Two Illinois Bicentennial Events Spotlight Rockford Area Historical Landmarks

Doors Open and Illinois' 200th Anniversary Celebration honor the iconic Lake Peterson House and Barnes Mansion

ROCKFORD, IL — This weekend two Rockford area historical sites and architectural treasures prepare to celebrate **Doors Open Illinois** in conjunction with the Illinois Office of Tourism and other partners throughout Illinois. On **Saturday, August 25** and **Sunday, August 26** SwedishAmerican's **Lake Peterson House** and Burpee Museum of Natural History's **Barnes Mansion** will have their doors open to the public for educational tours. This is a great opportunity for visitors to learn more about these historic buildings and the Rockford region's heritage.

"We are very proud to showcase two of our beloved historic landmarks during Illinois' Bicentennial celebration. The Rockford region is known for having beautiful architectural buildings that tell remarkable stories of our past and the events this weekend give us the opportunity to show a couple of them off to the public in such a fun way," said Andrea Cook, RACVB associate director of marketing & communications.

Events include:

SwedishAmerican's Lake Peterson House

Address: 1313 East State Street, Rockford, IL Tour Hours: Saturday 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. and Sunday 11 a.m. – 2 p.m. Description: Tour this 1800s Victorian Gothic Revival home that is owned and maintained by SwedishAmerican Hospital. The house is a significant example of Gothic Revival architecture and is considered one of the finest such homes in the state of Illinois.

Lake Peterson House has received recognition from the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution and in 1974 won an Eye Delight award for refurbishing. The house was entered in the National Register of Historic Places on June 25, 1980. On August 27, 1982, it received an Approval of Historic Preservation Certificate. Since 1983, the Lake Peterson House has served as the offices for the president, senior vice president and other members of the SwedishAmerican executive staff.

Address: 737 North Main Street, Rockford, IL

Tour Hours: Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Description: Leading furniture manufacturer in Rockford, the Barnes built the home in the 1890s as one of the most opulent homes in Rockford. The William Fletcher Barnes family home features 15 rooms, a turret, two porticos and hand carved solid cherry paneling in the foyer. Join us in a never open to the public space as we reveal the beauty of Illinois living in the Rock River Valley's Victorian age.

In addition to the Doors Open program, Burpee Museum of Natural History will honor **Illinois' 200th anniversary** alongside the Illinois Office of Tourism and local convention and visitors bureaus by hosting a **Bicentennial Birthday Cake Celebration** on **Sunday, August 26, Constitution Day**. Chicago-based Illinois Made maker, <u>Eli's Cheesecake</u>, will provide cheesecake slices at no cost for the first 200 people that visit the museum between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. This will be on a first come, first-served basis.
