Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art

One of the country's foremost art museums, Crystal Bridges' permanent collection holds five centuries of works from American masters and gems from lesser-known artists dating from colonial times to the present. The collection is displayed on a rotating basis, and temporary exhibitions run year-round, so there is always something new to see, inside and out.

This fall, Crystal Bridges will host three new experiences: a new acquisition, *Infinity Mirrored Room—My Heart is Dancing into the Universe* by Yayoi Kusama; *Crystals in Art: Ancient to Today*, a new exhibition exploring the connections between crystals and art throughout the world; and North Forest Lights, an immersive nighttime light experience created exclusively for Crystal Bridges.

The building — a work of art itself — sits on 120 wooded acres, with a sculpture-filled trail that leads back to the downtown square.

The Walmart Museum

The tour concludes in The Spark Café Soda Fountain, where you can grab a scoop of ice cream – the way it was meant to be.
