HUNDREDS OF VOLUNTEERS PICK UP THE POCONOS

2nd Annual Pick Up the Poconos Day a Success

October 2, 2019 – In its second year, Pick Up the Poconos Day (9/28/19) saw legions of volunteers fan out throughout our communities and clear litter from the sides of the roads. Crews found all sorts of discarded trash including a pool, toaster oven, refrigerator and a futon not to mention enough car parts to build a new vehicle.

Middle Smithfield Township's "1000 Feet of Street" hauled away upwards of 400 bags of trash with roughly 180 volunteers. There was also a huge response from the East Stroudsburg University community which tackled nearly 20 miles of roads in East Stroudsburg and Stroudsburg with about 100 volunteers. This year's event, in conjunction with several others, was a tremendous success.

Volunteers had a choice of which township or borough they would like to help clean-up. Gloves, bags, vests and free t-shirts were provided thanks to Keep PA Beautiful and PennDOT. Waste Management and County Waste supplied roll-off containers and the Monroe County Municipal Waste Manage Authority helped shuttle students to and from cleanup sites.

Since Pick Up the Poconos started last year, crews hired to clean the interstates, state roads and other areas combined with this annual event have filled nearly 7,000 bags and counting with unsightly litter across hundreds of miles of roads.
