KUDDLES FOR KIDS

USBC Helps Children in Need with Plush Toy Animals being donated to Onondaga County Sheriff's Office and McMahon Ryan Child Advocacy Center

Syracuse, NY (June 12, 2018) - Kids in need in Onondaga County will begin receiving gifts of comfort from the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Kuddles for Kids Program. During the USBC Open Championships currently being held in Syracuse at the Oncenter Convention Center, participating bowlers have been invited to purchase and donate a plush toy dog for local children in need.

"It is a simple concept of giving back to the local community," said MainGate Director of Marketing Mark Higdon. "It is a way for 2018 Open bowlers to show support for First Responders, and to give a child in a traumatic situation an item that will give them comfort."

Customers in the USBC Bowling Store have the option of purchasing Kuddles to take home with them, or for an additional \$10 (plus tax) they can gift Kuddles to the local Syracuse First Responders. The customer is then walked outside of the store and given the opportunity to add their Kuddles to the doghouse, filling it over the past weeks to the level you see today. To date, nearly 150 Kuddles plush dogs have been purchased for donation.
