ON ISLAND TIME

The Talented MR. WRIGLEY

It's anniversary season at **Catalina Island** ([visitcatalinaisland.com](http://visitcatalinaisland.com)) as the storied destination toasts 100 years since its purchase by chewing gum magnate William Wrigley Jr. "The Catalina Island Company is proud to celebrate such a pivotal time in the history of Catalina Island, [as] many significant accomplishments [have been made] over the past century," says Randall Herrell, president and CEO. "The continued success and popularity of Catalina Island as a resort destination is a testament to Wrigley's enduring legacy." Look back on that iconic legacy via two new guided tours—Wrigley's Catalina and Magnificent Mt. Ada (tickets \$38 to \$70). Highlights include a look at the Catalina Country Club (which originally housed Wrigley's Chicago Cubs and the Bobby

Jones trophy); the Catalina Chimes Tower (a 1925 gift from the Wrigleys that sounds every 15 minutes to this day); plus the chance to go inside Mt. Ada, the former Wrigley mansion, where a three-course lunch is on offer. The good eats continue with era-appropriate fare and beverages from the 1920s and 1930s at a variety of restaurants on the island—think chicken consommé at Avalon Grille and baked Pacific swordfish à la Creole at Mt. Ada. And for an even deeper dive, Catalina Island Museum will also host *Wrigley's Catalina: A Centennial Celebration* through Jan. 19, 2020. The special exhibition allows visitors to follow the timeline of the legend's communal contributions. Up next: the reopening of Hotel Atwater in August, an homage to Helen Atwater Wrigley.

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
