offers temporary and permanent exhibits along with educational programming and a lively events calendar.

Gerald R. Ford Birthsite and Gardens features presidential mementos, an informational kiosk and a rose garden complete with a colonnade in honor of former First Lady Betty Ford.

Another notable Omaha birthsite is that of **Malcolm X***. The 14-acre developing memorial features a plaza with a historical marker commemorating where Malcolm X first lived with his family.

Head to nearby Council Bluffs for hands-on fun at the **Union Pacific Railroad Museum***, Union Pacific's only museum. Learn about the development of the transcontinental railroad, enjoy a passenger train experience, ride in a locomotive simulator and more. Free admission

Ranked as one of the top children's museums in the country, Omaha Children's Museum makes learning a memorable adventure with more than 45,000 square feet of hands-on fun specifically designed with kids in mind. Open year-round with a variety of permanent and temporary exhibits, kids are invited to explore, play and learn.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Children of all ages enjoy the old-fashioned carousel.
- See something new each visit thanks to two temporary exhibit spaces, one on each floor.
- A family resting room with tables, chairs and couches is available for quiet resting time.
- The Rainbow Café offers kid-friendly snacks on the second floor and there's an accessible microwave in the dining area.
- The museum store offers science kits, games, books and more to keep learning at home.



A museum highlight is the mega Super Gravitron ball machine. Families love to drop in a ball, guess where it will land and track its path... leading up to a massive ball drop! Hurry to add more balls to the center before it dumps them out all over again.

Parents and kids enjoy ongoing science demonstrations including The Amazing Bubble Show and the Whiz Bang Super Science Show. Hear the fizzle, pop and BANG as soda explodes and marvel at massive bubbles dancing in the air.



TIPS FOR PARENTS WITH TODDLERS

- Make sure kids are wearing comfortable clothes. They will be climbing, playing and exploring.
- Plan for at least three hours to see the whole museum.
 Older kids might need more time. There is so much to see and do don't rush!
- When needing to nurse, give a bottle or simply have some calm time, visit the museum's family room.
- Bring exact cash for the train and the carousel! Tickets can be purchased downstairs or at the kiosk.
- When potty training, the bathroom on the first floor has small potties with handles to flush (instead of the auto flush that can scare little ones). The front desk offers diapers in a variety of sizes.



- Float down the Elkhorn River with Tubing & Adventures.
- Get a backstage pass to Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo & Aquarium. See the aquarium from the other side of the glass, view the swamp exhibit in light or work side-by-side with animal keepers.

Joslyn Art Museum is a masterpiece serving as one of the country's finest examples of Art Deco architecture. Its pink marble façade is made of 38 marbles from around the world.

Inside, admire Dale Chihuly's monumental glass sculpture on your way to the permanent collections of art ranging from ancient times to the present. View works by iconic artists Rembrandt, Monet, Degas, Pollock, Renoir and more. Major temporary exhibitions are displayed throughout the year.

Unleash your little (and inner) artist at ART WORKS, a 1,500 square feet interactive space complete with nine activity stations so you may create your own masterpieces like stop-motion animation and hi-tech paintings. Make your way outdoors to the garden galleries, notably the colorful Discovery Garden complete with 20 artworks.

Joslyn offers free admission year-round as well as mobile and guided tours. First satisfy your appetite for art, then your hunger with lunch or a snack at the Café Durham located in the Joslyn's atrium. Before leaving, stop in the Hitchcock Museum Shop and select from an array of distinctive gifts and souvenirs.

Omaha is home to an expansive selection of art and art-based centers – most of which offer free admission.



The venue operates its progressive programming by hosting innovative artists, exhibitions, performances and events. Find the organizations guiding principles, collaboration, innovation and uniqueness, in everything presented by KANEKO.

The **Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts** is another art heavy hitter. Founded by artists for artists, Bemis provides residency for creatives from around the globe. Visitors will find inspiration in the ever-changing art exhibitions featuring work from both new and seasoned artists, and innovative public programs.





Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness and Pioneer Courage Parks




For a memorable art experience, check out **Hot Shops Art Center** – named for "hot shops" featuring glass blowing, pottery and bronze casting. Over 80 studio artists welcome you to visit, explore and view this massive 92,000 square feet warehouse with displays that run the art form gamut. View evolving exhibitions at its four art galleries, create your own masterpiece at an ongoing class or workshop and attend one of their can't-miss biannual open houses.

Take a self-quided tour and discover amazing public art all throughout the city. Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness and Pioneer Courage Parks, one of the world's largest collections of bronze and stainless steel, spans five city blocks downtown and features 123 pieces and installations depicting Omaha's pioneer history. A quick walk away is the 32,000 square feet mural Fertile Ground, one of the country's largest public murals. Head east to see Monument to Labor, the second largest labor monument in the United States. With more than 400 public art displays in Omaha, we haven't scratched the surface of Omaha's art scene.

Colorful murals painted by local artists span the city, especially in Omaha's historic neighborhoods. The South Omaha Mural Project murals depict the diversity of the area. A new mural in the Florence area pays homage to the area's historic routes. See more street art in North Omaha, Downtown, North Downtown, Benson and more.

LAURITZEN GARDENS


100 ACRES OF BOTANICAL BEAUTY IN THE CITY.

Be inspired as you stroll through an urban oasis nestled in Omaha's riverfront hills. Experience a living museum of four-season plant displays in this hidden sanctuary where nature is its brilliant, colorful star.

Twenty themed gardens will rejuvenate and captivate, and extras like a conservatory, model trains and a guided tram ride will enhance your visit. Enjoy annual events like the Sweet Corn Festival, the Antique and Garden Show and the Holiday Poinsettia show, complete with a 20 feet tall poinsettia tree.

MARJORIE K. DAUGHERTY CONSERVATORY

Explore 17,500 square feet of gardens under glass in this all-seasons conservatory featuring panoramic views with flowers, unique plant life, and water features. One moment you're in the tropical gardens filled with tall palms and colorful flowers, the next you're in temperate gardens with moss-covered oak trees and azaleas. Thanks to a gradual 20-feet rise in elevation as you head north indoors, surprises await at every corner – such as a 10-feet high waterfall, a spectacular overlook of the conservatory and a pool with water lilies. At the end, sweet reward: an overlook of the Missouri River valley and entrance to the garden's century-old bur oak forest.

LARGER THAN LIFE

Union Pacific Railroad's Centennial No. 6900 and Big Boy 4023, two of the most powerful locomotives ever built, greet visitors to Omaha at nearby Kenefick Park, perched on a hill overlooking Interstate 80.



MODEL RAILROAD GARDEN

Listen closely while in the gardens to hear the clickety-clack of tiny trains traveling twiggy trestles. This handcrafted garden is made of all natural materials like twigs, berries, pinecones and cinnamon sticks. It is punctuated with reproductions of landmarks and countrysides.





OUTDOOR RECREATION

OMAHA IS A HAVEN FOR OUTDOOR ENTHUSIASTS.

Plan for plenty of rejuvenating fresh-air experiences across the city thanks to miles and miles of tree-lined walking and biking trails, five area lakes and two rivers, and an array of parks, gardens and green spaces.

Stop and Stay a While

Omaha campgrounds and RV parks are conveniently located close to major interstates, highways and on the outskirts of the city near rivers and lakes. Each one promises a peaceful and picturesque place to spend the night.

Give Your Fitbit a Workout, Too

Recharge while taking in the sights and sounds of the great outdoors. **Fontenelle Forest**, a National Natural Landmark and a National Historic District, offers 19 miles of walking trails and 1,400 acres of more than 600 unique species of plants and animals. Visit its Raptor Wildlife Refuge and get up close and personal with hawks, owls, falcons and other birds of prey, and transverse swinging bridges – all 30 feet above the forest floor. Sunrise and sunset canoe rides offer a fabulous way to soak up the seasons. In the winter, rent snowshoes on site and discover a nature wonderland filled with furry creatures.

