Hawai'i Convention Center to Host the National Medical Association Annual Convention and Scientific Assembly for Third Time

The convention will feature several major presenters, including U.S. Surgeon General Jerome Adams

Honolulu, July 26, 2019 – The Hawai'i Convention Center is hosting the National Medical Association (NMA) Annual Convention and Scientific Assembly, running tomorrow through Wednesday. It is the third time the convention has been held at the Center, following meetings in 2007 and 2014, and it is expected to draw 2,000 attendees with an estimated \$9.4 million in statewide visitor spending.

The NMA has served as the collective voice for African American physicians and a force for parity and justice in healthcare since 1895. It is the first time that two major U.S. medical organizations are concurrently being led by African American women – Niva Lubin-Johnson, M.D., president of NMA; and Patrice A. Harris, M.D., M.A., president of the American Medical Association (AMA).

Conference highlights include:

- Jerome Adams, who has served as U.S. Surgeon General since September 2017, will be a special guest for the conference opening and awards ceremony tomorrow from 7-8:30 p.m. at the Hilton Hawaiian Village Coral Ballrooms 4 and 5. The event is free and open to all conference attendees.
- The Council on Concerns of Women Physicians' Annual Muriel Petioni, M.D. Awards Program will be held Sunday from 11:30 a.m.-2 p.m. at the Hawai'i Convention Center Kalakaua Ballroom B. The event is \$125 per person onsite and is open to all conference attendees. Melissa Harris-Perry, Maya Angelou presidential chair at Wake Forest University, TV host, author and political commentator, will give the keynote address.
- Walk a Mile with a Child, a free public event that promotes health and wellness for children and their families, will be held at the Hilton Hawaiian Village Tapa Tower Tapa Ballroom and Waikiki Beach tomorrow from 7:30-11:30 a.m. The event features a limbo contest, relay run, exercise sessions, breakfast and more, organized by the nonprofit Mentoring in Medicine, Inc. - The University of Hawai'i Cancer Center will be conducting a session on its Tomosynthesis Mammographic Imaging Screening Trial (TMIST), which addresses cancer disparities, on Tuesday from 7-9 a.m.

The conference, with a theme of "Continuing the Fight of Opioid Addiction through Prevention, Education, and Behavioral Therapies in African American Communities," will feature a variety of presentation theaters covering
