## Save the Date: May event in Hillsborough will mark the anniversary of the end of segregation in Orange County, NC Schools

Hillsborough, NC - (April 3, 2018)-- When the Class of 1968 marched down the aisle to get their diplomas, they were the last group of students to graduate from Central High School, the school for Black youth of Orange County, located in Hillsborough, NC. After this, children of color would attend Orange High School, which formerly had been the school for white students.

2018 marks the 50th Anniversary of the closing of Central High School, and the official end of segregated schools in Orange County and to acknowledge this milestone, Free Spirit Freedom (a 501 C3 project of the Hillsborough Arts Council), together with, the Central/Orange Alumni Association will host a gospel concert to celebrate the **50**<sup>th</sup> **Reunion of the Class of 1968**, and the toppling of the walls of segregation in public education.

The celebration is **Sunday, May 20, 2018** from 2 pm – 5 pm at the outdoor Farmer's Market Pavilion, 144 E. Margaret Lane in Downtown Hillsborough. Some seating will be provided, but bring lawn chairs and shading. Enjoy free refreshments and music.

"Local singing groups, choirs and musicians will carry us from the days of slavery, through the Jim Crow era, through the Civil Rights Movement and today," said Dr. Freddie L. Parker, member of the Central/Orange Alumni Association.

"The memories of the transition era may be bittersweet, yet we, as a people, have struggled, we have achieved, and we shall rejoice," said Renee A. Price, cofounder of Free Spirit Freedom.