More than 85 miles of paved, interconnected trails make it easy for the active traveler to transverse the city. If scenery is important, find solace at trails around **Zorinsky, Carter and Glenn Cunningham Lakes**.







Thrill seekers should head to **Mount Crescent Ski Area**. In the winter, hit the slopes reaching up to 2,400 feet in length; sledders, snowboarders and spectators are welcome. In the summer and fall, zip down one of the country's longest ziplines, the Screaming Eagle.

Find year round fun for the entire family in a lush setting at **Eugene T. Mahoney State Park**. Nestled along the Platte River, the 700-acre park offers warm weather activities like miniature golf and driving range, tennis, horseback riding, hiking, paddle boating and fishing, along with cold weather fun like cross-country skiing, sledding and tobogganing, ice skating and ice fishing.

Leave the Boat at Home

Water's never far in Omaha. Check out **Driftwood Paddleboard Adventures** and its stand-up paddleboard tours, which are a fun way to explore Omaha lakes in a more active way. For a more leisurely experience, try tubing or tanking down the Elkhorn River. To figure out which way to float, first determine how wet you're willing to get. Tanking entails riding in an 8-feet diameter stock tank complete with custom made picnic tables, while tubing is more of an all-in experience involving sitting in a commercial grade inner tube. Or hop aboard one of the **Bryson Airboat Tours** and take off on a 60 mph wind-in-your-hair trip down the river.

A Birdwatching Paradise

Located along the wooded Missouri River Valley and along a main migratory path, Omaha is a birding hotspot. Spring and fall are peak birding seasons, but because the area offers diverse birding habitat – lakes, prairies, woodlands and riverbanks – a variety of bird species can be found most any time of year. **Fontenelle Forest**, Omaha's lakes, and **Boyer Chute National Wildlife Refuge** north of Omaha are great places to bring the binoculars for birding.

GOLF

Rolling hills and tree lined fairways punctuated with water hazards and sand traps ensure each course has its own character and competitive challenges. From executive style to championship courses, swing your way through Omaha's unique golf landscape.

For years, the Great Omaha Steak Debate has kept visitors and locals discussing where to find the most mouth-watering steak. With plenty of restaurants offering a succulent variety of the beloved meat, everyone enjoys the hunt. So who serves up the best steak? It's your pilgrimage to make, but here are a couple of the classics.

The Drover is a landmark chophouse and home to whiskeymarinated certified Angus beef steak. After enjoying a bourbon at the bar, savor your meal in the cozy dining area complete with candlelight and fireplace.











It's only appropriate that Warren Buffett is a steak-eater. At **Gorat's**, an Omaha institution of more than 70 years, look to a neighboring table and you may just see the Omaha billionaire savoring a steak, too.

RAISING REUBEN

OMAHA HAS BEEN RAISING REUBEN SINCE THE BEGINNING. THAT'S RIGHT, THE SANDWICH WE ALL KNOW AND LOVE WAS BORN RIGHT HERE.

We don't care what New Yorkers say – the Reuben sandwich was created in Omaha and that's not up for debate. During a late-night poker game at the **Blackstone Hotel**, a local grocer was asked to "ante up" and create a new dish. The ingredients he had on hand resulted in an American menu staple.

How do you create a national treasure? You start with two pieces of grilled marble rye and stuff it with slow cooked corned beef topped with sauerkraut, bubbly Swiss cheese and creamy Russian or Thousand Island dressing. Omaha continues to perfect the classic while local restaurants add their own unique spin.



A FEW TASTY TAKES ON THIS OMAHA CLASSIC:

Brazen Head Irish Pub's Rachel Reuben is made with tender smoked turkey, sauerkraut, Thousand Island dressing and Havarti cheese all between the traditional marble rye.

