Ski Areas in the Poconos Get a Boost from Fresh Snowfall Nor'easter hits the Pocono Mountains, giving a fresh 12"+ of powder

POCONO MOUNTAINS, PA, March 8, 2018 - Over one foot of snow has fallen across the <u>Pocono Mountains</u> region this Tuesday into Wednesday, giving a boost to the late winter season.

Despite a rough recovery from Winter Storm Riley, road and electricity crews have been working around the clock this past week to restore power and clear debris across the area. Though some residences are still experiencing difficulties, crews continue to work on getting everything back to normal. Resorts in the Poconos have showed their sincere hospitality in challenging times, like Mount Airy Casino last Friday; providing shelter, blankets, water, and warmth to over 150 stranded motorists.

This new snowfall has provided optimal conditions for <u>ski and snow activities</u> in the Pocono Mountains. Visitors can <u>ski</u> and <u>snowboard</u> on over 185 slopes and trails with varying difficulty, take on a terrain park, or even get on the slopes for the first time with a lesson. A number of <u>ski events</u> are happening in the upcoming weeks, like <u>Costume</u> <u>Carnival Day</u> at <u>Shawnee Mountain Ski Area</u> and <u>Camelback Mountain's Parking Lot Party</u>.

<u>Snow tubing</u> is the easiest way to hit the slopes and enjoy the fresh snowfall! Snow tubing in the Poconos requires no special skills or equipment and is appropriate for almost everyone. Try galactic, family, or single -style tubing.

Snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, sleigh rides, and snowshoeing are all activities that visitors can experience in the

region.
