Stroudsburg:

Stroudsburg is a bustling and eclectic downtown district nestled in the Pocono Mountains with shoppes and art galleries, restaurants, cafés, live music and entertainment and world class events. Many stores are offering discounts & demonstrations. Downtown wineries and restaurants offer a percentage off if you show a receipt from a store in town. It is also the debut weekend for the Stroudsburg November 29 – March 1.

Hawley:

Many businesses will be offering complimentary refreshments, holiday specials and lots of joyful fun. The festivities will continue right through Hawley Winterfest December 13-15. For your old-fashioned Christmas, check out Penny Lane Candies & Candles with more than 500 varieties of candy and more in a setting right out of It's A Wonderful Life. There are also many places to warm up with a meal or a beverage including The Settlers Inn across from Bingham Park.

Jim Thorpe:

Christmas shopping in the historic district of Jim Thorpe is truly a magical experience. Stroll through more than 50 boutiques, galleries and tasting rooms to find that perfect gift for everyone on your list. There's also plenty of unique clothing and accessory shops to find your perfect holiday ensemble. Downtown is decked in Victorian style for the annual Jim Thorpe Olde Time Christmas celebration, with special events held over three magical weekends in December. Festivities begin with the tree lighting ceremony in Josiah White Park on December 6. The festival continues December 7-8, 14-15 and 21-22, which has strolling carolers and musicians, holiday shopping and plenty of free family activities. The Jim Thorpe Visitors Center is also a great resource for information about all there is to see and do while in town.

Honesdale:

Small Business Saturday coincides with this historic town's hallmark event, Winter Wonderland November 29-30. Following a parade Friday night, everyone gathers in Central Park to sing songs of the season including "Winter Wonderland" which was penned by Honesdale native Dick Smith. There will be a tree lighting and more as shoppers can stop in Maude Alley and other quaint shops up and down Main Street as well as breweries, restaurants and coffee shops. Not to mention you can ride on the Santa Express on the Stourbridge Line excursion railroad up until Christmas.

Milford:

Beautiful downtown Milford features white lights that line the streets dotted with shops and eateries where shoppers can enjoy an experience rich with history and unique small businesses. 403 Broad features a Pop-Up Christmas bar this year serving up cocktails and a festive décor until the end of December. Milford's Annual Tree Lighting on the grounds of the Milford Community House will be held December 7 complete with free hot cocoa and cookies, live nativity, children's chorus singing holiday favorites, extended shopping hours and more.