Barrett's Barleycorn Pub & Grill takes the classic approach of corned beef, swiss cheese, sauerkraut and Thousand Island dressing on grilled rye.

Goldberg's in Dundee's Montana Reuben uses oven roasted turkey topped with Swiss cheese and creamy coleslaw as a fun twist.

The Drover's Reuben swaps out the corned beef for a mound of slow roasted prime rib covered in melted Swiss cheese, creamy dressing and sauerkraut.

Across the street from the Blackstone Hotel is the **Crescent Moon**, a local favorite still serving the original recipe.

The Reuben has been a menu staple at the **Dundee Dell** since 1934. Choose from corned beef or turkey and taste test their super-secret sauce.



RISE AND SHINE IN OMAHA WITH BREAKFAST OPTIONS THAT WILL HAVE YOU CRAVING MORE MORNING GRUB ALL DAY LONG.

Whether rooted in nostalgia or loved simply for its hearty nature, classic breakfast fare holds a special place in everyone's hearts. Prepare to make food memories in Omaha.

Harold's Koffee House is known for homemade doughnuts and the Suzi Special – a plate overflowing with grilled onions, hash browns and two scrambled eggs (locals recommend adding cheese and gravy). Float into foodie heaven with hash browns, eggs and biscuits smothered in creamy sausage gravy with Lisa's Radial Café's signature breakfast dish, The Rafeet Meanwhile, 11-Worth Café serves up large portions of fluffy omelets and hash browns cooked to golden perfection.

Sure, steak's in Omaha's DNA, but we also celebrate all things pork. FACT: Breakfast is better with bacon. Two Omaha favorites claim to serve the best – you be the judge. **The Diner** is a '50s style eatery slinging morning grub and thick-cut bacon slathered in a secret maple brown sugar rub (which they also sell in-house). **Bailey's** specialties include an array of eggs benedict dishes and fresh, crispy bacon.

Brunch is more than a meal – it's an experience. So grab your friends, come hungry and keep the mimosas coming.

Brunch menus get a chef's touch in Omaha. Railcar Modern American Kitchen has perfected dishes both sweet and savory, from lemon ricotta pancakes with zest to prime rib and artichoke potato pancakes. Over Easy whips up farmfresh favs with artistic flair, including homemade pop tarts and an elevated take on chicken and waffles – chicken with rosemary and garlic waffles topped with coriander honey. Shake up your Sunday at Le Bouillon, whose abbreviated brunch menu includes house pastries, Wagyu steak and eggs and German pancakes.

One of the best parts about brunch is the libations. **Mantra** understands the importance of drinks before noon with the Nutty Irishman (Bailey's and Frengelico with coffee) and Peach Bellintini (peach schnapps and vodka and champagne). Take in **Baela Rose's** cool, historic wood interiors as you sip Iced Irish Coffee and bottomless mimosas. Across the river in Council Bluffs, **Caddy's Grill** serves up a Meal in a Mug Bloody Mary complete with a slider, hard-boiled egg, bacon, chicken wings, beef jerky and more.

DIVES

IN OMAHA, BEING A DIVE IS A BADGE OF HONOR.

Foodies can answer the call of the wild at **Alpine Inn**, where the fried chicken is loved by everyone. Evening diners (okay, raccoons) sit outside the restaurant's windows feasting on chicken scraps – now that's what we call entertainment.

California Tacos and More is a beloved college joint featured on the Food Network's *Diners, Drive-ins and Dives.* "Cali Taco" is known for its signature tacos (housemade fried, puffy taco shells stuffed with meet and fixings) and entrees with Mexican flair.

Big Mama's Kitchen is another Diners, Drive-ins and Dives alumnus and was featured on the Travel Channel's 101 Tastiest Places to Chow Down. Omaha's soul food queen, Big Mama, is known for dishes like the Afro Burger, Pig Ear Sandwich, oven-fried chicken and sweet potato pie ice cream.

Food trucks are sprinkled throughout the city and offer a variety of portable eats, from casual to chef-driven.

