Michigan State High School Clay Target League 2019 State Tournament in Mason this Saturday

LANSING, Mich.— The Greater Lansing Sports Authority is pleased to welcome the Michigan State High School Clay Target League's 2019 State Tournament to the Michigan Trapshooting Association Grounds in Mason, Michigan on Saturday June 15, 2019.

More than 60 high school teams from across the state featuring over 900 student athletes, along with over two thousand spectators, are expected to attend the 2019 State Tournament event.

This tournament is the only event during the year that all League participants are invited to attend and compete at the same venue. Individuals will compete within their assigned shooting skill classification based on their year-end season average.
