

SOUTH COUNTY South County Tourism Council Statement on Coronavirus

March 12, 2020, Charlestown, RI: South County Tourism Council (SCTC) – like many organizations across the country - is closely monitoring statements from the Rhode Island Department of Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, US Travel, and the World Health Organization regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

While so far South County, Rhode Island has not had any confirmed or suspected cases of Coronavirus and the risk in our region remains low, we encourage our area tourism partners, residents, and visitors to take appropriate preventative measures. The federal government has not recommended limiting domestic travel. South County Tourism Council welcomes visitors from near and far to experience our peaceful, naturally beautiful destination.

"The health and well-being of our visitors and residents remains a top priority," says Louise Bishop, President of SCTC, "and the council is monitoring the coronavirus situation. At the same time, we remain optimistic and are encouraged by the business we're still seeing."

Bishop has reached out to the council's hotel partners who are following comprehensive COVID-19 compliance per state and federal guidelines, including hand sanitizer stations and frequent cleaning of high-touch areas. Hotels have also put procedures in place in case there is a suspected or confirmed case among guests or colleagues.
