## PEORIA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES A NEW WORLD



PEORIA, IL – The Peoria Symphony Orchestra closes their 123<sup>rd</sup> Season on **Friday, April 30**, **2021** with *A New World*, airing on **WTVP World 47.3** at **7:30 PM**. *A New World* features a "no-strings-attached" look at the PSO's wind and brass sections, with some of the most beautiful music ever written. This final concert of our 123rd Season will fill you with an exhilarating sense of hope, well-being, and the promise of better things to come.

Reflecting on the upcoming performance, which features music written by Mozart, Gabrieli, and Dvorak, **Maestro Stelluto** remarked: "I am so thrilled for everyone to hear this program. It's a rarity. The PSO winds and brass playing some of the best music ever written—music they don't always get an opportunity to perform, yet music they absolutely love. You will hear this in their performance. It inspired me to find more ways to feature them in the future!"

The concert will air twice. You can first listen on Friday, April 23, 2021 at 8:00 PM on 89.9 WCBU Peoria Public Radio and 89.1 WGLT Bloomington-Normal's Public Media. The concert will be available to stream on their respective websites at the time of airing. Viewers can also tune in to the WTVP World 47.3 channel on Friday, April 30, 2021 at 7:30 PM to watch the concert. Listings can be found on the PSO website.

Preceding the concert, Maestro Stelluto will once again be releasing several #PSOAtHome videos to help viewers and subscribers dive deeper into the music. Tune into the Peoria Symphony Orchestra's Facebook page and join Maestro Stelluto for Upbeat, a pre-concert discussion, at 7:00 PM on Friday, April 30.
