> **Pennsylvania House of Representatives Tourism & Recreational Development Committee Visits the Poconos** *Representatives get a taste of Pocono hospitality and various tourist hotspots*



POCONO MOUNTAINS, PA, June 6, 2018 – The Pennsylvania House of Representatives Tourism & Recreational Development Committee experienced a tour of the <u>Pocono Mountains</u> this past week for three days; May 30 – June 1. The first day, Representatives arrived at <u>Camelback Lodge & Aquatopia Indoor Waterpark</u>, where they stayed overnight Wednesday and Thursday. They were treated to a delicious dinner at Trails End Pub & Grille after a tour of the grounds. Arthur Berry III, Owner & President of Camelback Mountain Resort spoke to the group about the importance of tourism to the region. Senator Mario Scavello was also in attendance. Senator Scavello presented Chris Barrett, President/CEO of the Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau, an official document from the Senate recognizing May 6 – 12, 2018 "Tourism Week" and May 7, 2018 as "Tourism Day."

On Thursday, Representatives were transported by Martz Trailways from Camelback Mountain Resort to <u>Kalahari</u> <u>Resorts & Conventions</u>, where they were given a tour and treated to lunch at <u>B-Lux Grill & Bar</u>. Following, the group hopped back on the bus to head to <u>Shawnee Inn & Golf Resort</u> where they got a tour of their island luxury "glamping" site, garden, and golf course. Next, the Representatives were able to take in the beauty of <u>Bushkill Falls</u>, also known as the "Niagara of Pennsylvania." Finally, the group was bussed to <u>Skytop Lodge</u>, where they viewed the gorgeous property and ended the night with a family-style dinner.

Friday's fun began in Jim Thorpe. The committee met at the Jim Thorpe Visitors Center, explored the town, and then boarded the <u>Lehigh Gorge Scenic Railway</u>. To finish the trip, Representative Doyle Heffley led the group to <u>Asa Packer</u> <u>Mansion</u> for a final tour and a taste of Pocono history.