Quick and convenient is great, but some dishes need to be conquered. **Stella's Bar & Grill's** Stellanator, weighing in at 4.5 lbs. and 4,900 calories, includes six burger patties, six fried eggs, six pieces of cheese, 12 pieces of bacon, lettuce, tomato, fried onions, pickles, jalapeños and peanut butter. Defeat the Stellanator in 45 minutes, and pay nothing for it. Stella's has only seen 28 successful takedowns (587 have lost) – that's a 4 percent success rate. Bring on the meat sweats!

A saucy challenge awaits at **Fat BBQ Shack**. "The Shack" is known for a variety of smoked and barbecued meats, but perhaps the most challenging dish is the Shack Attack: layers of fresh cut fries loaded with your choice of toppings.

A less challenging but equally delicious meal can be found at **The Surfside Club**. Here's the short and sweet menu: chicken, pork tenderloin, catfish, and corn fritters – all fried, and all delicious. Located 25 feet from the Missouri River, Surfside offers a relaxing atmosphere fit for casual food feasting.

Stop for a cozy and portable runza, aka "a meal in a bunza" at **Runza**. A local favorite and Nebraska invention, the runza is a pocket of dough filled with beef, cabbage, seasonings, and sometimes cheese. They're so popular, out-of-towners order them by the case and take them home.

Bronco's, another Omaha fast-food tradition, opened nearly 60 years ago when "fast food" was still a new concept. Known for its 100 percent ground beef burgers, Bronco's still makes its French fries daily from fresh whole potatoes.



At Omaha's **Kitchen Table** visitors are treated to culinary concoctions such as the Focaccia pizza topped with roasted broccoli, fresh mozzarella and a creamy vodka sauce. Friendly owners Colin and Jessica will proudly tell you about each locally sourced ingredient.

Known for wood-fired Neapolitan pizza bursting with local flavor, **Dante's Ristorante** is a true experience with a full menu of rustic Italian faire and perfectly paired vinos. Considered one of the greenest restaurants in the country, **The Grey Plume's** award-winning chef and owner Clayton Chapman maintains the vision of a fine dining experience where food is art – even the plates are created by local artists.

The Boiler Room, located in a refurbished industrial space in Omaha's Old Market Entertainment District, features farm-fresh foods in a unique presentation that makes for a distinct culinary experience. **Modern Love** inspires vegans from across the country to plan their foodie excursions to Omaha. Popular vegan cooking personality Isa Chandra Moskowitz leads with the focus of providing "swanky vegan comfort food" made with local ingredients.

Cake fans will find their match at *Cupcake Wars* contestant **Jones Bros. Cupcakes**, where quality ingredients like Madagascar Bourbon Vanilla and Vermont Butter are mainstay. Doughnut enthusiasts will love the thrill of the chase as **Scratch Baking Co.** sells their goods pop-up style in historic buildings and small businesses across the city.









Specialty ice cream is popular, no matter the season. Coneflower Creamery crafts their artisanal ice cream and cold treats from locally sourced milk, cream and fruit, with nearly all else (down to the sprinkles) made in-house. Ted & Wally's slow churns super-premium made from scratch ice cream with 18 percent butterfat and all-natural ingredients for fresh seasonal flavors made daily. Mail order favorite eCreamery serves 16 staple flavors of specialty ice cream, gelato and dairy-free sorbet in-store; customize your own flavor from home at eCreamery.com.

Tip: Chocolate's an excellent souvenir. Old Market Candy Shop whips up an array of chocolate confections, much to onlookers' delight, including "mud ball" truffles, "chicken legs," and fudge made with housemade cream and butter. Find whimsical chocolate covered cherries at The Cordial Cherry, where artwork has never looked (nor tasted) so delicious. Hollywood Candy will thrill the kid at heart with retro candies, homemade fudge and chocolates, an authentic soda fountain, and savory sweet snacks like chocolate covered bacon and potato chips.

