There's No Crying in Baseball, or Rockford, IL, as City Rings in 75th Anniversary of the Rockford Peaches

Celebrate the anniversary of the team made famous in "A League of Their Own," May 30 – June 3

ROCKFORD, **ILLINOIS** – This week kicks off a **multi-day series of events** to celebrate the **75**th **anniversary of the Rockford Peaches**, the team made famous in the movie, "A League of Their Own," and bring attention to the historic significance of women's baseball.

The family-friendly anniversary events are organized by the International Women's Baseball Center (IWBC) in partnership with the Friends of Beyer Stadium. The celebration marks the beginning of a capital campaign to build a \$7 million IWBC educational center and museum next to Beyer Stadium, located at 245 15th Avenue, Rockford, where the Rockford Peaches played from 1943-1954.

The events begin on Wednesday, May 30 – the 75th anniversary to the day of the first All-American Girls Professional Baseball League games that took place in Rockford and Racine, Wisc. The Rockford Peaches was one of only two teams that played in every season of the league and holds the distinction of having won more league championships than any other team (winning four times, in 1945, 1948, 1949 and 1950).

"We're thrilled about the momentous celebration to honor the legacy of the Rockford Peaches, raise funds to support the creation of the IWBC educational center, and further cement Rockford as the international home of women's baseball," said Rockford Mayor Tom McNamara. "Batters, do you hear that call? Rockford's celebrating the Peaches and all are welcome to join in on the fun."

The Rockford Peaches team was one of the first four teams in the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League, which formed in 1943 when many baseball players were away during World War II. All events are free except the May 30 event at the Coronado and fees for participating in the Sunday, June 3 home run derby.

The Women's Baseball World Cup Trophy Tour also kicks off here as it makes its way to Viera, Fla., for the August event, and Ila Borders, the first woman to start in a men's professional baseball game, along with other officials from the World Baseball Softball Confederation, will attend.
- Tickets start at \$25 in advance for adults; \$10 for children under 12; and children under 6 are free.

Stars from "A League of Their Own" will team up with 75th Anniversary Celebration sponsors and community leaders on a Celebrity Team against the Rockford Starfires Women's Baseball Team.

- <u>Home Run Derby and Closing Ceremony</u> 8 a.m. 6 p.m. @ Beyer Stadium Free to Attend; Fee to Participate (T-ball to adult 50+)
- Children (T-ball) to adult (50+) paid entries will vie for "star" in various age categories. The day
 concludes with the first-ever competition pitting Firefighters vs. Policemen in a friendly rivalry at the
 plate.
- All entries receive a Certificate of Participation. Trophies and medallions will be awarded at the Closing Ceremony of the Rockford Peaches 75th Anniversary Celebration.