Downtown Omaha is a business person, culture lover and energetic sports fan. It's the central hub of entertainment in the city, pulsating with live music, art, history and sporting events. Hot spots include: CenturyLink Center Omaha, the city's convention center and arena; TD Ameritrade Park, Omaha's 24,000-seat downtown stadium; and the historic Old Market Entertainment District with cobblestone streets lined with unique boutiques, galleries, home-grown restaurants, pubs and street performers.



Central Omaha is the hip, edgy kid with creative flair and a discerning palate. From the Benson neighborhood and its indie rock club to the Dundee District known for its culinary delights, this part of the city fuses old and new. Further west is Aksarben Village, filled with live entertainment throughout the year.

North Omaha is the history buff who wants to experience the past. Home to Omaha's oldest community, Florence, this area pays tribute to the city's pioneer days and the Mormon migration of the 1800s. North Omaha is also the place to catch the heritage of jazz, where Duke Ellington, Count Basie and other great jazz artists once played.







Southwest Omaha is a fun-loving, free spirit with a keen sense of style. Avid shoppers are encouraged to bring an extra suitcase and a pair of comfy walking shoes. The Shops of Legacy is a collection of eclectic Omaha exclusive shops and restaurants. Ranging from upscale to casual, Legacy is a must-see (and shop... and eat) spot. Slow down and unwind at Zorinsky Lake – offering fishing, boating, paddleboard yoga and recreational activities all year long.

Take a breather from all the fun and indulge in area history. Aksarben Village stands where the bustling Ak-Sar-Ben Race Track (1919-1995) and Coliseum once did. Its celebrated history is punctuated in Stinson Park with a bronze figure marking the grave of Omaha, the 1935 Triple Crown winner. FUN FACT: Aksarben is "Nebraska" spelled backwards.



Two craft breweries, **Farnam House Brewing** and **Scriptown Brewery**, have added to Omaha's growing reputation as a craft beer city, and each offer a unique experience. Not to be ignored, **Corkscrew Wine & Cheese** serves a variety of vino for every palate. **Coneflower Creamery** offers farm-to-cone ice cream in out-of-this-world flavors. A typical order consists of two scoops, and some visitors may be tempted to "be good" and only order one. We know from experience... everyone wants the second scoop.













Nite Owl is the quirky, cool craft cocktail bar with a late night food menu featuring thick burgers, salty fries and fresh salads until 2 a.m. **Blackstone Meatball** takes an Italian-American classic and adds locally-sourced twists... these aren't your mamma's meatballs. **Mula** is Blackstone's ultratrendy Mexican restaurant and certified tequileria. **Noli's Pizzeria** and **Dante Ristorante Pizzeria** serve up fresh New York-style and wood-fire pizzas, respectively. 

After dinner tip: Burn off post-meal calories and find unique souvenirs at **Hello Holiday**, **Denim Saloon** and **Scout**.



The North Omaha neighborhood where jazz greats like Duke Ellington, Count Basie and others once played. Today, the notes from live jazz performances still float through air from **Love's Jazz and Arts Center**, dedicated to preserving and showcasing all types of African-American art. **The Union for Contemporary Arts** is another opportunity to enjoy modern art in many forms. Civil Rights leader **Malcolm X** was born in Omaha; his birth site includes a historic marker and an events plaza.

For soul food, check out **Big Mama's Kitchen** and order up a pig ear sandwich and sweet potato pie ice cream. Big Mama's has become a television culinary staple, featured on Food Network's *Diners, Drive-Ins and Dives*, Sundance Channel's *Ludo Bites America* and Travel





Channel's 101 Tastiest Places to Chow Down. Fair Deal Cafe offers southern soul food favorites like smothered chicken, beans and rice, and homemade cornbread. Another soul food home run is the Omaha Rockets Kanteen, known for pitching delicious and healthy variations on classic Southern "comfort" food. The Omaha eatery also pays homage to the African-American players of the Omaha Rockets independent baseball team.

History buffs will spend hours exploring the historic Florence neighborhood and touching American history. Experience firsthand the Mormon migration of the 1840s at the Mormon Trail Center at Historic Winter Quarters. Pull a handcart like pioneers did all those years ago, and see what it was like to live in a makeshift cabin and travel by covered wagon.

A bit north is the **Florence Mill**, constructed in 1846
as Mormon pioneers made
their westward trek. Today
it is home to a non-profit **Winter Quarters Mill Museum**, **ArtLoft** gallery,
and a Sunday farmers
market. Open spring
through fall.

Fitting in the culinary theme of the rest of the city, the Florence neighborhood serves up major comfort food with local favorites such as Harold's Koffee House, Enzo's Italian and Tussey's Casual Grill.

OLD MARKET


THIS LIVELY 20-SQUARE BLOCK AREA IS UNIQUELY OMAHA AND FILLED WITH NOSTALGIA AND INNOVATION.

Cobblestone streets lined with unique boutiques, antique emporiums, innovative restaurants, local pubs and tasty sweet shops create the magic of the Old Market Entertainment District.

The Old Market and its red brick warehouses were the epicenter of activity back in the 1880s, bustling with produce dealers, buyers and traders, until the late 1950s when the area was threatened with building condemnation. But Sam Mercer, the son of a prominent physician and landowner, wanted to renovate the old buildings for new uses. At the time, Mercer's idea was said to be foolish; today he is considered a visionary. See a true merging of old and new, like a brew pub inside a 1903 firehouse and a contemporary art center inside a former grocery warehouse.

Tip: Most of downtown Omaha hotels are within walking distance and offer complimentary shuttle service to and from the Old Market.

Mud Balls: Bet you can't eat just one of these delicious chocolate-coated cookie and cream cheese truffles at the **Old Market Candy Shop**.

Pez: One of the largest Pez candy dispenser collections known to man can be found at **Hollywood Candy**.

Carriage Rides: Take a nostalgic ride in and around the Old Market on a horse-drawn carriage. Rides range from 10 minutes to one hour.

Taste of Tiki: **Laka Lona Rum Club** welcomes patrons to paradise with a playful atmosphere and over-the-top fun craft cocktails.

Passion for Fashion: **Pretty in Patina** stocks new and gently loved vintage merchandise. Christian Louboutin shoes and Louis Vuitton bag, anyone?

Cheesecake by the Inch: Turtle fudge, cherry and key lime are just a few of the fabulous flavors of cheesecake you can order by the inch at **Wheatfields Eatery & Bakery**.

Christmas 24/7: Check out **Tannenbaum Christmas Shop**, where every day is Christmas.

#1 Bacon: **The Diner** serves up thick-cut bacon cooked with a secret brown sugar glaze.

Dozens of family-owned restaurants line the intricately tiled sidewalks of South 24th Street. Enjoy savory slow-cooked chicken enchiladas, fiery roasted jalapeños and carne asada (marinated and grilled thinly sliced steak) at a handful of eateries. Afterwards, grab a yo-yo (a traditional Latino pastry) or artisan bread at the **International Bakery**. Don't forget about margaritas; **El Alamo**, **Gauca Maya** and elsewhere in "South O," are known for serving up a mean cocktail.

El Museo Latino celebrates the area's rich diversity with exhibits and programs, where special events include performances by "CHOMARI" Ballet Folklorico Mexicano.

Apollon Art Space is Omaha's multi-genre arts and entertainment venue offering locally produced art exhibits, improv shows and "Drink 'n Draw" classes. Don't miss the themed, interactive dinners allowing the audience to get into character and join in the fun. South Omaha Museum works to preserve and display the past and present of the "Magic City" with rotating exhibits on the area's stockyard history, Cinco de Mayo, architecture and more.




Rural in nature and peppered with Main Street appeal, history and surprises seem to pop out of nowhere. More than 30 unique cities, villages and townships make up Saunders County.
